They will participate in a 10-week summer Co-Op performing various tasks in the entrepreneurial environment of a young company. The REIP interns will gain firsthand experience in working with management challenges typically faced by start-ups. In turn, participating companies gain the help of top-notch students, by providing supplemental salary for the period of the internship, on projects that otherwise may not have been undertaken.

Entrepreneur of the Year



The 2010 Entrepreneur of the Year (EOY), Jacqueline Novogratz, Founder and CEO of Acumen Fund shared her take on the campus motto "Why Not Change The World" TM when she addressed the crowd at the EOY Celebration on December 1. In anticipation of her arrival, several students, faculty, staff members, as well as alumni and friends of Rensselaer joined together in an informal book club setting to discuss Ms. Novogratz's bestselling book, *The Blue Sweater*. The 2-day celebration was deemed a success with several new campus collabrotations emerging from the planning efforts involved in hosting Ms. Novogratz.

Business Plan Competitions

<u>Business plan competitions</u> play a role in any student entrepreneur's journey. This year, the Center helped prepare teams to compete in competitions such as the <u>Loyola University Business Plan Competition</u>, the McGinnis Venture

Competition at Carnegie Melon and the <u>NYS Business Plan</u> <u>Competition</u>. Industry Industry, Venture Capitalist and mentor connections were made and Rensselaer teams won prizes totaling \$21,500 to further advance their innovations.

A Year for Innovation

This year has been one of great advancement in the development and strengthening of the Innovation culture and infrastructure at RPI. Laban Coblentz, Chief of Staff to President Jackson and Associate VP for Policy and Planning initiated RPI's first Innovation Council. Professor Gina
O'Connor represents the Lally School's Severino Center for Technological Entrepreneurship on that council. In addition



to the Severino Center, the Council is comprised of leaders of RPI's Incubation program, <u>Technology Park</u>, <u>Office of Technology Commercialization</u>, <u>Office of Research</u>, <u>Government and Community Relations</u> and <u>Vice Provost for Entrepreneurship</u>.

Together this group represents much of Rensselaer's Emerging Ventures Ecosystem (EVE), a new initiative designed to ensure that all of the elements of RPI's innovation system are linked and work collaboratively. The Innovation Council meets biweekly to discuss new businesses that are emerging from the faculty and students, new incubator companies, and larger initiatives associated with regional and global economic development. The Council and the EVE program have already succeeded in engineering several new processes to help ease the process of technology commercialization and new venture creation for students, faculty and alumni.
