# A Letter From The Camp Director

The spirit of fun and energy was unstoppable, and so were the over 750 incredible campers we served.

During our summer adventure, the most snapshots of our journey are those where campers united to celebrate the friendship support, and never-ending fun of their Painted Turtle



experience. During our Hemophilia session we awarded 16 campers with "big sticks" after they had the courage to self-infuse for the first time, a step that allows them to care for their own medical needs, independent from parents nurses and doctors. As the entire camp cheered these campers on, their bravery in accepting new challenges and their willingness to support one another were at the heart of our

Many campers discovered the adventure of camp for the first time. At our closing campfire during our Special Diagnoses session, one new camper proudly took the microphone and expressed that "we are one world at camp", a community where everyone is accepted and free to have fun. Our campers during our Rheumatic session also highlighted this acceptance, when the oldest boys' cabin rallied around a cabinmate who was nervous to perform at Stage Night. His cabin supported him every step of the way: to encourage him to perform, to take the spotlight and finally, to sing his song as they linked arms and cheered him on in the background.

Our campers, staff, and volunteers, created a place where it was safe to step outside of one's comfort zone and experience the possibilities of adventure. Staff and volunteers traveled from across the country and all over the world to join our team, including fourteen international team members from Ireland, Canada, England, Australia, and Germany.

Although this summer's journey has ended. it will live on in the heart of our adventurers. With the approach of our fall family weekend season. The Painted Turtle looks forward to new adventures ahead!

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

### Dr. Jimmy Beck

Not every doctor who volunteers at The Painted Turtle knows camp the way Dr. Jimmy Beck knows it—that is, from the ground up. Long before Jimmy earned his medical degree, and long before the camp's doors even opened, Jimmy began volunteering at The Painted Turtle in every imaginable way: planting trees, assembling furniture, licking envelopes, vou name it he did it.



immy's sister, Tina, was the first volunteer coordinator at The Painted Turtle, and she

wasted no time in corralling her brother into helping out at camp. Of course she knew it wouldn't be a hard sell. Prior to The Painted Turtle's opening, Jimmy had spent two summers working Florida as a counselor at one of The Painted Turtle's sister

camps, Camp Boggy Creek, where he became expert at meeting the needs of children with acute medical conditions in a camp setting, as well as fairly accomplished at the fine art of "no-hands" spaghetti eating!

When choosing his residency in 2004, Jimmy made a conscious decision to remain in Southern California so that he could continue to volunteer at The Painted Turtle. Not only did he volunteer at the camp's very first family weekend but during our first summer he arranged his on-call schedule so that he could volunteer for an entire week as a cabin counselor.

In the ensuing years "Counselor Jimmy" became "Dr. Jimmy," and every year he has volunteered during both Summer Sessions and Family Weekends in the Well Shell, even more deeply understanding all that it takes to enable these children to participate in the camp experience.



Without the medical professionals who come to camp on their own vacation time each year, the campers could not be there. But doctor or counselor Jimmy has never cared about titles, he's always been just as willing to sweep the floor or set up the

Even when a new opportunity took him to Washington, D.C., this past summer, Jimmy returned for two week-long stints as a volunteer doc during our Kidney and Skeletal Dysplasia Sessions.

When asked "What does camp do for kids?" Jimmy has the unique perspective of both a medical doctor, who has observed the healing power of camp and the way it alters children's perception of their illnesses, and that of a cabin counselor, who has cared for the campers round-the-clock and seen on a day-to-day measure how camp influences children's

understanding of who they are and who they want to become. "I just come to camp, no matter what role I am in," Jimmy says. "Providing medical care at The Painted Turtle has definitely helped me become a better doctor. In the hospital you focus on the disease and getting patients better. But at camp it's not just about the disease. Caring for the whole person is not just about the medicine. Providing the intangibles to the campers is so important for the health of these kids, you cannot measure it."



Gregg Miller is one of the many volunteers who gives of his time to make camp possible for hundreds of campers and their families. He



has been a tremendous asset to The Painted Turtle since 2007 when he first volunteered his skills as a Spanish/English interpreter. He has ensured that the magic of camp is experienced by English and Spanishspeaking families alike. By volunteering for more than 14 family weekends and several Hospital Outreach Events, and by translating documents and other correspondence as the families prepare to come to camp, he allows them to be fully immersed in the community that The Painted Turtle creates.

Gregg brings a tremendous amount of talent and 30 years experience as an interpreter to The Painted Turtle. During Family Weekends, he is instrumental in making sure that Spanish-speaking families are comfortable and welcome by assisting them one-on-one and also by interpreting group activities, such as the opening campfire, the parent's discussion, announcements and the closing ceremony. For each family weekend he attends, Gregg donates wireless interpreting equipment, that allows the participants to be anywhere in the room while he simultaneously transmits his Spanish interpretation to them.

"Interpreting and translating for The Painted Turtle poses a fun challenge," Gregg says, "since so much at camp is based on word play in English, lots of jokes involving puns... It's a great feeling when you can come up with something that has the same flavor in Spanish, the favorite part, of course, is seeing how much it all means to the kids and their families."


