



It gives learners all the information they'll need to plan for their future: from which Aid Scheme (NSFAS) subjects to choose in Grade 9, career choice, scarce and critical skills needed by the country and, post school options: Including learning programmes offered at Further Education and Training (FET) Colleges, universities of technology and universities

One of the areas the Khetha campaign focuses on is learnerships. A learnership programme is where learners spend some time learning theory and some time learning practical wilks in a workplace. Learnership are managed by the Sector Education and Training Authorities (STA1). STA2 are binding they denime (SETAs). SETAs are bodies that ensure that the skills needed for every sector of the South African economy are identified, and the training is available to

provide these skills.

An unemployed person could get on a learnership which will assist them in getting both the theory and practical work experience. They will receive a monthly allowance which will help them in their basic expenses (transport, tood tet.).
