### **Season Preview**

Last season, the Cortland baseball team extended its streak of consecutive NCAA Div. III playoff appearances to 21. Only three other programs across all divisions own longer streaks, and each is a Div. I program. The University of Miami leads with 41 straight, followed by Florida St. with 36 and Cal State Fullerton with 22. The Red Dragons also captured the SUNYAC regular-season and tournament titles, tied for ninth nationally and finished the season with a 38-11 record. Along the way, 15th-year head coach Joe Brown eclipsed 500 career wins as his career record stands at 517-142-3 entering 2014.

Cortland enters 2014 ranked 10th in the D3baseball.com and 15th in the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper Division III preseason polls. The Red Dragon schedule features 10 games against eight teams that qualified for the

NCAA Div. III playoffs last season, as well as an 18-game slate versus challenging conference competition.

For the second straight season, Brown needs to replace a good deal of pitching lost to graduation. Four starters and Cortland's top reliever, who combined for a 22-4 record with four saves, have departed, leaving key roles up for grabs in 2014.

Sophomore Brandon Serio had an outstanding rookie season for the Red Dragons. Serio was named the ECAC Rookie of the Year and the SUNYAC's Clark V. Whited Rookie of the Year. He also was selected to the NCAA Div. III Regional All-Tournament Team. Serio posted a 5-1 record with a 1.21 ERA, 37 strikeouts and 44.2 innings pitched in 11 appearances, including eight starts, in 2013.

Junior Brandon McClain earned second team All-SUNYAC honors as a sophomore after compiling a 5-1 record with a 2.67 ERA, a team-high 59 strikeouts and 57.1 innings in 11 appearances and nine starts. Senior Matt Holling is Cortland's other returning pitcher who earned starts last season. Holling appeared in six games with three starts, posting a 1-0 record with 12 strikeouts in 12.2 innings.

Brown returns seven players who pitched out of the bullpen in 2013. In his first season with the program, senior Cody Petre put up excellent numbers. He led the team with five saves in 14 appearances and posted a 2.18 ERA with 21 strikeouts in 20.2 innings. Senior Steven Kimmelman led the Red Dragons with 17 appearances last season. He posted a 2-0 record with three saves, a 3.00 ERA and fanned 27 batters in 24 innings while holding hitters to a .188 batting average.





Junior Ryan McAlary made 11 relief appearances as a sophomore, posting a 3.48 ERA with seven strikeouts in 10.1 innings. Senior Steve Komanecky pitched in eight games in relief last season. He fanned six batters in nine and a third innings, recorded a 4.66 ERA and held opposing batters to a .222 average. Sophomores Tyler Brien, Travis Laitar and Jake Shelley combined for 17 relief appearances and 22.2 innings pitched as freshmen. Sophomore Ryan Prochna also returns to the staff after being a member of the program in 2013.

Newcomers to the pitching staff include senior Mark Palumbo, juniors Vinny Bomasuto, Zach Ferris and Garrett Hoag and freshmen Pat Bronson, Patrick Gosney, Pat Healy, Ryan Koval, Pat Metzger, Dillon Robinson and Jesse Winters.

The Red Dragons return three senior catchers in 2014. P.J. Rinaldi, who

spent the majority of the year in the designated hitter role, earned second team ABCA and D3baseball.com All-Region and first team All-ECAC and All-SUNYAC honors as a junior. He also was selected to the SUNYAC All-Tournament Team. Rinaldi batted .344 with 31 runs, five doubles, two triples, three home runs and 42 RBI and stole 12-of-16 bases. Tim Panetta spent the majority of the time behind the plate last season, starting 25 games at the position and playing in 31 overall. Panetta batted .318 with 12 runs, four doubles, three homers and 17 RBI and threw out 35.7 percent of would-be base stealers. Bryan Marotta batted .244 with five runs, one double and 11 RBI in 26 games as a junior in his first season with the program. Junior Matt Duggan is the lone newcomer at the position.

Eight infielders are back this

season. Senior captain Max Rosing started 48 games at first base in 2013, earning first team ABCA All-Region, D3baseball.com All-Region, All-ECAC and All-SUNYAC and SUNYAC Tournament MVP honors. Rosing batted .379 with 34 runs, 12 doubles, two doubles and a team-high 45 RBI. He also stole five bases and recorded a .995 fielding percentage. Senior Anthony Iacomini was a first team D3baseball.com All-Region and second team All-SUNYAC selection in his first season with the program in 2013. He batted .311 with 24 runs, three doubles and 15 RBI in 41 games, including 30 starts.

Senior Michael DeCarr also played his first season for the Red Dragons last year. DeCarr saw action in 27 games with 18 starts, batting .299 with 14 runs, seven doubles, one triple, one homer and 18 RBI. He also stole 5-of-7 bases. Senior James Quinn owns a .300 career batting average in 65 games. Last season, he batted .250 with 12 runs and two RBI and stole 3-of-3 bases in 26 games with five starts. Junior Mitch Hollander batted .324 in 21 games, including six starts. He added 11 runs, three doubles, one triple and seven RBI.

Sophomore Keith Andrews saw action in 21 games with two starts as a freshman. He batted .273 with nine runs and three RBI. Sophomore Austin Clock batted .250 with three RBI in 21 games, while sophomore Connor Griffin appeared in five games and went 1-for-2 with an RBI on the season.

Newcomers in the infield include juniors Mark DeMilio, Pat Farina and Anthony Simon and freshmen Matt Michalski and Rich Fiorentino.

Six outfielders return in 2014, including a pair who last saw action in 2012. Senior Chris Jackson earned second team D3baseball.com and first team All-SUNYAC honors last season. He played in 45 games with 35 starts and batted .328 with 25 runs, six doubles, two triples, a team-best six homers and 26 RBI. Jackson also stole 7-of-10 bases. Senior Mathew Wild, who graduated two seasons ago but retained a year of eligibility, and junior Adam

Smith each missed all of 2013. Wild saw the field in 31 games with six starts in 2012. He batted .267 with seven runs, one double and nine RBI. Smith batted .353 in 17 games, including six starts, in 2012. He added nine runs, one double and three RBI.

Junior Donny Castaldo appeared in 43 games with 21 starts as a sophomore. He batted .374 with 24 runs, six doubles, one triple, one homer and 20 RBI. Castaldo stole 9-of-9 bases and did not commit an error in the outfield in 50 chances. Sophomore Conrad Ziemendorf batted .310 with 10 runs, three doubles, one triple and six RBI in 30 games, including two starts. He also swiped three bases and went errorless in the field. Sophomore Mike Fillers saw action in 10 games in 2013, scoring a pair of runs on the season. Freshman Nick Hart and Bomasuto join the team in the outfield

### **Coaching Staff**



### Joe Brown Head Coach

Joe Brown has led Cortland to a combined 517-142-3 record, 14 NCAA Div. III tournament appearances, seven World Series showings and 12 State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) titles in his first 14 seasons as the Red Dragons' head coach. His winning percentage of .784 prior to the 2013 season was the best of any coach nationally (NCAA Div. I, II or III) with at least 10 years of experience and the third-best all-time among all Div. III coaches with 10 years as a head coach.

In 2013, Brown guided Cortland to a 38-11 record with its 12th SUNYAC title in 14 years. The program reached the 30-win mark for the 13th time in Brown's tenure and extended its streak of NCAA Div. III tournament appearances to 21 straight years, which stands as the longest run in the nation. Cortland tied for ninth nationally after placing second at the NCAA Div. III New York Regional.

In 2012, Brown led the Red Dragons to a 41-9-1 record, a SUNYAC title and a fourth-place national finish. The team posted its fifth 40-win season under Brown. In 2011, Cortland finished 36-10, won the SUNYAC title and tied for ninth nationally after placing second at the NCAA Div. III New York Regional. In 2010, Brown led Cortland to a 40-10-1 record and a second-place national finish at the NCAA Div. III World Series. The national runner-up showing was Cortland's second, both under Brown, with the first coming in 2005.

In 2009, Brown led Cortland to a 31-14 mark. The Red Dragons won the SUNYAC title and qualified for the NCAA Div. III playoffs. In 2008, Brown's team enjoyed a 42-5 record that featured a school-record 38-game winning streak. Cortland won the NCAA New York Regional title and tied for seventh place at the World Series. In 2007, Brown guided Cortland to a 42-7 record and a fourth-place national finish with a 2-2 mark at the World Series. His 2005 squad finished second nationally and posted the most wins in school history with a 43-9-1 record. His 2000 and 2001 squads also won NCAA New York Regional titles and tied for fifth nationally each year. His 2003 and 2006 teams each tied for ninth nationally and his 2002 and 2004 teams both tied for 17th.

In 2000, he had the best season of any Cortland first-year head baseball coach, leading the Red Dragons to a 36-9 record, an NCAA Div. III New York Region title and a tie for fifth place at the World Series. In 2001, his squad finished 34-11, winning a regional title and once again tying for fifth nationally at the World Series. In 2002, Cortland finished the season 31-11 and participated in the NCAA Div. III regional. In 2003, the Red Dragons were 35-11, advanced to the champion-ship game of the NCAA regional and finished tied for ninth nationally. In 2004, the Red Dragons finished 29-16 and earned one of three national "Pool C" at-large tournament berths. In 2006, Cortland posted a 39-9 record, won the SUNYAC championship and advanced to the NCAA regional finals.

Brown has been named the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) New York Region "Coach of the Year" eight times (2000, 2001, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2011 and 2012) and the SUNYAC "Coach of the Year" on four occasions (2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008). He was also the inaugural winner of the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Upstate New York Div. III Coach of the Year award in 2009. Twenty-two of his players have been chosen as All-Americans, including six who were selected in the professional baseball draft. In all, 17 of Brown's players have advanced to play professionally, including two selections in the 2006 draft, one in 2007 and one in 2009.

Prior to his promotion to head coach, Brown was the top assistant coach and pitching coach for Cortland teams that made seven straight NCAA Div. III tournament appearances from 1993 to 1999 and four World Series showings between 1995 and 1999.

Born in Clifton Springs, N.Y., and raised in Maine, Brown moved back to New York and graduated as a three-sport letter winner from Canandaigua Academy in 1986. He was inducted into the Canandaigua Academy Sports Hall of Fame in the fall of 2006. A 1990 graduate of Ithaca College, Brown earned a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education. He played four years of baseball for the Bombers and was a member of the school's 1988 NCAA Division III championship squad. Upon graduation from Ithaca, he served for one season as adjunct faculty instructor and assistant baseball coach at Finger Lakes Community College in Canandaigua, N.Y. He earned a Master of Science in Sport Studies, concentrating in sport psychology, from Miami University (Ohio) in 1992 while serving as a graduate teaching assistant and assistant baseball coach for the Div. I Red Hawks.

#### **Matt June - Assistant Coach**



Matt June enters his second season as an assistant coach with the Cortland baseball program in 2014 after a stellar four-year career with the Red Dragons as a second baseman.

June is ranked in the top 10 in five career offensive categories. He batted .354 with 181 runs, 34

doubles, five triples, four homers, 103 RBI and 45 stolen bases in 180 games. June was a three-time all-region and first team All-SUNYAC selection and received the New York Region ABCA/Rawlings Gold Glove Award following his junior season.

#### Mike Zaccardo - Assistant Coach

Former Red Dragon standout Mike Zaccardo enters his fourth overall year on the Cortland coaching staff in 2014, having previously served as an assistant coach in 2010-11. After wrapping up a three-year career with the Red Dragons, Zaccardo signed a free agent contract with the Philadelphia Phillies organization in 2008.

While at Cortland, Zaccardo batted .364 with 30 doubles, two triples, 20 homers and 113 RBI in 121 games. He's tied for fifth in career home runs and is ranked 12th in career RBI. As a junior, Zaccardo earned third team All-America honors and was named ECAC Upstate New York, New York Regional and SUNYAC Player of the Year and also was chosen to the ABCA/Rawlings National and New York Gold Glove teams.

### Alex Coffey - Assistant Coach



The 2014 season is Alex Coffey's third as an assistant coach on the Cortland baseball staff after playing four seasons with the Red Dragons as a corner infielder.

Coffey appeared in 103 games during his career, batting .312 with 48 runs, 16 doubles and 46 RBI. He

batted a career-best .389 as a sophomore and .350 his junior season in which the Red Dragons finished second nationally at the NCAA Division III World Series.

#### Travis Ratliff - Assistant Coach



Travis Ratliff joins the Cortland baseball coaching staff in 2014. Prior to Cortland, Ratliff served as the pitching coach for the Vermont Mountaineers of the New England Collegiate Baseball League during the summer of 2013.

A four-year member of the Cortland baseball team as a starting pitcher, Ratliff compiled a 23-7 career record, earning second team All-SUNYAC honors twice and first team all-region honors as a junior. He is currently ranked fourth in program history with 238 innings pitched and 226 strikeouts and is tied for fourth with his 23 victories.

#### Mike Ondrako - Volunteer Assistant



Mike Ondrako enters his ninth season as a volunteer assistant for the Cortland baseball program in 2014. Prior to Cortland, Ondrako was the assistant varsity baseball coach for Cortland High and also has coached modified and junior varsity baseball programs in the Cortland school district.

A captain for the Cortland City Fire Department, Ondrako resides in Cortland with his wife, Patty. They have two children, Al and Jenelle.





### **About SUNY Cortland**

Located atop one of the rolling hills in central New York's "City of Seven Valleys," the State University of New York College at Cortland was founded in 1868 as the Cortland Normal School, which included among its earliest students inventor and industrialist Elmer A. Sperry of Sperry-Rand Corp. fame.

Over the decades, the campus expanded and in 1941, by an act of legislature and the Board of Regents, the institution officially became a four-year college providing courses leading to the bachelor's degree. In 1948, Cortland was a founding member of the State University of New York.

Today, more than 7,000 students are pursuing degrees within the College's three academic divisions — arts and sciences, professional studies and the school of education. Twenty-eight departments with a faculty of more than 500 offer the SUNY Cortland student body 75 undergraduate majors and 92 undergraduate minors, concentrations and options from which to choose.

The College's main campus covers 191 acres and includes 32 traditional and modern buildings. Sixteen of these structures are residence halls providing on-campus housing for approximately 3,000 students. Cortland also operates its Outdoor Education Center at Raquette Lake in the Adirondacks, the Hoxie Gorge Nature Preserve outside Cortland, and the Brauer Education Center on the Helderberg Escarpment near Albany.

At Cortland, athletics are viewed as having an important role in the educational mission of the College. During the fall, winter and spring seasons, Cortland participates in 25 intercollegiate sports — 14 women's and 11 men's — in an attempt to provide a broad program which meets the needs, interests and abilities of its students.

The Cortland athletic program placed 11th nationally out of approximately 440 colleges and universities in the 2012-13 all-sport Learfield Sports Directors' Cup Division III standings. Cortland is the only New York school and one of only four nationwide to finish in the top 20 each of the last 18 years. Since 1989, the Red Dragons have captured 15 NCAA Division III team titles.

The College offers its student-athletes excellent athletic facilities. The state-of-the-art on-campus stadium features two artificial turf fields. One field seats 6,500 spectators, the other 1,500. The Cortland football, field hockey, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's lacrosse and men's and women's track and field teams are among those who utilize the facility, which the *New York Times* called "...a new stadium worthy of a major university power."

The Bessie L. Park Physical Education and Recreation Center, opened in 1973, features the Whitney T. Corey Gymnasium with a 3,500 seating capacity; the Olympic-sized Harriet Holsten swimming pool with gallery seating for 1,500; the Alumni Ice Arena, a facility which can accommodate 2,500 spectators; a 500-seat gymnastics arena; racquetball and squash courts; a wrestling room; modern athletic training facilities; and the Francis Woods Fitness Facility.

Nearby Clayton R. Lusk Field House, with its tartan-textured surface, is home for the indoor track teams, varsity practice sessions and recreational activities. Cortland's soccer teams play on Jets Field with its plush, natural-grass surface. T. Fred "Prof" Holloway Field, which has lights for night contests, also is utilized by the soccer teams. Additionally, the College has 22 outdoor tennis courts and two outdoor basketball courts and boasts Robert H. Wallace Field (baseball) and Dragon Field (softball) as part of its 51 acres of athletic fields.
