1. PRESIDENT'S WELCOME

Ebby Schöler welcomed all members to the AGM in Suzhou and hoped they had had a chance to enjoy some of the championships. He looked forward to a smooth AGM and afterwards there would be a small reception given by the Chinese organizers. He hoped other meetings beforehand would be finished on time to enable for example European and Oceania members to attend the SCI AGM.

He stated that he would like at this point to thank the Chinese Table Tennis Association for their generosity regarding SCI Invited Guests and also to thank the Organising Committee for giving the SCI an office and meeting rooms for the AGM and WVC Presentations.

2. APPOINTMENT OF SCRUTINEERS

Dr. Chandra Madhosingh from Canada agreed to be scrutineer, however, he did inform the members that it could be that he might not manage to stay for the whole AGM, as he wanted to watch later that afternoon a Canadian player in the arena.

3. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF PREVIOUS A.G.M.

(Tokyo, Japan 2014, included in the SCI NEWS No 97)

Proposal to accept the minutes from Tokyo, 2014 was put forward and unanimously accepted by the assembly.

4. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Firstly, Ebby thanked the ITTF - to name a few; Etsuko Enami who arranged the meeting rooms and was always quick to answer any queries; Judith Farago ITTF Executive Director and Habiba, who with Gloria does the SCI addresses on the data base. Ian Marshall helps with articles, which are most important for the SCI website.

Since Tokyo, he stated, 10 SCI members had passed away, including founder member Laszlo Földy and very suddenly and unexpected Vera Bazzi Director of the SCI Committee Press and Publicity. Johnny Leach the SCI Deputy President also died middle of last year. Other members who are no longer with us are:

Keith Bowler, Australia Christian Duvivier, Belgium Giuseppe Molina, Italy Sally Green Prouty, USA Geoffrey Reed, Jersey Aubrey Simons, England Georges Wassmer, Switzerland

He requested the assembly to stand for a minutes silence in remembrance.

He thanked the assembly and continued that 17 new members had joined since the last AGM, among them Thomas Weikert, ITTF President – in fact all ITTF Presidents were or had been members of the SCI – the ETTU President, Ronald Kramer and the ETTA President Sandra Deaton - four members from England and two from Hungary, Kazakhstan and Latvia. An item for discussion he said within the Executive was that a considerable





number of members in the SCI were over 80 and some even over 90 years of age. The SCI need younger members and the Executive had some ideas regarding this; however, it was not so easy to put them into force. If members and representatives have any suggestions or get the opportunity to encourage younger internationally retired players to join, please inform the Executive Committee.

The SCI NEWS, Ebby stated, was arranged by Diane and himself in the SCI office and involved quite a lot of time and work. Ian Marshall had helped with articles for the last few issues and Jens-Erik Linde had managed a good layout. For the past couple of years it had been printed in Slovakia by Anton Hamran and the SCI were very pleased with this arrangement. He impressed upon members and representatives to send any articles of SCI meetings, tournaments or any other interesting information on its members to the SCI Office. Some countries had a meeting every year, perhaps, he said, this could be improved in certain countries where meetings had in the past not been held.

He reported that 7 members had been invited to Suzhou; for the European Veterans in Tampere, Finland 6 members had been invited, who have, of course, to participate in the tournament. Today, he continued, he was informed that for the Worlds in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia next year 7 places had generously been offered to the SCI. The deadline date for applications would be announced in the next NEWS in September.

The SCI trophy being presented by the SCI in Suzhou, he said, was the "Richard Bergmann" Fair Play Award - chosen by the umpires. Fortunately, he pointed out, table tennis was a very fair sport in comparison to some other sports. For the team event next year in Malaysia the SCI would present the Victor Barna "Best Player Award" and every year a Junior Fair Play Award was presented to a male and female at the junior world championships.

He informed the assembly of the latest information received that table tennis was now the largest sports association with 222 national associations in the world. Perhaps, he stated people could be encouraged to play more table tennis outside of China!

Ebby continued that the WVC Presentations for 2018 took place on Monday and the countries presenting were France, Japan, Korea and USA. The WVC Committee decided yesterday that Las Vegas, USA would host the 2018 World Veterans Championships and due to the quality of bids France was given the option for the 2020 WVC in Bordeaux. Of course, he stated inspection visits had to be made. The forthcoming WVC would take place in Spain 2016 and the SCI was in continuous contact with the Spanish Organising Committee.

He concluded his report by thanking all officers, directors and Committee members for their work in the past two years – and finally asked if there were any questions from members. No comments were made.

a) Adoption of Report

The President's report was agreed and adopted.

5. TREASURER'S REPORT

The Treasurer, Werner Schnyder, commented on the financial outcome of the years 2014 and 2015.

Subscriptions:

He advised members that subscriptions were paid fairly well on time, but it had to be pointed out however, that a considerable number of countries did not respond to invoices or reminders, even though the Club was interested in providing assistance to members who had health or financial problems.

He continued that an increasing number of members had taken advantage of the one year rebate when paying the membership fee for 5 years in advance.

Assistance and Support

Werner informed the assembly that the Swaythling Club had been able to provide some financial help to a number of members.

Profit and Loss statement

Werner advised members that a consolidated profit of CHF 27.880,19 had been achieved during the 2 year fiscal period. He said this had been mainly due to the following facts:

A number of countries had paid their membership fees 5 years in advance and the Veteran World Championships in Auckland, New Zealand contributed to this profit. He continued that thanks to the generous contribution of the SCI sponsors, Butterfly and Tibhar, the high cost of the magazine could be reduced. On the other hand he pointed out that the overall cost of the Swaythling Club due to its commitments such as the twice yearly magazine and donations to members who are in need of help exceed the income from membership fees.

Current Assets

The assets of the Swaythling Club International had increased from CHF 283.384,10 up to CHF 311,264.29. With this amount he was confident to be able to ensure all the future activities and responsibilities toward the members.

WVC

This Event, he explained was organized under the responsibility of the SCI and had become an

extremely important and popular championship. This was not only from the sporting point of view, but also a financial topic to secure and cover all the necessary expenditures, such as future Presentations for WVC organizers, office overheads, WVC Committee meetings and when necessary travel expenses. As already mentioned the event 2014 in New Zealand was a big success. The next WVC Championship would be held in Spain 2016, he stated, and he was positive that a spectacular and well organized tournament would be had and hopefully a high number of participants

Outlook 2015/2016

He was confident to be able to present a positive financial result at the end of the fiscal period in 2016. Werner said he was at the assembly's disposal for any further questions and concluded his report with many thanks to his colleagues and the Executive Committee and he expressed his sincere and special gratitude to the President Ebby Schöler for doing such an excellent job.

He thanked the assembly for their attention. No comments were made.

a) Adoption of Report

Report was agreed and adopted.

6. AUDITORS REPORT

The Auditor's Report for the fiscal years 2013 and 2014 signed by Mr. Laszlo Pal and Trix Luterbacher and read to the assembly by Alan Ransome. It stated they had in their capacity as auditors for the Swaythling Club International audited the books on April 16th 2015 for the financial period 1st January 2013 – 31st December 2014. All records for the mentioned period were available to them for audit. Werner Schnyder, Treasurer of the Swaythling Club International, who was responsible for the accounting, supplied all the information they had requested.

Spot checks of the most important income and expenditures convinced the auditors that the records were in order and the books clearly arranged and kept correctly and with due care. Moreover they had verified all the different bank accounts and the balances.

The balance sheet as per December 31st 2014 showed a consolidated profit of the Swaythling



Club International of CHF 27'880.19 and the current assets showed a total income of CHF 311'264.29.

All books and documents were kept in perfect order. The auditors expressed their warm thanks to the Treasurer, Werner Schnyder and recommended, based on their detailed audit, that the accounts presented be approved and that the Treasurer's actions be ratified.

a) Adoption of Report

Report was agreed and adopted

7. ADOPTION OF BUDGET FOR NEXT TWO YEARS

The Treasurer advised members that the assessed total Income for SCI/WVC for the years 2015/2016 would be CHF 51,800.00. Expenses for the years 2015/2016 were assessed at CHF 35,500.00 which left an estimated profit of CHF 16.300.00.

The Budget was agreed and adopted

8. APPOINTMENT OF AUDITORS

It was agreed by the assembly to appoint Mr. Laszlo Pal and Mrs Trix Luterbacher as auditors for a further two years.

9. REPORT OF THE WVC CHAIRMAN

Hans Westling gave a short report stating that a week after the Worlds Championships in Tokyo 2014 the WVC was held in Auckland, New Zealand. The tournament, he said, was run in one hall with 1,600 participants who were well satisfied with the organization. A big thank you on behalf of the WVC Committee was given to Paul Kyle and his team for staging such a wonderful tournament.

The forthcoming WVC championships would be held in Elche and Alicante, Spain 2016 and the venue was situated between these two cities. A large participation was expected and if any of the SCI members were interested, they should go to the website www.WVC2016.com for information. He hoped to see many SCI members participating in Spain next year.

He informed the assembly, that yesterday long discussions were held to decide who would host

the 2018 WVC and eventually the WVC Committee decided that the World Veteran Championships 2018 would take place in Las Vegas, USA during the month of June. An option for 2020 was given to Bordeaux, France. He commented that all applicants presented bids of a very high standard and Japan and Korea were advised by the WVC Committee to come back to apply for a future Championship.


Hans thanked the assembly for their attention.

10. MOTION FOR AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES

No motions were put forward, but Ebby explained a proposal that would be put forward in the future to incorporate the Para TT into the SCI regulations, which the ITTF had successfully already done. The Para TT Championships were, he said, separate to other World Championships. The SCI would invite Oivind Eriksen, who was involved in the Para TT, to an Executive meeting in autumn to discuss the most practical way to integrate them into the friendly Swaythling Club International and then in Malaysia 2016 put the proposition forward at the AGM. This was agreed by the assembly.

11. RELEASE OF THE EXECUIVE COMMITTEE AND SUB-COMMITTIES

Alan Ransome thanked the present Committees for their work – the AGM then released the present Officers, Directors and Committee Members.

12. ELECTIONS

Before voting took place Ebby explained to the assembly the importance of Johnny Leach, a former World Champion who had been the Deputy President of the SCI until he passed away middle of last year; even though he was unable to travel during the latter years, his heart was with the SCI and continual contact was kept with him by telephone discussing all items. Ebby mentioned that in the Constitution it was stated that the Executive Committee was responsible for the smooth running of the SCI and the Executive were of the opinion that a former World Champion or medallist should be found for the position of Deputy President. Therefore, he requested the assembly to give the EC one or two years at the most, the deadline would be the AGM in Düsseldorf 2017, maybe they could find somebody for this position before the AGM in Kuala Lumpur 2016. If nobody, however, could be found, then he would open the position to members for nominations. He hoped that the assembly would be in agreement with his suggestion.

The proposal was agreed unanimously by the assembly. Ebby thanked members and said that he and the EC would try and find a solution.

Ebby explained that the EC had not been able to fill the position of Director for the Sponsorship and Advertising Committee since Tim Boggan had been the Director. Houshang Bozorgzadeh, Assistant Director was unable to be contacted, perhaps he was unwell.

The Press and Publicity Committee, he continued, had no Director due to the sudden death of Vera Bazzi a few months previously who had occupied this position. Jens-Erik was still publishing the SCI NEWS and Libuse Uhrova has retired from her position on the committee; Jaroslav Stanek is to take her place — he is also the new SCI National Representative for the Czech Republic. Ian Marshall had kindly accepted to join this committee, helping with articles for the website and publication.

The above mentioned SCI Sub-Committees and their Directors were unanimously agreed on block by the assembly.

13. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Foong Keong Chan commented on the ITTF Veterans Committee – he thought it incorrect that Hans and Diane, who were members, should not receive free hospitality at World Championships by the Organising Committee, as do the other members of the Committee. He suggested that the SCI write officially to the ITTF regarding this matter.

Ebby thanked him and said he would consider his suggestion. At the same time he informed Mr.Chan that he and the SCI Members were looking forward to their stay in Kuala Lumpur next year.

There were no further comments subsequently the meeting was adjourned at 16.30 hrs.

EUROPEAN VETERAN CHAMPIONSHIPS TAMPERE/FINLAND

June 29th - July 4th, 2015

Since 1995, the European Veteran Championships have been organised eleven times — this year the event took place in Tampere/Finland between June 29 and July 4.

It was the outstanding largest table tennis event ever staged in Finland and became a big success in all aspects.

In one playing hall with 94 tables, the conditions for 1830 participants were perfect – and as a sufficient number of volunteers were also present and the announced time table was followed perfectly, everybody was more than pleased.

Approximately 30 SCI members took part and actually performed very well. Most successful in terms of medals was Branca Batinic, winning the WS 50 and receiving a silver medal in WD 50. One gold medal each was the result for Claus Pedersen/Niels Ramberg in MD 65, Herbert Neubauer in MD 70 with his German partner, Ding Yi in MS 50, Lumir Ruzha in MS 85 and Maria Nemet Jonyerne in WS 65.

The apple did not fall far from the tree.

No doubt that Angelica Rozeanu was unique: 17 gold medals at World Championships (six in singles between 1950 and 1955) for Romania, before she left for Israel in 1961. She was called "the girl who was born with a racket in her hand", a genius of table tennis – but as an ancient proverb says, the apple does not fall far from the tree.

Here come some words about the descendants of Angelica who are world famous, too: she had a daughter and four nephews/nieces. Two of them, Ilan and Ophir Herbst won two gold medals at the World Championships of Mind Games in Beijing (China) in December 2014 (pairs and teams, Israeli team). A few months ago, they were crowned as Bridge European Champions.

Another Rozeanu niece, Orly Herbst, was the Showjumping Israeli Youth Champion in 1992 with horse Osetia and Vice Champion of Israel some years later with the same horse.

Academy to honour Dr. Michael Scott with distinquished service award

He is a storyteller, a jokester, a man who loves to spin a good yarn and then bask in the satisfying glow as others digest the information and ultimately crack a smile about it. When it comes to medicine and sport, though, D. Michael J. Scott Jr. is as serious as one can get.

For more than half a century Scott skilfully worked both into his vocational pursuits and by doing so he has been chosen to receive a 2015 Distinguished Service Award (DSA) by the United States Sports Academy.

The DSA is given annually to those individuals who have made outstanding contributions to national or international sport through education,

research or service. The DSA is separate from the Academy's Awards of Sport. Each nominee must possess an extensive background in sport, which means that the individual must have had significant dealings in instruction research or service in sport for more than 10 years.

Born in Butte, Mont., to a father who was a surgeon and a mother who was a nurse, there was little doubt what career path Scott would take. Seattle became, and remains, home, where he attended high school and college before going off to medical school in Nebraska and then interning in New York City. Ultimately, Scott set up a dermatology practice in Seattle following stints as a captain in the U.S. Army Medical Corps in World War II and as an Army dermatology consultant stationed in Munich, Germany.

All the while, an athlete and sportsman lived in him. A water and snow skier, he played tennis for some time switching from racket to paddle and taking up table tennis. At that point, already at middle age, a star was born. Ultimately, he'd be named to the USA Table Tennis Hall of Fame.

In 1970, Scott became Director of the Washington State Table Tennis Association and as he taught others to play, his game blossomed and he was recognized as the best senior player in the Northwest. From there, he went on to garner seven singles or doubles honours at national tournaments well into the 70s. He also chaired the USA Table Tennis (US-ATT) Disciplinary Committee from 1973through 1982 and served as Vice-President of the USATT before being named the first USATT Sports Medicine and Science Committee Chair in 1982, which triggered his growing impact on the International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) Sports Science and U.S. Olympic substance abuse committees.

His reach extended well beyond table tennis. Scott availed his drug-testing services to the Pan-Am Games, the Olympic Games and World Championships. He also served as team physician and umpire for boxing, judo and table tennis tournaments, and shared his sport medicine expertise through lectures held from Juneau, Alaska, to Bahrain, Saudi Arabia.

Of Irish descent, Scott gained dual citizenship and served both the Irish and American teamphysician at table tennis tournaments. As recently as this decade, which puts Scott in his 90s, he was still serving in such capacity at international events.



It is with great sadness that the death of Keith Bowler is announced; he passed away on Sa-turday 7th March 2015 in Sydney, Australia. He was a long time patriarch and personal honorary member of the Oceania Table Tennis Federation; his contribution to the sport of table tennis immense. A quiet man, he was respected by all.

The funeral was held on Thursday 19th March 2015. Our condolences go to his family. Keith will go down in history as a great Table Tennis administrator and mentor to everyone associated with him over his time in the game.


IN MEMORIAM CHRISTIAN DUVIVIER (BEL)

IN MEMORIAM GEOFF REED (JERSEY)

Geoffrey Harold Reed was born on 7th of July 1925 in London. The son of a Baptist deacon he was brought up in Brownhill Road Baptist Church in Catford. During the war he was evacuated to Lancashire and eventually attended Colts Grammar School where he passed the nowadays equivalent of O levels. He started work with the RAF after leaving school as an apprentice mechanic and then moved to Jersey in 1948 when his parents, Edith and Harold retired to the island. Geoff's grandparents had also moved to Jersey some time before where his grandfather practiced as a dentist with their family home at Beachwood Cottage at La Rocque. Geoff became a Hoover salesman before joining Ken Sheppard at Forum Garage which was initially a car hire establishment. Geoff became the junior partner and the firm progressed to holding the Peugeot dealership. Geoff remained there until he retired.

Known simply as "Geoff" he was Mr. Jersey Table Tennis and he remained the Patriarch of the sport until the day he passed away having officiated at the Inter Insular where Jersey achieved a last gasp win in the Aggregate when winning the Green Trophy 8 – 2. Since moving to the island after the war he was heavily involved in the organisation and training of junior and senior

players initially within the Caesarean Table Tennis Club and he also became fully involved in the administration of the sport's organising and overarching body the Jersey Table Tennis Association. He devoted his life for over 50 years to the sport in Jersey and served in virtually every capacity possible in the JTTA including President. He introduced table tennis to many hundreds of youngsters from all the different local clubs, coaching them from beginners, and his methods have produced many Channel Island champions and highly ranked UK players. Some of these young people came from different backgrounds and Geoff managed to motivate them in such a way being involved in the sport to make them more disciplined and to give them a purpose.

Internationally Geoff was recognised as "Mr. Jersey" when he regularly attended the ITTF meetings at his own expense. He became an international umpire in 1983 and umpired and refereed many top international matches. For ten years he was the European representative on the Commonwealth TT Federation management committee. He was also an active member of the Swaythling Club International and remained fully involved on the JTTA Council. The

former is Table Tennis Champions and Officials who had represented their countries in World Championships. Geoff was the only member from Jersey and served for some 40 years attending the AGM and usually contributing as a scrutineer. He was well liked and was known as always willing to assist.

In 2006 he was recognised with a special award for his life time contribution to Table Tennis at the Channel Island Sports Personality Awards. Then in 2009 his endeavour and service was recognised by the sport's world governing body, the ITTF who presented him their prestigious Merit award.

Geoff's contribution to Table Tennis has been tremendous and selfless, not only at club level but especially at island level where he was a leading figure in achieving the long sought after goal of an island Table Tennis Headquarters. His contribution in time, effort and enthusiasm was surpassed when the JTTA had to find sufficient funds to build the new HQ at the FB Fields where all the clubs could play under one roof. Geoff mortgaged his home to provide the funds towards the costs of establishing the JTTA premises in FB

Fields. Without this amazing gesture the Geoff Reed Table Tennis HQ would not have been built and opened on 16th of June 1999. This made a huge difference to the sport in the Island allowing the JTTA to host visiting clubs and Associations for tournaments, coaching and umpiring courses and most importantly as a base for schools to visit where the children can learn the rudiments of the game before taking the sport up full time. The Centre which bears his name will be hosting the sport of Table tennis in the forthcoming Island Games and will be played under the newly installed state of the art LED lighting organised by Geoff very recently.

His memory will live on with the magnificent purpose built table tennis centre which bears his name. He is and will be deeply missed by all members both past and present of the JTTA.

IN MEMORIAM ROSALIND CORNETT NÉE ROWE

Highly popular table tennis player who won two world championships with her twin sister.

Obituary published in "The Times" on Tuesday 7th July 2015

Rosalind Rowe – playing with her sister and doubles partner, Diane – gave credence to the mayor of London's belief that table tennis belonged not to the Chinese but to the dining room tables of England. Their triumphs in the world championships of the 1950s would not have occurred but for their father's encouragement between meal times at home in west London.

A former footballer who had played for Brentwood and Wimbledon in the 1920s, Ronald Rowe wanted to introduce his five daughters to some form of sport at a time when there were fewer opportunities in tennis or hockey then there are today. So he cleared the family's dining-room table of everything other than the books that acted as a net for table tennis. The girls took to the sport straight away.

"We used to play every evening," Diane recalled. "We had to crawl under the table a lot (to retrieve the ball) but used to play for ages." Did they call the sport whiff-whaff, as Boris Johnson had famously proclaimed it to be at the Beijing Olympics? "I have never heard of that term, "she said. "He can call it what he likes."

For their 14th birthdays, the twins requested a bicycle from their parents; they were given a table-tennis set instead. They progressed from rallies in these rudimentary surroundings to practising at West Ealing Table Tennis Club for three hours every night and on Sunday afternoons.

Rosalind was chosen to play for England when she was just 16, while Diane, her twin, was selected shortly afterwards. They complimented each other perfectly as Rosalind was right-handed and Diane left-handed. Responsibility for their coaching passed from rudimentary instruction at home to Victor Barna, the five-times World Champion who had left his native Hungary during the Second World War to join the British Army.

As the twins approached their 18th birthdays,

with Rosalind ranked fourth in the world, they won the women's doubles title at the world championships in Vienna in 1951, playing their way through four knock-out rounds to reach the final against the highly rated Romanians, Angelica Rozeanu and Sari Szasz. Cheered on by British servicemen stationed in the Austrian capital, the Rowe sisters won 3:1.

They won again in an all-English final on their 21st birthsday in 1954 in front of 10,000 people at Wembley Arena, beating Ann Haydon, who would win the Wimbledon tennis singles as Ann Jones in 1969, and Kathleen Best. The twins embarked on a whirl of celebrations first of all back at home for a 21st birthday cake, and then to the England team hotel in London for a party. It was the fourth of five successive appearances in the world doubles final.

Rosalind had less success in the singles, but she generally got the better of Diane. "We were similar in lots of ways but she was more determined,

extra determined," Diane said. "She had a strong sense of character. What she wanted she went for and achieved it. She got the husband she wanted too".

Rosalind Rowe was born in Hayes, west London, 20 minutes before Diane in 1933, and she was the fourth of five sisters. During the Second World War, she was evacuated to south Wales. When her father cycled from London to see her, he found that Rosalind was unhappy. He arranged for his wife to bring the girls back home on the train in spite of the bombing of London.

After leaving school, Rosalind found a job in a

bank, but table tennis was her calling. She was a semi-finalist in the singles at the world championships of 1952 and 1953 and a quarter-finalist in 1955. The twins toured New Zealand for 36 days in 1952 and, it was reported, "they smiled and played their way into the hearts" of hundreds of people. Indeed, the twins attracted considerable publicity wherever they went. In 1951, they were invited to Sweden where they played against Queen Louise, the sister of Lord Mountbatten, at the Royal Palace. Prince Carl Gustaf, the present king, acted as ball boy.

Some attributed their popularity to their femininity and the fact they were twin. Their coach, Victor Barna, had other ideas. "They are popular because they have great talent, fighting spirit, personality and charm," he said in 1952. "They dress neatly and their behaviour on the table is exemplary. They never gasp or yell if they miss a shot and never play to the gallery."

In 1954 Rosalind became ill on the ship taking her on another tour to New Zealand – with a stop in Australia planned too – when she came under the care of the ship's doctor, John Cornett. Evidently his treatment worked and, the following year, she retired at the end of the world championships to marry him. As Mrs. Cornett, she

never played competitively again. They moved to Sittingbourne, Kent, where he joined a medical practice and she concentrated on golf and bringing up their two daughters and two sons. Sheena has emigrated to Australia, while Jan remains in Sittingbourne; Martin works in the stock exchange and John is an economist.

Diane married the German player Eberhard Schöler, who also became her mixed-doubles partner. The sisters published a book on the sport, *The Twins on Table Tennis*.

"Our father was not very good at the game but once he encouraged us, we never stopped," Diane said. "We had an innate understanding of the other, like a machine, in automatic harmony."

Rosalind Rowe, table tennis player, was born on April 14, 1933. She died on June 15, 2015, aged 82.

Obituaries were also published in other English newspapers, for example The Daily Telegraph (25th June) and The Independent (16th July).




