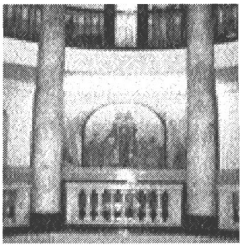


THE COURTHOUSE PORTRAITS

The Courthouse houses 26 portraits of county judges. The portraits were painted by Mr. and Mrs. Vale who began their work in the 1920's and finished in the 1940's using still pictures to capture the judges' likenesses to canvas. The more recent portraits were done by various artists in actual studio sittings.

SECOND FLOOR



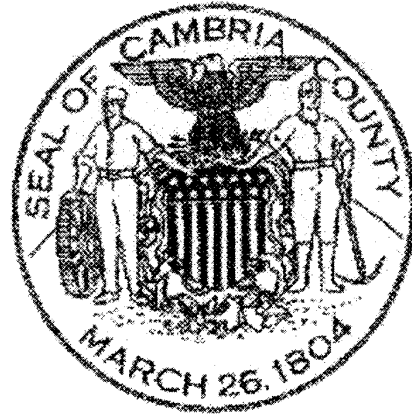
These two murals were painted in the 1930's during the Great Depression under the Federal Works Progress Administration. The mural to your left is entitled, "Justice" and the one to your right is

entitled "Knowledge." In 1994, the murals were meticulously restored to remove years of grime and deterioration.



Today, the courthouse stands, renewed to its original splendor, as a symbol of the seat of County government instituted over 150 years ago in our then fledgling nation.
