## KIDS WITH CANCER

Kids with Cancer provides much needed assistance for the youngest of children who are going through cancer treatment. This assistance at the basic level comes to the child's family when they can no longer pay the family's day-to-day household bills. Through social workers in all Australian children's hospitals we are put in contact with such families on a daily basis. Children's hospitals are often only in the capital cities however many families live in country areas. These families can be torn apart when their child needs to attend treatment and a parent needs to be constantly at their side. BEETLE STRIPED POMPOM SCARF MEASUREMENTS

| Size | Child | Adult |
| :--- | :---: | :---: |
| Finished Size cm | $14 \times 160$ | $20 \times 214$ |

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

'Moda Vera' BEETLE 50g balls as per size

- 1st Colour (C1): 1, 2
- 2nd Colour (C2): 1, 2
- 3rd Colour (C2): 1, 2
- 4th Colour (C2): 1, 2
- 5th Colour (C2): 1, 2
- 6th Colour (C2): 1, 1
- 1 pair 5.00 mm knitting needles
- Birch Pompom Maker
- Scissors, yarn needle, tape measure


## ABBREVIATIONS

Beg = begin/ning, foll = follows/ing; st/s =stitch/es.

## SCARF

Cast on 50 (70) sts and work in stocking st foll stripe sequence. Stripe Sequence C1-10 rows, C2-16 rows, C3-4 rows, C4-10 rows, C5-6 rows, C1 4 rows, C3-16 rows, C2-6 rows, C5-10 rows, C4-4 rows, Repeat stripe sequence until work measures 150 (204)cm from beg, ending with a purl row. Cut off yarn and thread tail through sts, pull tight and secure.


## BAMBINI BABIES HAT MEASUREMENTS

| Small | Newborn |
| :--- | :---: |
| Medium | $1-2$ months |
| Large | $3-4$ months |

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

## $1 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ ball 'Bella Baby' Bambini Print

- 4 mm hook for small hat
- 4.5 mm for med, 5 mm for large
- Scissors, yarn needle, stitch marker



## Beetle Striped POMPOM SCARF

FINISHING
With right sides facing, fold scarf in half lengthways, and pin matching stripes. Sew using a backstitch, or machine. Turn right side out. Thread yarn along cast on edge and tighten to match cast off edge.
Following directions on pack use Pompom maker and C6 to make 2 large sized pompoms. Attach securely to ends of the scarf. Weave in all loose ends.

## ABBREVIATIONS

$\mathbf{S p}=$ space, $\mathbf{s t}=$ stitch, $\mathbf{s k}=$ skip, $\mathbf{y o h}=$ yarn over hook, cont $=$ continue, $\mathbf{t o g}=$ together, slst $=$ slip stitch, $\mathbf{c h}=$ chain, $\mathbf{d c}=$ double crochet, $\mathbf{t r}=$ treble, $\mathbf{h t r}=$ half treble, shell $=(\mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{tr})$.

Note - This hat is worked in a continuous spiral from crown to brim. It is advisable to use a stitch marker to keep track of the start of each round.

HAT
1st round - Work 6dc into a magic circle.
2nd round - 2 dc in each st to end of round,
place a stitch marker after the last dc.
3rd round - (2dc in next st, 1dc in next) 6 times (18dc).
4 th round - (2dc in next st, 1dc in next 2 sts) 6 times (24dc) Cont working in pattern established, increasing the number of sts in each round by 6 sts until there are 84 sts.

15th - 29th round - 1dc in each st to end of round.

## BRIM

30th round - (2hr in next st, 1htr in next st) repeat to end of round.
31st -32 nd round $-1 h t r$ in each st around.
$33 r d$ round - (1dc in next st, sk 2 sts, shell in next st, sk 2 sts) repeat to end of round sl st into 1st dc.

## Fasten off.

FINISHING
Weave in loose ends.

## PURE WOOL PONCHO MEASUREMENTS

Make to length as required (see pattern)

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

4 Seasons PURE WOOL 100 g ball 2 balls each
C1, C2, C3, C4

- 6.00 mm crochet hook - Scissors, yarn needle


## ABBREVIATIONS

$\mathbf{s p}=$ space, $\mathbf{s k}=$ skip, $\mathbf{s l} \mathbf{s t}=$ slipstitch, $\mathbf{c h}=$ chain, $\mathbf{d c}=$ double crochet, $\mathrm{tr}=$ treble ea $=$ each.

## PONCHO

1st round - Using C1 make 72 ch , join with st st to 1st ch to form a ring. 1ch, 1dc, 2ch, ldc in same st as st st, ldc in each of next $35 \mathrm{ch}, 1 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{ch}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch, st st to 1st dc.
2nd round - 3ch, 1 tr in 2-ch loop, 2ch, 1 tr in same loop, 1 tr in ea of next $2 \mathrm{dc},{ }^{*}$ (ch, sk 1 dc , tr in ea of next 3 tr ) 8 times, 1ch, sk 1 dc,1tr in ea of next 2tr, 1tr, 2ch, 1tr in next 2-ch loop, 1tr in ea of next 2 tr , ( 1 ch , sk 1 dc, 1 tr in ea next 3 tr ) 8 times, $1 \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{sk} 1 \mathrm{tr}$, 1 tr in next tr, st st into $3 r d$ ch of starting ch , st st into 2 -ch loop. 3rd round - Using C2, 3ch, 2tr, 2ch for corner, 3tr in same 2-ch corner, *(1ch, Str in 1-ch sp) 9 times, 1ch, (3tr, 2ch for corner, 3 tr) in 2-ch corner,(1ch, 3tr in 1-ch sp) 9 times, 1ch, st st to $3 r d$ ch of starting ch, st st across next 2 tr, st st into 2-ch loop. 4th round - 3ch, 2tr, 2ch for corner, 3tr in same 2-ch corner, (1ch, 3 tr in 1-ch sp) 10 times, 1ch, (3tr, 2ch for corner, 3tr) in 2-ch corner, (1ch, 3tr in 1-ch sp) 10 times, 1ch, st st to $3 r d$ ch of starting ch, st st across the next 2 tr , st st into 2 -ch loop. Repeat 4th round until length required, remembering to add a (1ch, Str in 1-ch space) for each side of each row until the poncho is the length required changing colours as desired. Cut 30 cm of lengths of yarn and using 3 strands of yarn together, add a fringe into every 1 -ch space along edge FINISHING
Using C5, dc along bottom edge, side, top edge and other side, working $3 d c$ into each corner, joining at the start with a st st. Ch and rep. Fasten off and work in any loose threads.

Finished Size
$104 \mathrm{~cm} \times 96 \mathrm{~cm}$
approx based on ‘Bella Baby’ BABY WONDER

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

$4 \times 100 \mathrm{~g}$ balls ‘Bella Baby' BABY WONDER*

- Scissors, yarn needle, tape measure
*Or $8 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ balls 'Bella Baby’ SUGAR
Or $10 \times 50 \mathrm{~g}$ balls "Moda Vera' MERINO

ABBREVIATIONS: beg = beginning; ch = chain; cnr = corner; dc = double crochet; foll = follows; htr = half treble crochet; Ip/s = loop/s; patt = pattern; Rnd = round; RS = right side; $\mathbf{s k}=$ skip; $\mathbf{s l}$ st = slip stitch; $\mathbf{s p}=$ space; sts = stitches; $\mathbf{t r}=$ treble crochet; $\mathbf{W S}=$ wrong side; yoh = yarn over hook.
SPECIAL ABBREVIATION: 3tr-cl $=3$ treble cluster (*yoh, insert hook under 3 rows of ch-sp, yoh, draw yarn under, yoh, draw yarn through 2 lps , (leaving 2 sts on hook); repeat from * 2 more times, yoh and draw through all lps on hook)

## TENSION

## $\mathbf{2 0}$ sts x 10 rows to 10 cm over treble crochet.

## SHAWL

Foundation Ch - Make 183 ch.
1st row - (RS): 1tr in 3rd ch from hook, 1 tr in each ch to end ... 180 tr (1st 3-ch count as 1st tr).
2nd row - (WS): 3ch, 1tr in each tr to end.
3rd row - Repeat Row 2, twice.
5th row - 3ch, *1tr in each of next 24 tr, 7ch, sk 2 tr, repeat from * to last 24 tr , 1 tr in each of next 24 tr .

6 th row -3 ch , 1 tr in each of next 22 tr, *9ch, sk next 4 tr (i.e. $2 \mathrm{tr}, 7 \mathrm{ch}, 2 \mathrm{tr}$ ), 1 tr in each of next 20 tr , repeat from * to last $2 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{tr}$ in each of next 2 tr .
7th row - 3ch, 1tr in each of next 20 tr, *13ch, sk next 4 tr (i.e. $2 \mathrm{tr}, 9 \mathrm{ch}, 2 \mathrm{tr}$ ), 1 tr in each of next 16 tr , repeat from * to last $4 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{tr}$ in each of next 4 tr.
8th row - 3ch, 1tr in each of next 20 tr, *2tr in 13-ch sp, 4ch, 3 tr-cl, around 7, 9 and 13-ch sp from last 3 rows, 4 ch , 2 tr in same 13 -ch sp, 1 tr in each of next 16 tr, repeat from * to last 4 tr, 1 tr in each of next 4 tr.
9th row - 3 ch, 1 tr in each of next 22 tr, *2tr in next 4 -ch sp, 2 ch, 2tr in next 4-ch sp, 1tr in each of next 20 tr, repeat from * to last 2 tr , 1tr each of in next 2 tr .
10th row - 3ch, *1tr in each of next 24 tr, 2 tr in next 2 -ch sp, repeat from * to last 24 tr , 1 tr in each of next 24 tr ( 6 flowers).
11th - 12th row - Repeat Row 2, 2 more times.
13th row - 3ch, 1tr in each of next 37 tr, *7ch, sk 2 tr, 1tr in each of next 24 tr , repeat from * to last 13 tr , 1 tr in each of next 13 tr .
14th row - 3ch, 1tr in each of next 35 tr, *9ch, sk next 4 tr (i.e. $2 \mathrm{tr}, 7 \mathrm{ch}, 2 \mathrm{tr}$ ), 1 tr in each of next 20 tr , repeat from * to last 15 tr , 1 tr in each of next 15 tr .
15th row -3 ch , 1 tr in each of next 33 tr, *13ch, sk next $4 \operatorname{tr}$ (i.e. 2 tr, $9 \mathrm{ch}, 2 \mathrm{tr}$ ), 1 tr in each of next 16 tr , repeat from * to last 17 tr , 1 tr in each of next 17 tr.

16th row - 3ch, 1 tr in each of next 33 tr, *2tr in next 13-ch sp, 4ch, 3tr-cl, around 7,9 and 13-ch sp from last 3 rows, 4ch, 2tr in same $13-\mathrm{ch} \mathrm{sp}, 1$ tr in each of next 16 tr, repeat from * to last 17 tr, 1tr in next 17 tr.
17th row - 3 ch, 1 tr in each of next 35 tr, *2tr in 4-ch sp, 2ch, 2 tr in next 4 -ch sp , 1tr in each of next 20 tr, repeat from * to last 15 tr, 1 tr in each of next 15 tr.
18th row - 3ch, 1 tr in each of next 37 tr, *2tr in next $2-\mathrm{ch} \mathrm{sp}, 1$ tr in each of next 24 tr , repeat from * to last 13 tr , 1 tr in each of next $13 \operatorname{tr}$ (5 flowers).
19th - 20th row - Repeat Row 2, 2 more times.
The last 16 rows form patt, repeat patt 4 more times.
Repeat Row 2 once more, DO NOT CUT YARN.

## BORDER

1st round - Work 1 rnd of htr along edges of shawl, beg with side as foll:
2ch (counts as 1st htr), work 170 htr evenly along the side (approx 2 htr in each tr), 2 htr in same st as last htr, 1 htr in each ch of foundation ch, working an extra 2 htr along (182 htr), 2 htr in same st as last htr, work 170 htr evenly along the side (approx $2 h t r$ in each tr), $2 h t r$ in same st as last htr, $1 h t r$ in each tr of Row 85, working an extra htr along (181 htr), 20htr in same st as 2 -ch at beg of round, sl st into 2 nd ch of 2 -ch at beg of round.
2nd round - 1ch, 2dc in same st as sl st of Rnd 1, 1dc in each of next 5 htr, (*2ch, sk 2 htr, 1 tr in next htr, 5ch, 1tr in same htr as last tr, 2ch, sk 2 htr, 1dc in each of next 7 htr, repeat from *to last 5 htr , 1dc in each of next $5 \mathrm{htr**}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in cnr htr, 1dc in each of next 5 htr), repeat from ( to ) 2 more times, then repeat from ( to ${ }^{* *}$ along last edge, 1dc in same st as 1 st 2 dc at beg of round, sl st into dc at beg of round.
$3 r d$ round $-5 c h$, (*sk $2 d c, 1 d c$ in next dc, $2 c h$, sk $2 d c$, 1 tr in next dc, 2ch, 1tr in next tr, 2ch, 1tr in 5-ch sp, 5ch, 1tr in same 5 -ch sp, 2ch, 1 tr in next tr, 2ch, 1tr in next dc, 2ch, repeat from * to last 5 sts of side, sk $2 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, $2 \mathrm{ch}^{* *}$, sk 2 dc , 1 tr in cnr dc, 5ch, 1 tr in same cnr dc as last tr, 2ch), repeat from ( to ) 2 more times, then repeat from ( to ${ }^{* *}$, 1 tr in same st as 5 -ch at start of round, 5 ch , sl st into $5-\mathrm{ch} \mathrm{sp}$.
4 th round -3 ch , [*sk 1 dc , (1tr in next tr, 2ch) 3 times, 1 tr in 5 -ch sp, 5 ch , 1 tr in same 5 -ch sp, ( 2 ch , 1 tr in next tr) 3 times, repeat from * to last dc of side, sk next dc, 2ch, 1tr in next tr, 2 ch , 1 tr in 5 -ch $\mathrm{sp}, 5 \mathrm{ch}$, 1 tr in same 5-ch sp, $2 \mathrm{ch}^{* *}$, 1 tr in next tr], repeat from [ to ] 2 more times, then repeat from [ to ${ }^{* *}$, sl st into top of 3 -ch at beg of round.

5th round - Work 1ch, 2dc in each 2-ch sp, (3dc, 3ch, 3dc) in each 5-ch sp around shawl, join with a sl st into 1st dc.

## FASTEN OFF.

FINISHING
Weave in ends and press border using cool iron under a cloth.

To fit head (approx)
$52-54 \mathrm{~cm}$

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

## $1 \times 100 \mathrm{~g}$ ball '"Moda Vera" Elennal

- One pair each 7.00 mm (UK 2) knitting needles or size required to give correct tension
- Cable needle
- Wool needle

ABBREVIATIONS: approx = approximate, $\mathbf{b e g}=$ begin/ ning, $\mathbf{c m}=$ centimetres, cont $=$ continue, $\mathbf{K}=$ knit, $\mathbf{P}=$ purl, patt $=$ pattern, psso= pass slipped st over, rem = remain/ ing, $\mathbf{r e p}=$ repeat/ing, sl = slip, st/s = stitch/es, stocking st $=1$ row $K, 1$ row $P, \mathbf{R S}=$ right side, $\boldsymbol{t o g}=$ together.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS: Cable = Slip next 4 sts onto cable needle and leave at back of work, K 2 , then P 2 , K2, from cable needle.

## TENSION

## 11 sts and 15 rows to 10 cm over stocking st, using 7.00 mm needles.

To work a $15 \mathrm{~cm} \times 15 \mathrm{~cm}$ tension square, using 7.00 mm needles, cast on 17 sts.

Work 22 rows stocking st. Cast off loosely.
Check your tension carefully. If there are less sts to 10 cm use smaller needles, if more sts use bigger needles.

HAT
BEG BRIM
Using 7.00 mm needles, cast on 50 sts.
1st row - K2, * P2, K2, rep from * to end.
2nd row - P2, * K2, P2, rep from * to end.
Last 2 rows form rib.
Work a further 4 rows rib ... 6 rows rib in all.

## BEG PATT

1st row - (RS): P4, * K2, P2, K2, P6, rep from * to last 10 sts, K2, P2, K2, P4.
2nd row - K4, * P2, K2, P2, K6, rep from * to last 10 sts, P2, K2, P2, K4.


BABY WONDER MARY JANE BOOTIES MEASUREMENTS
Size
to fit 3-6 months
Length
9 cm long approx

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

'Bella Baby’ Baby Wonder $1 \times 100 \mathrm{~g}$ ball plain (M) and $1 \times 100 \mathrm{gm}$ ball print (C)

- 1 pair 3.00 mm knitting needles
- 2 small buttons
- Scissors, yarn needle

ABBREVIATIONS: alt = alternate, approx = approximately \(\mathbf{b e g}=\) begin/ning, \(\mathbf{c m}=\) centimetres, \(\boldsymbol{c o n t}=\) continue, \(\mathbf{d e c}=\) decrease, foll = follows/ing, garter stitch = every row knit, inc \(=\) increase, \(\mathbf{K}=\) knit, \(\mathbf{s t} / \mathbf{s}=\) stitch/es, \(\mathbf{R S}=\) right side, \(\mathbf{r e m}=\) remaining, WS = wrong side.
```

3rd row - P4, * cable, P6, rep from * to last 10 sts, cable, P4. 4th row - As 2nd row.
Rep 1st and 2nd row once.
Last 6 rows form patt. Cont in patt until work measures approx 20 cm from beg, ending with a 4th row.

SHAPE CROWN
1st row - (RS): * P2, P2tog, (K2, P2tog) twice, rep from * to last 2 sts, P2 ... 38 sts.

2nd row - K1, * K2tog, P2tog, K1, P2tog, K2tog, rep from * to last st, K1 ... 22 sts.
3rd row - P2, * sl 1, K2tog, psso, P2, rep from * to end ... 14 sts.
4th row - K2tog, * P1, K2tog, rep from * to end ... 9 sts.
Break off yarn, leaving a long end. Thread yarn through rem sts, draw up tightly and fasten off securely.

FINISHING
DO NOT PRESS. Using mattress st, join side edges together to form centre back seam.

## TENSION

## 29 sts and 58 rows to 10 cm over garter stitch using 3.00 mm needles.

## BOOTIES

Cast on 21 sts using $M$ and 3.00 mm needles.Work in garter st (1st row is WS), inc one st at each end of every foll alt row until there are 37 sts. Cont in garter st, dec one st at each end of every foll alt row until 21 sts rem.
Next row - (WS): Cast on 8 sts for heel, knit across all sts to end... 29sts. Inc one st at beg of next row (toe edge), then at same edge in every foll alt row until there are 37 sts.
Next row - (WS): Cast off 20 sts, k to end... 17 sts. Knit 19 rows garter st for instep.
Next row - (WS): Cast on 20 sts, $k$ across all sts to end... 37 sts. Dec one st at beg (toe edge) of next row, then at same edge in every foll alt row until 29 sts rem. Cast off.

STRAP
Using a flat seam, join the 2 straight edges of heel tog, then join edges tog around sole, easing to fit around toe. With RS facing and using 3.00 mm needles and $C$, knit up 6 sts along right top edge of heel to centre seam, then knit up 6 sts from centre seam along left top edge of heel... 12 sts.
Next row - (WS): Cast on 14 sts, knit across all sts to end... 26 sts Next row - (RS): Cast on 14 sts, knit across all sts to end... 40 sts. K 2 rows garter st.
Next row - K2, cast off 2 sts, $k$ to end.
Next row - Knit to last 2 sts, turn, cast on 2 sts, turn, K2...buttonhole. K 2 rows garter st. Cast off knitways. Make another bootie in the same way, noting to work the buttonhole on opposite end of the strap.

FINISHING
DO NOT PRESS. Sew a button on each Bootie to match with buttonhole, weave in loose ends.

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

## $\mathbf{9 \times 5 0 g}$ balls 'Moda Vera' Gelato in assorted colours

- 4.00 mm crochet hook
- Narrow headbands
- Irish linen and embroidery hoop for floral picture
- Scissors, yarn needle, tape measure

> ABBREVIATIONS: bp = back post; $\mathbf{c h}=$ chain; $\mathbf{d c}=$ double crochet; $\mathbf{d t r}=$ double treble; $\mathbf{h d t r}=$ half double treble; $\mathbf{h t r}=$ half treble; $\mathbf{I p} / \mathbf{s}=$ loop/s; $\mathbf{s k}=$ skip; $\mathbf{s l} \mathbf{s t}=$ slip stitch; $\mathbf{s p}=$ space; $\mathbf{s t}$-ch = starting chain; $\mathbf{s t} / \mathbf{s}=$ stitch/es; $\mathbf{t r}=$ treble; yoh = yarn over hook
> SPECIAL ABBREVIATION: picot = 3ch, sl st into same dc to form a lp.

## FLOWER 1

Using white yarn make 4ch, join with sl st into 1st ch to form a ring.

1st round - 1ch, 10 dc in ring, sl st into 1st dc.
2nd round - 1dc in next st, (2ch, sk 1 st, 1dc in next st) 4 times, 2 ch , sl st into 1 st dc. Change colour
$3 r d$ round - (1dc, 1htr, $3 t r$, 1htr, 1dc) in each 2-ch lp, 1ch.
4th round - 1dc around bp of 1st dc in Rnd 2, (3ch, 1dc around bp of next dc) 3 times, 3 ch , sl st into 1st dc and fasten off.
Change colour Join yarn with a sl st into any 3-ch lp.
5 th round - (1dc, 1htr, 3tr, 1hdtr, picot, 1hdtr, 3tr, 1htr, 1dc) in each 3-ch lp. Fasten off.

## FLOWER 2

Work rounds 1 and 2 as per flower 1 then change colour and work round 5 into each 2 -ch lp. Fasten off.

## FLOWER HEADBANDS

One head band, one flower and a length of French knitted rope. Make a length of gelato rope using the French knitting machine following instructions inside packaging (the length of rope can be cut down to the size needed and tied off following the cast off instructions, so it is not important to make the rope any particular length).

Thread the headband through the centre of the French knitted rope and sew off each end to keep the band in place. Sew the flower in place.


## FLOWER HEADBAND

One length of French knitted rope and one flower. Make a length of gelato rope and cut it down to a length that will stretch comfortably around your head. Sew the ends together to form a loop and sew a flower over the ends.

## FLOWER RIBBON

One length of French knitted rope and two flowers. Make a length of gelato rope long enough to tie around the parcel you want to wrap, sew off both ends and attach flowers to each end.
