Property Description

Spinola Entrenchment was begun sometime after 1761. The Entrenchment was built to the conventions of the bastioned trace and consisted of three demi-bastions linked together by long stretches of curtain wall. The entrenchment presented an unbroken trace of walls spanning from St Julians Bay all the way to St Georges Bay. The work was fronted by a rock hewn ditch. and contained various platforms and embrasures for cannon. The walls of the entrenchment reached their greatest height were they descended down into the valley. The ramparts are faced with embossed, rusticated hardstone blocks.


