The structure originally consisted of a gun platform, fitted with a centrally-mounted rectangular blockhouse and a fleche protecting the rear landward approaches, enclosed within a shallow rock hewn ditch. Various significant elements of the battery, its revetment, and ditch survive, albeit in ruins and covered in vegetation and shrubs.
