Outline Description

The Citadella is a historic fortified city or castle since the Bronze Age.

Property Description

The Gran Castello is situated on a promontory over the town of Rabat. This vantage location was chosen because it was a naturally fortified hill which dominated the surrounding country side and provided visual control of the coastal areas. Archaeological records suggest that this site was first inhabited during the Bronze Age. This settlement was later developed by the Phoenicians and grew so as to become the administrative centre during Roman times. Throughout the Medieval period, the Cittadella proved too small for the growing population and a suburb developed beneath its walls. Following the Ottoman invasion of 1551, the Cittadella was repaired but lack of funds held its modernization. The fortification as seen today was transformed during the Knights period. In late 16th Century, architects Rinaldini and Cassar proposed plans for its renovation. A new demi-bastion, curtains, terre plains, enceintes and ravelins were built. The main land front with its central bastions was completed before 1610, followed by St. John and St. Martin Cavalier in 1614 and 1622 respectively. Although it is made up almost of military structures, within its precincts the Gran Castello hosts the Cathedral church, several medieval houses, and chapels, the law courts, the old Bishop's Palace and several other baroque styled structures some of which have been transformed into museums.


