

# New principal is appointed at DeSales

DeSales High School will open this fall under the direction of a new principal, Sister Agnes Catherine Battersby, formerly vice principal of St. Agnes High School in Rochester.

The new principal is replacing Sister Eileen Broad, who will be teaching in the English Department at Nazareth Academy in Rochester.

Sister Agnes, a former teacher at DeSales, was also the chairman of the social studies department at St. Agnes High School.

Enrollment at DeSales is expected to be 449 students, an increase of about 40 students over last year.

Two new courses, home economics and shorthand, have been added to the curriculum for the 1970-71 school year.

Also, the decision has been made to return to a program of regular scheduled classes after a year of modular scheduling.

Sister Louise Dolan is the assistant principal and Sister Rose Eileen Leary is the guidance counselor.
