A Philadelphia native, Rasheed Bailey signed with his hometown Philadelphia Eagles as a rookie free agent following the 2015 NFL Draft. Bailey appeared in 43 career games for the Delaware Valley Aggies and set a new school record with 3,138 career receiving yards. His 1,707 yards and 19 touchdowns as a senior in 2014 led all of Division III.

BIRDSEED

- Grew up a passionate Eagles fan and admired former Eagles RB Brian Westbrook during his youth. "I used to want to skip out on church to watch the Eagles play," joked Bailey. "I watched all of their games and loved watching Westbrook. I remember thinking to myself, 'Man, this guy can really run
- Shortly after he signed with the Eagles, DelVal's dining hall had a "Rasheed Bailey Day," and served some of the wideout's favorite foods: seafood and chicken gumbo, fried cod, roasted potatoes, steamed broccoli and peach cobbler
- Cites the two most memorable moments of his sports career as receiving his first letters from colleges while at Roxborough High School and getting a call from Eagles offensive coordinator Pat Shurmur following the 2015 NFL Draft. Bailey remembers his draft experience: "My family and friends were all gathered. There was a lot going on, but when it was time to make a decision on which team to go to, I wanted to just go do it. My biggest goal was to get a chance and to have this feeling that I have now. Now it's up to me to make the most of this situation."

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- Holds the DelVal record for most career receiving vards with 3.138, is tied for the second-most receiving TDs in school history with 29 and is ranked third in career receptions with 165
- As a senior in 2014, was named the Middle Atlantic Conference Offensive Player of the Year and firstteam all-conference after leading all of Division III in receiving yards (1,707), yards per game (155.2 avg.) and receiving TDs (19). His yardage total, TD total and reception total (80) all set single-season school records. Also named the Maxwell Football Club Tri-State Player of the Year
- His 11 catches in a win at Montclair State (9/6/14) is tied for the highest single-game total in DelVal annals
- Notched a single-game-record 252 receiving yards in a win vs. Albright (10/4/14)
- Tied the Aggies' record for most receiving touchdowns in a game on two occasions in 2014, notching four scores vs. Albright (10/4) and at Lebanon Vallev (9/27)

- Served as a team captain during his senior campaign and believes that the responsibility was one of the most important he has ever had. "It was an incredible honor to be chosen as a leader of the team and I helped play a role in doing things that had never been done before at the school from a leadership standpoint."
- Started all 11 games as a junior in 2013 and earned first-team All-MAC honors after leading DelVal with 51 catches for 977 yards and eight TDs. Tallied five 100-yard outings on the season
- Became a full-time starter as a sophomore in 2012, starting all 11 games and hauling in 29 passes for 365 yards and two TDs
- Appeared in 10 games as a true freshman in 2011 and made five catches for 89 yards

- A native of Philadelphia, Bailey graduated from Roxborough (PA)
 High School where he played tight end and hauled in 34 receptions for 538 yards and seven TDs as a senior in 2010
- Became the first player from DelVal to sign with an NFL team since offensive lineman Steve Wagner joined the Eagles for the 1993 training camp
- Also played tennis, baseball and basketball at Roxborough High School and was a member of the school's bowling team
- Began playing football at the age of 5. "I remember a family get-together in Virginia when I was 5 where everyone was throwing around a yellow and purple foam football. I was always the one jumping and diving around and I remember diving and catching one pass and realizing that this was what I wanted to do."

- Graduated from DelVal in May 2015 with a degree in business marketing

Prior to his senior year of college, Bailey interned with a marketing consulting firm that worked with players from both the NFL and NBA. Bailey would assist the company in setting up endorsement calls and signing sessions for several athletes, including the Eagles own Darren Sproles.
