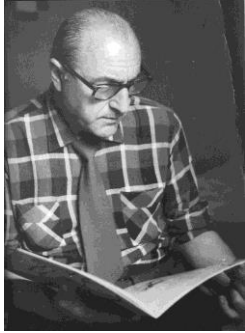


## José Pedro Costigliolo

b. 1902, Montevideo, Uruguay - d. 1985, Montevideo, Uruguay



From 1921 to 1925, Costigliolo studied at the "Circulo de Bellas Artes" with important teachers such as Vicente Puig and Guillermo Laborde. During his career he produced paintings in a variety of styles including Cubism, Purism, and Russian Suprematism, producing both figurative and non-figurative works. In 1952 Costigliolo founded, with his wife Maria Freire and Antonio Llorens, the Non-figurative Art Group, revolutionizing Uruguayan art together. Costigliolo was one of the most important artists of Modernism in Uruguay, and was considered a pioneer in this movement.
