


Our History: Petroleum in the Bass Strait







The discovery

Following some unsuccessful studies into Australian oil prospectivity in the late 1950s, BHP Chief General Manager, Sir Ian McLennan sought the advice of Lewis Weeks, one of the oil industry's most highly regarded geologists. Over a lunch in 1960, McLennan asked Weeks where in Australia BHP should search for oil; without hesitation, Weeks replied 'Bass Strait'. Over the next few months, BHP moved to secure the acreage across much of the offshore Gippsland basin and established a partnership with Esso (later ExxonMobil), which endures to this day.


In 1965, after overcoming the many technical challenges of the deep water and extremely hostile weather conditions, BHP and Esso drilled Australia's first offshore well in the Bass Strait. The well successfully encountered hydrocarbons and discovered the Barracouta gas field. Additional gas bearing reservoirs were located in 1966 and oil was discovered in 1967. Through these discoveries, BHP confirmed that Bass Strait was a world class hydrocarbon province.

The discovery of oil and gas in Bass Strait was a watershed moment in the history of Australia and BHP: BHP transformed from being a steel maker and a mining company to a serious player in the offshore oil industry, a role it still holds today; and, Australia was provided with a degree of energy independence and self-sufficiency previously unimaginable.



Today

Bass Strait continues to be one of BHP Billiton's premier assets 50 years after discovery. To date, the oil and gas fields have produced over eight trillion cubic feet of natural gas and four billion barrels of oil. The fields continue to provide vast quantities of oil and gas for domestic use and export providing Australia with energy security and a great source of export revenue with production expected to continue for decades into the future.
