
Contemporary New Zealand Painting and Sculpture



Over the past years we have had three exhibitions of EIGHT NEW ZEALAND PAINTERS which were retrospective in character and were intended to make the work of serious New Zealand painters better known throughout the country.

To some extent this present exhibition is a summing up of those three exhibitions, but consists entirely of work done during the last two years. It also includes artists not previously represented.

Initially a total of seventy paintings and twelve pieces of sculpture was set, but of the twenty-eight painters and eight sculptors originally invited only nineteen painters and four sculptors are represented, the others for various reasons were unable to accept or had no suitable work available. Despite the absence of several well known artists, this exhibition does represent serious art in New Zealand at this present time.
