'Music among the tombstones: Penguin's twilight celebration of the dead' welcomed the return of the town's ancestors and others in a community celebration held at 7pm on Wednesday 7 January in the [Penguin General Cemetery](#). And it is reasonable to surmise that the style of our celebration of the dead was unique in Tasmania and possibly even across Australia. It certainly garnered a lot of media coverage. 150-200 people joined us in honouring the spirits of bygone times. Commemorating the centenary of the unknown grave, we celebrated the lives of all unknown burials.

This heritage cemetery (1869-1977) with its 1800+ burials boasts the town's most amazing location, with its voices in the wind and stunning moonrise views over Bass Strait. The repository of Penguin's history, the cemetery is arguably among the most researched, published and promoted across Australia, with a galore of information readily available on the internet.

For one-hour we opened this heritage gem to the living and the dead alike. The live non-stop musical event, with highland pipers, flautist, violinist, choir and two vocalists, ended with the magnificent

and moving butterfly release in the small garden dedicated to the 80+ unnamed babies and children, where we saluted the dead and rejoiced in life.
