About the City of Perth

The City of Perth is the capital city of Western Australia, the nation's largest state. Western Australia forms one third of the Australian continent, with 13,000 kilometres of coastline stretching from the Timor Sea, along the Indian Ocean and on to the Southern Ocean. Its landscapes range from the tropical north to the verdant south, with endless variations in between.

Most of Western Australia's 2 million people live in the greater metropolitan area of Perth, of which the City of Perth forms the nucleus. The city is the centre of commerce, culture, education, sports, recreation, shopping and entertainment. It is set between the stunning Swan River and the 400 lush hectares of Kings Park on Mt Eliza. Perth enjoys more hours of sunshine than any other Australian capital.

Western Australia is one of the leading resources industry cities in the Asia Pacific region. Australia's fourth most populous capital city is the driving force behind one of the most productive and diversified mineral regions in the world.





The International Sister Cities Network

The Sister Cities concept originated in the United States shortly after World War II, when President Dwight Eisenhower proposed a people-to-people citizen diplomacy network. The President's aim was to involve individuals and groups at all levels of society in community-level agreements that would lessen the chance of world conflicts.

Today, Sister Cities International – the global sister cities network - promotes peace and partnerships between thousands of city communities in more than 130 countries. In Australia, the Sister Cities Australia association register of affiliation lists over 600 Sister City partnerships.

Perth's Sister City Program

The City of Perth has long embraced the Sister Cities concept, enabling the people of Perth to build relationships with cities and communities around the world.

We entered into our first Sister City Agreement with the city of Kagoshima in Japan in 1974 and this long-standing partnership is now respected as one of the most successful Sister City relationships in Australia.

As one of the most liveable cities in the world, located in the same time zone as our Asian neighbours, our active Sister City relationships have an important role to play in developing international economic partnerships.

Helping to establish reliable business contacts and thereby improve business opportunities, the program acts as a gateway to new markets and trade alliances. It acts as a springboard and catalyst for new investment and knowledge-sharing opportunities, while also promoting tourism, inbound education and providing a platform from which we can address global issues with our international partners.

The Social and Cultural Benefits

Through cultural, educational and sporting exchanges, the program helps to break down intercultural barriers. It promotes diversity and encourages openness, tolerance and mutual understanding, all of which enrich our communities and those of our international partners.

In short, the Sister City program provides a host of exciting opportunities with the potential to enhance and add value to our personal and professional lives, ultimately making our world a safer and richer place.

Chengdu, People's Republic of China

Charter of Mutual Friendship established: 2010

Location: South-western China, at the western edge of the Sichuan Basin

Area: 12,390 km²

Climate: Humid, subtropical

Distance from Perth: 8,840 km

Population: 13 million

Other partner cities: Montpellier, Ljubljana, Linz, Kofu, Phoenix, Mechelen,

Palermo, Gimcheon, Medan, Dalarna and Bonn

Background: In July 2009, the City of Perth accepted a request to form a new Sister City relationship with Chengdu City. The proposal to the City of Perth was supported by recommendations from the Minister for Foreign Affairs, Australia's Ambassador to China, the University of Western Australia, Perth Education City and state government agencies including Tourism Western Australia and the Department of State Development. The agreement will enable both cities to develop a mutually beneficial relationship spanning economic development, business migration, tourism and investment.

Houston, United States of America

Sister City since: 1984

Location: On the gulf coastal plain in Texas in the south of the USA

Area: 1,558 km²

Climate: Humid, subtropical

Distance from Perth: 14,330 km

Population: 2.2 million

Other Sister Cities: Abu Dhabi, Baku, Chiba City, Grampian Region (Aberdeen), Guayaquil, Huelva, Istanbul, Leipzig, Luanda, Nice, Shenzhen, Stavanger, Taipei

Municipality, Tampico, Tyumen and Karachi

Background: Houston, the fourth largest city in the US, shares a number of similarities with Perth, not least a pioneering frontier history and an economic development base forged in the natural resources industries.

Kagoshima, Japan

Sister City since: 1974

Location: The south-western tip of the Kyushu island of Japan

Area: 547.06 km²

Climate: Humid, subtropical

Distance from Perth: 8,306 km

Population: 606,153

Other Sister Cities: Naples, Miami and Changsha

Background: Perth and Kagoshima share the same 32 degrees of latitude, albeit on opposite sides of the equator, as well as many other similarities, such as a warm climate, beautiful natural scenery, a strong marine heritage and an independent yet

open and friendly outlook.

Megisti-Kastellorizo, Greece

Sister City since: 1984

Location: South-eastern Mediterranean, approximately 1.3km south of Turkey

Area: 8.9 km²

Climate: Mediterranean

Distance from Perth: 14,684 km

Population: 430

Other Sister Cities: Antalya

Background: The increasing Kastellorizan population in Western Australia was a key factor in establishing a partnership with Megisti. Indeed, the City of Perth's Lord Mayor between 1982 and 1988, Mr M.A. Michael OAM JP, was of Kastellorizan origin.

Nanjing, People's Republic of China

Sister City since: 1998

Location: Lower Yangtze River basin, in south-eastern China

Area: 6,600 km²

Climate: Humid, subtropical

Distance from Perth: 7,950 km

Population: 7.7 million

Other Sister Cities: Alsace, Barranquilla, Belo Horizonte, Birmingham, Bloemfontein, Daejeon, Eindhoven, Florence, Hauts-de-Seine, Leipzig, London (Ontario), Malacca Town, Mexicali, Nagoya and St. Louis

Background: Nanjing and Perth share a commitment to cultural, business and educational development. China is Western Australia's largest trading partner and export destination, while WA is also the fastest growing market for Chinese students seeking overseas studies in Australia.

Rhodes, Greece

Sister City since: 1984

Location: North-east tip of the island of Rhodes, 18 km southwest of Turkey

Area: 19.5 km²

Climate: Mediterranean

Distance from Perth: 14,812 km

Population: 80,000

Other Sister Cities: Ávila, New Braunfels, Conches-en-Ouche, Greece, Yalta, Majorca, Limassol, Puebla, Rhode Island, Roses, Valletta, Visby and Pisa

Background: Rhodes and Perth have strong links through immigration. There are some records that suggest the first Greek family settled in Perth as early as 1830. According to the Consulate of Greece, the Greek population in Western Australia has risen from 148 people in 1901 to an estimated 30,000 in 2010.

Location: On the banks of the River Tay, in the east of Scotland

Area: 5286 km² Climate: Oceanic

Distance from Perth, WA: 17,330 km

Population: 44,000


Other Sister Cities: Aschaffenburg, Bydgoszcz, Cognac, Haikou-Hainan,

Background: A Charter of Mutual Friendship was signed between the two Perths in recognition of our special relationship, shared history and cultural ties. The link between the two Perths began in 1829 following the decision by the Western Australian colony's first Governor, Captain James Stirling, to name the capital city of WA in honour of the then British Secretary of State for the Colonies, Sir George Murray, who was born in Perth, Scotland.

Background: Perth and Western Australia have important connections to San Diego through US Navy fleet visits. Our cities are also connected through science, including research in the areas of marine oceanography, physical oceanography, biology/biomed/neuroscience and the biotech sector.

Background: Seocho and Perth are keen to forge a strong working relationship to explore opportunities for exchange in the areas of education, trade, recycling and sustainable energy systems, urban development and public health policy and promotion.

Location: The Adriatic coast in southern Italy

Area: 70 km²

Climate: Mediterranean

Distance from Perth: 16,117 km

Population: 40,000

Other Sister Cities: Tremiti Islands

Background: The relationship between Vasto and Perth is based primarily on migration. It is estimated that WA's Vastesi population may represent the largest number of migrants from a single European town. Reportedly around 21,000 second and third generation Vastesi currently live in Perth.
