Technology Checklist

Before you start this class you should take into consideration some of these technology skills that may be needed in order to complete the course:

ANGEL Learning Management System

- Have you taken the ANGEL Orientation?
- Do you remember how to use the navigation menus in ANGEL?
- Do you remember how to upload documents in order to submit class assignments?
- Do you remember how to download documents to review, read, and reference?

Communication Tools

- How will your instructor contact you?
- How will you contact your instructor and other students in the class?
- Are there ways to meet in real-time with synchronous technologies?

Multimedia Formats

- Remember to look for different types of documents, audio and video recordings, slide shows, games and simulations.
- What types of files will you have to download (e.g., Word, PDF, PowerPoint)?
- Are you required to download any software in order to view these materials?
