# Significant Activity: Oct 10 - 14



#### **Significant Events:**

- Severe Weather Lower/Central Mississippi valleys to Tennessee & Ohio valleys
- Hurricane Gonzalo
- Earthquake Offshore El Salvador

#### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic Disturbance 1 (10%); Hurricane Gonzalo
- Eastern Pacific No systems threatening U.S. territories
- Central Pacific Tropical Storm Ana
- Western Pacific No systems threatening U.S. territories


#### Significant Weather:


- Slight risk for severe thunderstorms Eastern Gulf Coast & Carolinas into the Southern Appalachians
- Rain & thunderstorms Central Great Lakes & Middle Mississippi Valley to Mid-Atlantic & Southeast
- Flash Flooding possible Central Gulf Coast & Tennessee Valley to Southern Appalachians
- Rain Pacific Northwest & Northern Rockies, Northern Great Lakes to Middle Mississippi Valley
- Critical/Elevated Fire Weather NV, CA, OR & ID; Red Flag Warnings NV & CA

### Hurricane Gonzalo – Atlantic







#### Hurricane Gonzalo (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 105 miles north of St. Thomas
- Moving NW near 13 mph, expected through early Wednesday
- A turn NNW forecast by late Wednesday
- Gonzalo will move over the open Atlantic today
- Maximum sustained winds near 110 mph, with higher gusts
- Strengthening forecast over the next 48 hours
- Gonzalo expected to become a Major Hurricane today
- Hurricane-force winds extend outward 25 miles
- Tropical storm-force winds extend outward 105 miles
- Tropical Storm Warnings discontinued for USVI & Puerto Rico
- Flash Flood Warnings continue for USVI & Puerto Rico

### Hurricane Gonzalo – Response







#### **USVI/PR**

- EOCs in U.S. Virgin Islands (VITEMA) & Puerto Rico (PREMA) are fully activated
- Puerto Rico one shelter/20 occupants
- USVI one shelter/0 occupants
- Cyril E. King Airport (STT) on St Thomas closed overnight;
   all airports, seaports & schools open today

#### FEMA Region II


- RRCC is activated to Level III (with ESFs 1, 3, 6, 8, & 12)
- Regional LNOs deployed to EOCs in PR & St. Thomas, USVI
- IMAT-1 deployed to VITEMA
- IMAT CAD deployed to PREMA

#### **FEMA HQ**

- FEMA NRCC is not activated
- FEMA NWC is at Enhanced Watch (24/7)
- ISB Bravo team prepared to establish ops at DC Puerto Rico, if needed

### 2 Day Tropical Outlook - Atlantic






#### Disturbance 1 (91L) (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 1,200 miles east of the Lesser Antilles
- Producing large area of disorganized showers & thunderstorms
- Became a little more organized during past few hours
- Further development expected to be slow
- Moving slowly northwest; turning northward next several days
- Formation chance
  - Through 48 hours Low (10%)
  - Through 5 days Low (20%)

### 2 Day Tropical Outlook - Eastern







#### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located couple hundred miles south of the coast of Guatemala and SE Mexico
- Conditions conducive for gradual development
- Moving slowly WNW or northwest
- Formation chance
  - Through 48 hours Low (10%)
  - Through 5 days Medium (50%)

### 2-Day Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific







#### Tropical Storm ANA (as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located about 925 miles ESE of Hilo, Hawaii
- Moving NW at 7 mph
- This motion is expected to continue through Wednesday
- Maximum sustained winds are near 45 mph
- Gradual strengthening forecast through Wednesday evening
- Tropical storm force winds extend outward up to 25 miles
- No coastal watches or warnings in effect

### Severe Weather – Central US (Final)



#### October 12-13

 Severe storms brought strong wind, hail & at least 13 possible tornadoes to Southern Plains & Mississippi Valley

#### **Impacts**


- · Isolated property damage; no widespread, major damage reported
- One confirmed, storm-related fatality in AL; one unconfirmed fatality in AR
- 66k customers without power across FEMA Regions IV-VI (DOE EAGLE-I, 7:30 am EDT)
  - o Region IV: 35k (previous peak approx. 23k); GA: 28k)
  - o Region V: 3k (down from peak of approx. 19k)
  - o Region VI: 28k (down from peak of approx. 146k; LA 24k)

#### **State Response**

- TN & LA EOCs activated (Monitoring)
- All other State EOCs remain at Normal Operations (MS & KY monitoring)
- Governor of LA declared a State of Emergency
- Two shelters open with 18 occupants (AL: 1/9) (LA: 1/9) (ARC, 6:42 am EDT)

#### **FEMA Response**

- FEMA Region IV RWC returned to normal operations (24/7) this morning
- All other affected Regions remain at Watch/Steady State
- No requests for FEMA assistance



### Earthquake Activity – International





#### M7.3 (downgraded from M7.4) - Offshore, El Salvador

- Occurred at 11:51 pm EDT on October 13, 2014
  - 42 miles WSW Jiquililo, Nicaragua
  - Depth of 25 miles
- USGS issued Yellow PAGER alert indicating:
  - For shaking-related fatalities and economic losses
  - Approximately 47k exposed to Very Strong Shaking (MMI Level VII)
- Open sources report one unconfirmed fatality, no major damage
- No Pacific-wide tsunami was generated





# Precipitation Forecast - 3 Day








# Convective Outlook, Days 1 - 3






# Fire Weather Outlook, Days 1 - 8


#### **PA Highlights**




