Outline Description	Coastal redoubt			
Property Description	St George Redoubt is one of the coastal works of fortification erected by the Knights in 1715/16. This structure consists of a small semi-circular platform, ringed by a parapet and built in such a way that its gorge was occupied by a small chapel and sealed off by two screening walls, one of which contained the entrance into the redoubt. Small musketry loopholes pierce the screening walls. The doorway appears to have been served by a drop ditch and a drawbridge. Sometime after 1714, two fougasses were excavated just to the rear of the redoubt. Today these are located inside the houses just across the street.
