

# Community Plan For Bibbenluke

Produced by Bombala Council's Economic and Tourism Development Department as part of the Community Plan Project 2007/08. This project was supported by funding from the Australian Government and also the NSW Department of State and Regional Development.

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#### INTRODUCTION

This Community Plan reflects the desires and aspirations of the local Bibbenluke community. It links into Council's Integrated Community Strategic Plan which is the document that guides the future of the local area and represents a whole of community approach to the area's ongoing development.

In developing both the Community Plan and the Integrated Community Strategic Plan, due consideration has been given to the communities' aspirations, issues and suggestions within the constraints of Council's existing resources and budgets and resources have been allocated accordingly.

# THE COMMUNITY'S VISION

The local community aspires to a future that will continue:

- Developing a strong, diverse and sustainable local economy that supports a range of employment opportunities particularly within the agriculture, forestry and tourism sectors.
- Maintaining and improving local services and recreational spaces, with an emphasis on increased doctor numbers and provision of a dental service.
- Providing quality well maintained infrastructure such as roads, footpaths, community buildings and spaces.
- Maintaining and improving communication systems particularly mobile telephone coverage and emergency communications.
- Maintaining the high quality natural environment with an emphasis on control of weeds and pests on rural land.
- Sustaining current bio diversity of the area and ensuring self determination of land use.

# Snapshot of the Local Area

#### The Way It Was.....

The locality was part of the initial scramble for grazing properties. "Bibbenluke" was first taken up in 1833 by Joshua John Moore, a lieutenant in the 14<sup>th</sup> regiment during the battle of Waterloo. "Bibbenluke" was the head station from which he managed "Bendoc" and "Boggy Creek" and has strong links with the history and development of the south east region being owned at times by Ben Boyd (1848) and William Bradley (1865). The original licence held by Joshua John Moore covered land for 30 square miles.

Over time a settlement grew up around the property and by 1878 Bibbenluke as the locality was now known had a provisional school and by 1884 the locality included, a coach proprietor, two storekeepers, dealer, post mistress, school master, hotel keeper, 3 carpenters, stonemason and a blacksmith. Anglican church services were held for many years in a recreation hall that had been built on "Bibbenluke" station to provide better facilities for worshippers than the slab shearers hut which had been their first meeting place. In 1937 this hall, which had been used for services of all denominations, was finally given to the Church of England and moved from the station property to its present site.

Bibbenluke Shire Council saw to the needs of the locality and also supported smaller towns within the region. The largest contribution to the welfare of other communities was a loan of \$70,000 for the building of the Delegate Country Club. Eventually Bibbenluke Shire was amalgamated with the Municipality of Bombala in 1977 to form Bombala Shire. (compiled from "Bombala Hub of the Southern Monaro" Claire Schoffeld)

#### And Now....

Bibbenluke is home to a number of diverse small business operators, active retirees, farmers, and those with an active interest in the arts. The community is close knit and values its historic past.

The Bibbenluke Hall is the focal point for the community and it is used on a regular basis for social, cultural and educational activities and events.

The community is also supportive of the Bibbenluke Primary School, which was established in 1871 and presently has 13 children enrolled.

# Towards Achieving the Vision

Meeting the community's vision and addressing the issues will require input from all levels of Government – Federal, State and Local and the support and co-operation of the local community. The Council has structured its operations to assist in meeting the challenges outlined in the local vision and to address the issues that have been identified taking into account current resources.

Council's Integrated Community Strategic Plan has identified 7 goals required to achieve the community's vision. The Bibbenluke Community Plan uses the same 7 goal headings to achieve its vision and allow for ease of incorporation into the Council's Integrated Community Strategic Plan.

To allow the community to monitor progress on matters and issues raised at community consultations meetings, actions identified at meetings prior to the 2011 consultations have been reformatted in line with the new Integrated Community Strategic Plan.

#### Goal 1: Creating a local economy with a broad base

The community recognises the need to broaden the local economy with a focus on improving employment outcomes for the local area. The local area needs to position itself to take advantage of opportunities as they present. The community is keen to explore opportunities for the development of new industries and businesses within farming, timber and tourism sectors. It was also very keen to see value adding occur in the region.

#### Bibbenluke specific

The community is keen to see new businesses developed and prosper. They identify the location of the area as a plus for economic development. Suggestions for new business ventures have included exploration of opportunities to service the lucrative wedding market that would have flow on effects to a number of established businesses and see new businesses, eg, car hire, wedding day accessories established. The community is also keen to support ongoing development of new agribusinesses, such as the Sated Pheasant. Another suggestion was for the establishment of a training base for agricultural studies – this will be achieved by the opening of the Trade Training Centre which will occur early June 2011.

Parts of the community are eagerly awaiting the mill development.

### Goal 2: Fostering local and regional tourism

Council's approach to tourism development is strongly supported by the local community. The community recognises the value of tourism to the local economy and the need to support further development. The ability of the local area to link with the East Gippsland, South Coast and Alpine regions provide opportunities for a cooperative approach within this industry. Projects associated with the National Landscapes Program, Indigenous Tourism (including the Bundian Way), motor cycle tourism and cultural tourism in particular offer the area numerous opportunities and are to be encouraged and supported.

#### Bibbenluke specific

The Bibbenluke community is proud of its facilities, particularly the hall and is aware of the need to undertake village beautification projects, such as the recent planting of an avenue of crab apple trees.

Some community members are of the opinion that additional promotion to the garden tourism and historic homes would bring benefits to the area. A number of residents felt that the streetscape of Bombala's retail precinct is in need of additional upgrading which it is felt would assist with attracting additional tourists to the area. Some resident also thought that the Bombala Literary Institute should be purchased, restored and refurbished to accommodate an arts/crafts/woodworking outlet.

Some community members questioned the wisdom of developing both eco tourism and motor cycle tourism. However, the majority were supportive of Council's direction and recognised the need for the external income generated by tourists which then goes to assist with the ongoing development of the local area.

# Goal 3: Retaining a sustainable, clean and productive environment

Sustainable land use is extremely important to the local community. Control of weeds and feral animals, particularly within the plantation sector, was raised as a major issue at most community meetings. Concern was also raised at the loss of productive farming land to the plantation sector. The community is keen to develop sustainable value adding enterprises within both the farming and timber sectors and to retain the relative weed free environment of the local area. The community supports the efforts of the Weed Control Officer and requested that additional roadside vegetation control be carried out where possible and thought be given to offering an additional part time position within the weed control area.

#### Bibbenluke Specific

Community recognise the difficulty in controlling weeds such as Fire Weed and Serrated Tussock, however they are keen to see that the Council keeps up its control practices and the weeds do not become as bad as it is in the surrounding Council areas.

Community generally happy with the current policy and procedures.

# Goal 4: Provision of services, facilities and places to meet the needs of the community

The community is keen to see recreational spaces maintained to the current high standard. In addition, they would like to see additional resources allocated to the maintenance of community infrastructure such as halls, sporting grounds and caravan parks and additional funding for play equipment. While the community is generally pleased with the delivery of health and community services, the community recognises an urgent need for additional doctors and also the need for a dentist. The community would like to see the continuation of the library service which is well supported and appreciated.

The community is keen to see an improvement in public transport, the provision of a taxi service and expanded community transport.

#### Bibbenluke specific

The shortage of doctors and 24 hour emergency cover at the Hospital is of concern to residents. As is the lack of a local dentist. Overall the community are happy with the transport options and Library Service but they would like additional outreach courses offered at the TAFE facility

Community would like to see the current standard of Parks and Garden maintenance continued and would like to see additional play equipment provided in Bibbenluke. Community would like to see additional beautification of Bombala township entrances. The upgrade to the Hall kitchen is a priority for the community.
