Pro Career Highlights: Averaged 7.8 points and 2.4 assists in 38 games (six starts) with the Sioux Falls Skyforce during the 2006-07 season...scored a season-high 30 points behind 7-of-11 shooting from the 3-point line against the Dakota Wizards on 3/30.

College Career Highlights: Named Southern Conference Player of the Year as a senior. Also earned Honorable Mention All-American honors from the Associated Press. Earned First Team All-Conference honors his junior and senior seasons. Finished collegiate career as Georgia Southern's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,731 points. Also ranks tied for first in three-point field goals made (262), first in free throws made (353), first in free throw percentage (.813), second in steals (194), and tied for fifth in three-point field goal percentage (.361). Is the only player in school history to record two seasons of 600 or more points and 100 made three-point field goals in a season. Played freshman season at Compton Community College in California before transferring to Georgia Southern.

Senior (2005-06): Led the Southern Conference and ranked 17th nationally in scoring (21.7 ppg). Also ranked 11th in the country in three-point field goals made per game (3.4). Scored 20 or more points 18 times, and topped the 30-point mark five times. Posted season-high 36 points vs. UNC-Greensboro. Tallied 32 points, hitting a season-high eight threes, and added a season-high seven rebounds at Chattanooga. Scored 30 points and dished out a season-high six assists at College of Charleston. Shot 7-for-12 from three-point range in scoring 33 points at The Citadel. Registered 16 points, a team-high six rebounds, and four assists at Kansas State.

Junior (2004-05): Ranked second in the Southern Conference in scoring (20.2 ppg, 24th nationally) and free throw percentage (.840), while leading the league in three-point field goals made (92) and ranking third in steals (35). Set a school single season record with 147 free throws made. Started 30 of 31 games. Scored 20 or more points 14 times and topped the 30-point mark four times. Sank 11 three-pointers in exploding for a career-high 43 points vs. Chattanooga, the highest single game total for Georgia Southern since 1973. Hit ten three-pointers in scoring 38 points vs. The Citadel. Notched 38 points vs. Appalachian State. Grabbed a career-high seven steals at The Citadel. Scored 17 points at Florida.

Sophomore (2003-04): Led team in scoring (15.7 ppg) and steals (2.3 spg). Started 28 of 29 games. Led team in scoring 11 times, including a season-high 27 point performance, hitting all 12 free throw attempts vs. Davidson. Scored 26 points on 8-for-10 shooting, 4-for-5 from beyond the three-point line at Savannah State. Recorded 24 points vs. Wofford and 23 points in the rematch. Posted first career double-double with 14 points and a team-high ten rebounds vs. Cleveland State. Dished out a season-high seven assists vs. College of Charleston. Tallied 21 points vs. Chattanooga in the semifinals of the Southern Conference Tournament.

Freshman (2002-03): At Compton CC, averaged 26.6 points and 3.4 assists. Helped lead team to a 15-13 record. Earned South Coast Conference All-South First Team honor.
