This is a first step in an ongoing process, which has included more expansive data collection in recent years, and will include an online submission of information in the near future.



Distribution of Site Visit Team assessment of "partially-met" and "unmet" accreditation criteria across PAB's 11 standards.

















## **Enrollment and Graduates by Geographic Regions (Bachelor's)**

















## **Enrollment and Graduates by Geographic Regions (Master's)**






### **Educators in the Site Visitor Pool**








