
Property Description

Ghajn Hadid Tower is the first of the thirteen coastal towers erected by Grand Master Martin de Redin in 1658/9. The tower was partially demolished by an earthquake in the course of the middle of the 19th century and only the lower half of the structures is still standing. Surrounding the tower are a small number of rubble wall enclosures which appear to have been used by the garrison to hold their farm animals and vegetable gardens. A small rectangular building, situated a few meters away from the tower appears to have served as a militia guard room. The date of this structure has not as yet been established.
