Introduction

In this study you will find a presentation of the World FINA Open Water Swimming Events (World Championships, World Cups, Grand Prix) with the standings of the first three places at all events of these competitions followed by several classifications which are listed either by the number of titles or medals by swimmer or National Federation.

It should be made clear that these standings only have a historical aim and not any sporting significance because the comparison of the achievements of swimmers between different generations is unfair for several reasons:

1. The period of time with different calendars
2. The evolution of the programme.

This edition may manifest certain errors; we hope that this will be remedied for the next edition with the assistance of our readers. The FINA Secretariat would be happy to receive any amendments or notification of inaccuracies concerning this brochure.
