

Application for Water Trails Site Planning and Work Crew Assistance:

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Site planning and project implementation assistance is available for well-designed projects related to water trails and low-head dam safety in Iowa. Only project sites on designated water trails or water trails under development are eligible (except where there is a safety concern at a dam not on a water trail). The purpose of this application is intended to provide enhancements or specialized skills for installation or construction projects in the dynamic river setting. It is not intended to replace regular maintenance duties, such as silt removal at boat ramps or replacing existing signs. Only projects that can be planned, permitted, and constructed within a two-year time frame will be selected.

This is not a funding source, but is to be used for limited design, planning, and crew work, materials, and heavy equipment contracting. A materials budget may be allotted to your project after it is accepted, determined, and designed on or around Jan. 15. Please refer to the guidelines in the Water Trails Design Manual, found at http://www.iowadnr.gov/riverprograms/watertrails.html, before completing the application.

Applications are due Nov. 29, 2013. We encourage inviting our staff to the site for a prereview, prior to submitting your application, but cannot guarantee a visit prior to the application deadline. E-mail or call Luke Wright (319-930-0125) with any questions.

You are welcome to attend the scoring meeting on Wednesday, December 11th from 1:00pm to 3:00pm. The meeting will take place at the Wallace Building State Office Building, 502 East 9th Street, Des Moines, Iowa. The meeting room will be **conference room 5 west (5W)** located on the 5th floor. Results will be released by the following day.

Examples of past projects include, but are not limited to:

- Dam warning sign plans and installations.
- Installation of water trail signage at access sites (not road or bridge signage).
- Portage trail or carry-down trail construction.
- Limited scale universal accessibility access projects.
- Canoe or kayak launch/landing construction.
- Clearing and parking lots.
- Paddle-in campsite construction.
- Snag / logjam mitigation projects.
- Storm water infiltration, bio-retention, and filter strips to manage run off.
- Improvements to existing accesses and parking areas

Current priorities are to enhance recreation safety at dams, installation of water trail signage, universal accessibility design projects, removal of river obstructions for safe passage, and water access redesign and construction.

Services You Can Expect

Upon request, as project design is developed, the crew can include the following equipment and operating skills:

- Project location/planning/design
- Permitting
- Signage plans
- Trained chainsaw operation, including boat based operation and log jam modifications
- Equipment including 2 walk-behind tracked skid-steers (500-1,000 lbs. tipping point) with multiple attachments, gator with dump box, gas powered drill/cutter, gas powered jackhammer, plate compactor
- Rental Equipment including tracked skid steers and excavators.
- Contractor management
- Canoes, kayaks and a motorized jon boat
- Minor carpentry
- Concrete path work (8 foot wide or less)



Definitions

"Minority Persons", as defined in Iowa Code Section 8.11, mean individuals who are women, persons with a disability, Blacks, Latinos, Asians or Pacific Islanders, American Indians, and Alaskan Native Americans.

"Disability", as defined in Iowa Code Section 15.102, subsection 5, paragraph "b", subparagraph (1):

- b. As used in this subsection:
- (1) "Disability" means, with respect to an individual, a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life activities of the individual, a record of physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life activities of the individual, or being regarded as an individual with a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life activities of the individual.

"Disability" does not include any of the following:

- (a) Homosexuality or bisexuality.
- (b) Transvestism, transsexualism, pedophilia, exhibitionism, voyeurism, gender identity disorders not resulting from physical impairments or other sexual behavior disorders.
 - (c) Compulsive gambling, kleptomania, or pyromania.
- (d) Psychoactive substance abuse disorders resulting from current illegal use of drugs.

"State Agency", as defined in Iowa Code Section 8.11, means a department, board, bureau, commission, or other agency or authority of the State of Iowa.
