

NDP and Conservatives in a tight race


METHODOLOGY

To follow is a review of the latest Nanos national random telephone survey of 1,201 Canadians 18 years of age and older. It was completed between May 26th and 31st, 2012. The statistics of a random sample of 1,201 respondents are accurate to within 2.8 percentage points, plus or minus, 19 times out of 20. For 1,006 committed voters, it is accurate to within 3.1 percentage points, plus or minus, 19 times out of 20.

Results for 2012-04 are from a random telephone survey of 1,200 Canadians conducted between April 13th and 18th, 2012.

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

National Ballot





NDP up in Quebec and BC









Healthcare and jobs/economy remain tied as most important issue for Canadians


METHODOLOGY

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Results for 2012-04 are from a random telephone survey of 1,200 Canadians conducted between April 13th and 18th, 2012. A random telephone survey of 1,200 Canadians is accurate plus or minus 2.8 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.






