

### 2014-2015 SCHOOL PROFILE

#### SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY:

J.R. Tucker is one of nine high schools in Henrico County. It has over 150 faculty and staff members (135 of whom are teachers) who serve approximately 1600 students. Students have the opportunity to explore a wide range of academic and elective courses, including access to two technical centers. It houses the Center for World Languages, the International Baccalaureate Programme (IB) and the Advance College Academy (ACA).

#### ACADEMIC CHARACTERISTICS:

The school year is divided into two semesters. A semester is 18 weeks with two nine-week reporting periods. Seven classes meet on a modified block schedule. The curriculum provides a variety of course offerings including:

- Advanced Placement: English 11 (Language and Composition); English 12 (Literature), European History, Va. & U.S. History, Va. & U.S. Government, Psychology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Physics I, French, Spanish, Spanish Literature.
- Honors: English 9, 10; Shakespeare Studies 1 & 2, World History &
  Geography I, World History and Geography II, PSC Geometry, Algebra II, Math
  Analysis/Trigonometry, Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, Spanish IV, French
  IV; Art IV, Art V, Advanced Choir, Advanced Band and Advanced Orchestra.
- IB Honors: IBMYP English 9, 10; IBMYP World History; IBMYP U.S. & Va. Government; IBMYP Biology; IB-HL Biology; IBMYP Chemistry; IBMYP Geometry; IBMYP Algebra II; IBMYP Extended Math; IBMYP Theatre Arts; IBMYP Visual Art; IB Theory of Knowledge; IB Theatre Arts SL; IB-HL English 11, 12; IBMYP Spanish IV; IB-SL or HL Spanish V, VI; IB-SL or HL French V, VI; IBMYP French IV IB-HL History of the Americas; IB-HL World Topics; IB-SL/HL Chemistry; IB-HL Visual Arts I, II; IB-SL Mathematical Studies; IB-SL Mathematics; IB-SL Psychology.
- Advance College Academy: These courses earn college credit through Reynolds Community College and high school credit. 2 semesters earns 1 high school credit. 3 college credits/semester: ENG 111, ENG 112, ENG 242, ENG 243, HIS 121, HIS 122, MTH 163, MTH 240, MTH 270, PSY 200, PSY 230, PLS 211, PLS 212. 4 college credits/semester: BIO 101, BIO 102, FRE 101, FRE 102 FRE 201, FRE 202, SPA 101, SPA 102, SPA 201, SPA 202.
- **Dual-Credit:** opportunities available at ECPI, and VCU (through the High Tech Academy at Highland Springs Tech Center.)
- Twenty-eight block programs at the Technical Centers.
- Work Study Programs: Co-operative Office Ed. and Marketing Education.
- Special Education: LD, MH, EH, OHI
- English as a Second Language (ESL)

#### **CLASS RANKING:**

Class rank and GPA (Grade Point Average) are determined by the levels of courses taken and the grades earned in those courses. Grades earned in courses completed in middle school that were awarded a high school credit will not be computed as part of the high school cumulative grade-point average. High school courses completed during the summer prior to entering ninth grade will be included in the grade-point average and calculated in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade year. The initial class ranking is computed at the end of grade 11 by averaging the final averages of grades 9, 10, and 11. The final ranking is computed mid-year of the 12<sup>th</sup> grade and is based on final averages of grades 9, 10, 11 and the first semester averages of grade 12.

Students who are earning either a Standard or an Advanced Studies Diploma are included in class rank. Students earning a Modified Standard Diploma or Special Diploma are excluded from class rank.

Students earning weighted credit will have 0.17 added to their final GPA for each Honors/AP course taken and passed. See the following formula:
