Wrestlers to Point for New York Cup

The varsity wrestlers will travel to the U.S. Military Academy at West Point this weekend to compete in the prestigious New York State Cup Meet. The Cup tournament is an invitational of 16 of the best teams in New York State. Unlike other tournaments, the teams will not compete on an individual wrestler basis but as a team dual meet tourney. The teams competing will be seeded according to the New York State Sportswriters' Poll of Jan. 31 and placed on the 16-team bracket. Each section has been asked to send its best two teams.

The meet starts with weigh-ins at 7:30 a.m. and the first dual is at 9 a.m. Sunday morning. There will be eight mats down on the West Point Fieldhouse. Each team will have an opportunity to wrestle at least twice. The second round will take the eight winners from the first round and compete on four mats at 11 a.m. The early afternoon will have the top four teams competing in the semi-finals and the top two will wrestle at 7 p.m. for the cup. The losers of semi-finals will wrestle for third and fourth as a prelim to the finals. The entry list so far is impressive. Number-one ranked Fulton heads the lineup followed by Sarchem of Sec-
