- An array of electives is offered to Parkway Panthers, from broadcasting, debate and Louisiana Folk Life to drama, theatre and art.
- The Parkway LA-071st is the second largest Air Force JROTC in Louisiana with more than 435 cadets enrolled in the program.
- Two Cyber Patriot teams are sponsored by the LA-071st which have captured the number one spot in the state for three years and finished in the top one-percent of more than 5,500 eligible schools from three continents in global cyber defense competitions.
- Equally impressive to the honors the LA-071st regularly receives is the unit's commitment to making a difference through community service.
- In 2013-14, cadets took an active role volunteering over 3,400 hours and supporting the 8th Air Force Museum, Barksdale Air Force Base, Lions Club, St. Jude Hospital, sponsoring blood drives, the school's clothes closet and mentoring in lower performing elementary schools.
- Honor and tradition is key at Parkway, where a most impressive Veterans Day Tattoo Ceremony is led each year by the JROTC
- Parkway places a special emphasis on Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) programs in both curricular and extracurricular activities.
- STEM partnerships include the national non-profit Project Lead the Way, Cyber Innovation Center, Louisiana Tech University, Southern Methodist University and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA).
- Students who complete a rigorous STEM course curriculum are recognized on their diplomas and at graduation ceremonies.
- The STEM course framework includes Introduction to Engineering Design, Principles of Engineering, Digital Electronics, The Infinity Project (SMU partnership), NASA Threads and Cyber Science (Louisiana Tech)
- Extracurricular STEM activities include NASA Hunch, which brings NASA engineers to Parkway with schematics that students build using 3D modeling software, then create on a three-dimensional printer; the Shell Eco Marathon, in which students design and construct a fuel-efficient car that competes in a race; and Cyber Discovery Camps, hosted by Louisiana Tech
- Parkway's Robotics team has been named Grand Champions of the Regional Autonomous Robotics Circuit (RARC) for three years

- First place Regional Champions of the Institute of Navigation's Mini-Urban Challenge for four years, earning the Robotics team invitations to the National Competition where they placed 2nd in the U.S.
- First place winner at 2013 Cyber Discovery Camp
