All-Time Series: UCLA leads, 5-1 Cal Poly in 2014-15: 13-16, 6-10 Big West UCLA in 2014-15: 22-14, 11-7 Pac-12

WHAT'S NEXT

The Bruins return to the court against Cal Poly on Sunday, Nov. 15, in Pauley Pavilion. UCLA, which owns a 5-1 all-time record against the Mustangs, opened the regular season Friday in Pauley Pavilion with an 84-81 loss in overtime to Monmouth. Cal Poly dropped a 74-72 decision at UNLV on Friday night in both schools' season opener. The last time UCLA faced Cal Poly (Nov. 25, 2012), Dylan Royer made 6 of 10 three-pointers to lead the Mustangs past the Bruins, 70-68. Sunday evening's game will tip-off at 7:06 p.m. (PT) and will be televised on Pac-12 Networks.

LAST TIME OUT

UCLA dropped an 84-81 decision in overtime to Monmouth on Friday evening. With the game tied, 73-73, at the end of regulation, the Bruins used a 7-2 scoring run to secure an 80-75 cushion with 2:15 to play. Monmouth responded by getting to the foul line, sinking five of six free throw shots and tied the contest, 80-80, before using four more free throws to earn the three-point win. Bryce Alford finished with a team-high 22 points for UCLA. Tony Parker logged his ninth career double-double, netting 19 points and grabbing a career-best 19 rebounds.

OUT-REBOUND

UCLA's 60 rebounds on Friday night in the team's season opener marked the Bruins' highest single-game rebound total since securing 61 rebounds against Portland on Dec. 14, 2002. Ironically, UCLA had not recorded as many as 55 rebounds in a game since dropping its season opener in double overtime to Cal State Fullerton (68-65) on Nov. 16, 2009. Against Monmouth, UCLA won the battle on the boards by a 60-37 margin. Tony Parker had career highs with 19 rebounds, nine offensive boards and four assists, while Thomas Welsh logged a career-high 10 rebounds.

INSIDE THE BOX SCORE: Monmouth's 17 steals last Friday were the most by any UCLA opponent since Kansas had 17 on March 24, 2007 (UCLA won that game, 68-55, to advance to the Final Four). Thomas Welsh finished with five blocks against Monmouth, the highest single-game total by any UCLA player since Travis Wear had five blocked shots in a win over Prairie View A&M on Dec. 15, 2012.

BIGTIME TANDEM

Senior Tony Parker and sophomore Thomas Welsh started in the Bruins' frontcourt together for the first time in a regular season game last Friday. Parker, standing at 6-foot-9 and 260 pounds, and Welsh, towering at 7-feet and 240 pounds, combined to shoot 13-for-20 (65.0 percent), totaling 31 points, 29 rebounds, six blocks and five assists. Parker had seven double-doubles last season (and one as a sophomore in 2013-14), while Welsh registered his first collegiate double-double in the loss to Monmouth (12 points, 10 rebounds in a career-high 39 minutes).

ON THE HORIZON

After hosting Cal Poly in the "Maui on the Mainland" contest this Sunday, the Bruins will take on Pepperdine in Pauley Pavilion on Thursday, Nov. 19 (7:30 p.m.). UCLA will depart for Maui on Friday, Nov. 20, and will face three teams in as many days in the 2015 Maui Jim Maui Invitational from Monday, Nov. 23 through Wednesday, Nov. 25. The Bruins have not played in the Maui Invitational since 2011 and most recently won the tournament title in 2006. UCLA will open this year's tournament against UNLV and will face either Kansas or Chaminade on day two.

COLLEGIATE DEBUTS

Freshman Aaron Holiday scored 10 points and grabbed seven rebounds in his regular-season debut Friday night. Freshman Prince Ali tallied seven points and three rebounds off the bench, while classmate Alex Olesinski added seven points and five rebounds. Ali made two of four shots from 3-point range, while Olesinski nailed his lone 3-point attempt. In all, UCLA's incoming group features seven newcomers - six freshmen and one sophomore.

BROTHERLY LOVE: Aaron Holiday is the younger brother of former UCLA guard Jrue Holiday. Jrue, in his sixth NBA season, was a freshman for the Bruins in 2008-09. He was selected No. 17 by the Philadelphia 76ers in the first round of the 2009 NBA Draft after his freshman season.

ABOUT CAL POLY

Under the direction of seventh-year head coach Joe Callero, Cal Poly returns three of five starters from last season's team. After making the NCAA Tournament in 2014, Cal Poly posted a 13-16 overall record and 6-10 mark in Big West Conference action (seventh place) last year. The Mustangs' roster features a four-player senior class that has made a combined 307 appearances for Cal Poly (Brian Bennett, David Nwaba, Joel Awich and Reese Morgan).

MOVING TO THE NBA

Two key players from last year's UCLA team opened the 2015-16 season on NBA rosters. Norman Powell (16.4 ppg, 4.7 rpg) and Kevon Looney (11.6 ppg, 9.2 rpg) played major roles for UCLA last season. Powell was a second-round NBA Draft selection last June by the Milwaukee Bucks before being traded to the Toronto Raptors. Looney was taken 30th overall in the first round by the Golden State Warriors, the organization that won last season's NBA Championship.

Media Availability

Steve Alford's weekly media availability typically takes place on the court in Pauley Pavilion at approximately 3:00 p.m. on Tuesdays prior to practice. Players follow prior to the team's 3:30 or 4:00 p.m. practice. Members of the media are welcome to observe and record the first 15 minutes of practice those days. Press conferences are not open to the public.

Credentials

Admission to press seating and the media room is by credential only. All credential requests should be made through UCLA's credential website at least two days prior to the game. Website address and instructions can be obtained by emailing Alex Timiraos (atimiraos@athletics.ucla.edu). Members of the media covering UCLA should request credentials for road games through Timiraos (via email, or phone at 310-206-0524).

Credential Pickup

Credentials are available during the week at the Athletic Communications Office. Credentials not claimed prior to game day will be available at Pauley Pavilion's "Will Call" window (Northwest corner of the arena). The media will call window and entrance opens two hours prior to tip-off.

Media Seating

A press pass enables entrance at Pauley Pavilion's Northwest media gate (across from the intramural field). Press seating is located in the upper level of the arena's south side (opposite team benches). Pauley Pavilion's media workroom is located in the Southeast corner of the building on the event level, adjacent to the Southeast elevator.

Postgame Procedure

Head coach Steve Alford and selected players will be available to the media in Pauley Pavilion's media room following a 10-minute cooling off period after each game. UCLA's locker room is closed to the media. To access the media room during or after the game, follow the stairwell down to the court and proceed to the southeast corner (elevator access available at the arena's southeast corner). The visiting team's head coach will be available following a 10-minute cooling off period outside the visiting locker room (northwest corner, event level).

PRESEASON PROJECTIONS

UCLA was selected fifth in the Pac-12 preseason media poll, announced at Pac-12 Media Day on Oct. 15 in San Francisco. Arizona was picked to finish first, collecting 18 of 36 first-place votes. UCLA secured one first-place vote. Last season, UCLA finished fourth in the standings after having been picked fourth in the preseason poll. The Bruins have won the Pac-12 regular-season title in four of the last 10 seasons.

PREDICTIONS: Members of the media have correctly picked the regular-season winner of the conference 14 times in 23 tries. Arizona has correctly been selected in nine of the previous 14 times it has been predicted to win the league crown. UCLA last won the Pac-12 regular-season title in 2012-13.

2014-15 IN REVIEW

- UCLA went 22-14 overall (11-7 in Pac-12 action), advancing to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament.
- The Bruins defeated SMU (60-59) and UAB (92-75) in the NCAA Tournament before losing to Gonzaga (74-62).
- · Norman Powell earned first-team All-Pac-12 honors, while Kevon Looney was a second-team selection.
- Bryce Alford established UCLA's single-season record for most three-pointers (93).
- Isaac Hamilton's 36 points against USC (March 12) were the most in one game by a Bruin since 2005.
- The Bruins went 16-1 at home, posting a perfect 9-0 mark at home in league play for the first time since 2006-07.
- UCLA advanced to the semifinals of the Pac-12 Tournament for the third consecutive season.

PARKER'S PROGRESSION

Senior forward/center Tony Parker has made steady increases in production each of his three seasons. Last year, he registered 11.5 points and 6.7 rebounds in 24.6 minutes per game (34 games, 33 starts). As a sophomore in 2013-14, he logged 6.9 points and 4.4 rebounds in 17.2 minutes per game (37 games, nine starts). Parker averaged 2.4 points and 1.2 rebounds in 6.3 minutes per game as a freshman in 2012-13 (33 games). He enters this Sunday's game versus Cal Poly having scored 745 career points, just 255 shy of the 1,000 career point mark.

WATCH LIST: Parker has been named to the 2015-16 Karl Malone Award watch list, as announced by the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame. The Malone Award is annually distributed to the nation's premier power forward. Parker is one of 20 players in the nation who was named to the initial watch list for this award.

TONY THE VETERAN: Parker entered the 2015-16 season ranking second among current Pac-12 players with 104 career games played. Arizona's Kaleb Tarczewski entered the year having played in 109 games. Just behind Tarczewski and Parker were California's Tyrone Wallace and Colorado's Xavier Talton (both at 101).

KEY CONTRIBUTIONS

Junior guard Isaac Hamilton was one of four UCLA players to start in all 36 games last season. A former standout guard at St. John Bosco High School in Bellflower, Calif., Hamilton averaged 10.6 points, 3.4 rebounds and 3.2 assists per game in 2014-15. He scored a season-high 36 points in UCLA's 96-70 win over USC at the Pac-12 Tournament, marking the program's highest single-game point total since Feb. 10, 2005 (Dijon Thompson had 39 points versus Arizona State). Hamilton played at least 30 minutes in 30 of UCLA's 36 games.

IN THE FAMILY: Isaac Hamilton is the fifth of six children and has four brothers, two of which have played in the NBA and a third (Daniel) who is currently playing at the University of Connecticut. His older brother Greg played four years at the University of Miami (2003-06) and Jordan was a two-year letterwinner at the University of Texas (2010-11) before being selected No. 26 in the 2011 NBA Draft by the Dallas Mavericks.

SCORE AND DISTRIBUTE

Bryce Alford entered the season as one of six returning players in the nation to have averaged at least 15.0 points and 4.5 assists per game in 2014-15 while totaling 170 or more assists. Also on that list are Jalan West (Northwestern State), Kahlil Felder (Oakland), Kris Dunn (Providence), Juan'Ya Green (Hofstra) and Chris Fowler (Central Michigan). Alford played in more games (36) and totaled more minutes (1307) than any of those players.

THREE-POINTERS

Bryce Alford, a junior guard from Albuquerque, N.M., established UCLA's new single-season record for three-point field goals made last year. He nailed 93 of 238 three-pointers, registering a 39.1 percentage from downtown. The previous record for made three-pointers in one season was 87 (Arron Afflalo in 2007 and Jason Kapono in 2002). Now in his third season with the Bruins, Alford has made 140 of 360 three-point attempts (38.9 percent).

YEAR THREE

Steve Alford is currently in his third season as UCLA's head coach and his 25th year as a college basketball head coach. In his third year at UCLA, Alford has led the Bruins to a 50-24 combined record in just over two seasons. After guiding the Bruins to the Pac-12 Tournament title and a Sweet 16 appearance in 2014, Alford helped UCLA engineer a second consecutive trip to the Sweet 16 last March. He has led his teams to at least 22 wins in each of the last eight years, including at least 28 wins in three of the previous four seasons (107-36 record over the previous four years).

PLAYER UPDATE

Sophomore G.G. Goloman is currently sidelined with a stress fracture (right leg) and will not play against Cal Poly. Sophomore Jonah Bolden did not dress for Friday's game (team disciplinary reasons) but is expected to play on Sunday.

NEWS & NOTES

HOME COOKIN'

The Bruins have posted a 32-4 overall record at home in two-plus seasons under head coach Steve Alford. Last season, UCLA went 16-1 at home. The team's only home loss came against Gonzaga (87-74) on Dec. 13, 2014. In 17 home games, UCLA averaged 80.7 points per game. Since UCLA re-opened renovated Pauley Pavilion (Nov. 2012), the Bruins gone 47-7 at home. Two of those six losses came against teams ranked in the AP top 25 poll. UCLA's regular-season schedule in 2015-16 features 17 home games.

TO THE EAST COAST

Not shying away from cross-country travel, UCLA has played at least one game in the Eastern time zone each of the last seven seasons. This year's trek to Brooklyn in December will extend that streak to eight years. Last season, the Bruins played three games in as many days at the Battle 4 Atlantis (Paradise Island, Bahamas). UCLA played at least one game in New York City each of the previous four years, including a neutral site game versus Duke at Madison Square Garden in Dec. 2013. In Nov. 2012, the Bruins face Georgetown and Georgia at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn.

RANKED OPPOSITION

Since the start of the 2006-07 season, UCLA has gone 29-27 against teams ranked in the AP top 25 poll. In 2014-15, the Bruins compiled a 2-7 record against teams ranked in the AP top 25 poll. In 2013-14, UCLA went 2-3 against ranked foes. Prior to that the Bruins went 4-2 in 2012-13, 0-2 in 2011-12, 2-3 in 2010-11, 0-2 in 2009-10, 1-4 in 2008-09, 7-2 in 2007-08 and 11-2 in 2006-07.

ATOP THE POLL

The Bruins were last ranked No. 1 in the AP poll during the week of Jan. 1, 2007. UCLA returned to the No. 1 spot in the AP poll for the first time in 12 years on Nov. 27, 2006. Including that week's ranking, UCLA maintained the No. 1 ranking in the AP and USA Today Coaches Polls for six consecutive weeks (until losing at Oregon on Jan. 6, 2007). UCLA has not been ranked No. 1 in the nation since that season. Prior to that, UCLA was ranked No. 1 in the final AP poll of the 1995 season (year in which the Bruins won their 11th NCAA title). UCLA has gone 242-15 (.942) in 257 games when playing as the country's No. 1 team. The Bruins have gone 128-3 in 131 home games (ranked No. 1). In all, UCLA has spent 134 weeks ranked No. 1 in the country (12 ahead of second-place Duke, 122).

RENOVATED ARENA

The 2015-16 campaign marks UCLA's fourth season playing in a renovated Pauley Pavilion. UCLA's iconic home was closed during the 2011-12 season to undergo a \$136-million renovation. Pauley Pavilion re-opened for the team's season opener on Nov. 9, 2012, against Indiana State, the first college program for which John Wooden coached before he accepted the job at UCLA. The reconfigured layout of Pauley Pavilion can seat as many as 13,800 (capacity was 12,800 before the renovation). The arena began its expansion and renovation in March 2010. At that time, the building remained in a functional capacity during the 2010-11 season. In its current configuration, Pauley Pavilion provides many additional amenities, including more concession points and restrooms, a custom designed 16-foot by 12-foot LED high-definition Daktronics video board and an interior LED ribbon board. Pauley Pavilion originally opened in time for UCLA's 1965-66 season. The Bruins' freshman team defeated the varsity team on Nov. 27, 1965, before the season was officially underway Dec. 3, 1965, when No. 1-ranked UCLA defeated Ohio State, 92-66.

VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

The Bruins have seven games scheduled against teams which are ranked in the AP's preseason top 25 poll. In fact, should the Bruins play Kansas in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational, UCLA could face three teams ranked in the preseason top 10 in its first 12 non-conference contests. Last season, the Bruins played six games during the regular season (and three in postseason action) versus teams ranked in the AP top 25 poll.

UCLA has faced the nation's No. 1-ranked team three times over the last two seasons. Most recently, the Bruins faced No. 1 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 2014. The previous year, UCLA fell to No. 1-ranked Arizona in a Pac-12 game in Pauley Pavilion (Jan. 9, 2014) before losing to No. 1-ranked Florida in the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16. UCLA has gone 10-22 all-time against the Associated Press' No. 1-ranked team.

THIS DAY IN BRUIN HISTORY

Nov. 15, 1991

Ranked No. 11 in the nation, UCLA defeated No. 2-ranked Indiana by an 87-72 margin at the Springfield Civic Center in Springfield, Mass., as part of the Hall of Fame Tipoff Classic. Don MacLean scored a team-high 20 points and grabbed nine rebounds, while Tracy Murray added 19 points and seven boards for UCLA. The Bruins limited Indiana star Calbert Cheaney to just eight points on 2-of-9 shooting from the field. Making his collegiate debut, Bruins' freshman guard Tyus Edney tallied four assists (no turnovers) and three steals in 10 minutes.

Upcoming Dates (UCLA vs. Pepperdine, Nov. 19)

Nov. 19, 2001

Ranked No. 3, nationally, UCLA defeated Houston by a 71-60 margin in a first-round game of the Maui Invitational at the Lahaina Civic Center. Jason Kapono scored 16 points to lead UCLA, which advanced to a semifinal matchup the next day against Ball State. Kapono (4-for-7 from 3-point range) made his first 3-pointer just 23 seconds into the half and extended the Bruins' lead to 30-27. His second gave UCLA a 49-36 advantage, the team's biggest cushion to that point. Matt Barnes finished with 13 points and 12 rebounds in 30 minutes for the Bruins.

- Since 1948, UCLA has produced the second-most NBA draft selections (114). Kentucky tops that list with 118 draft picks. Trailing Kentucky and UCLA on the all-time list are North Carolina (105) and Duke (85).
- With 14 former players on NBA rosters, UCLA leads all Pac-12 programs in that category and ranks fifth, nationally. Last season, 17 Bruins competed in the NBA, including five players from UCLA's 2013-14 squad.
- Former UCLA guards stole the show at last season's NBA All-Star Weekend in New York. Zach LaVine won the Sprite Slam Dunk Contest (Feb. 14), one night before Russell Westbrook was named the All-Star Game MVP (Feb. 15).
- Seven UCLA players under head coach Steve Alford have advanced to the NBA. Four of those Bruins were firstround NBA draft picks (Zach LaVine, Jordan Adams, Kyle Anderson and Kevon Looney). In addition, Norman Powell was a second-round pick in 2015, while Travis Wear and David Wear joined NBA teams as undrafted free agents.

UCLA AND THE NBA

Matt Barnes entered the 2015-16 NBA season as the most veteran former UCLA player in the league. Barnes, a second-round pick (No. 46 overall) by the Memphis Grizzlies in 2002, didn't make his NBA debut until Jan. 19, 2004, for the Los Angeles Clippers. Barnes entered this season having played in 779 career NBA contests. Also in his 12th season in the NBA, Trevor Ariza began the 2015-16 campaign having played in 714 career NBA games. Ariza is the only current Bruin in the league to have won an NBA championship (2009, Los Angeles Lakers).

NBA ALL-STAR SELECTIONS

UCLA has sent 17 players to the NBA who have competed in the annual NBA All-Star Game. Playing in the league from 1969-89, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar earned an all-time record 19 All-Star Game selections. Gail Goodrich, Marques Johnson and Reggie Miller each secured five trips to the NBA All-Star Game. Current UCLA products in the NBA who have earned All-Star selections include Russell Westbroook (2011, 2012, 2013, 2015), Kevin Love (2011, 2012, 2014) and Jrue Holiday (2013). This season's NBA All-Star Game will take place in Toronto on Feb. 13, 2016.

STRONG SCHEDULES

Since arriving at UCLA in March 2013, head coach Steve Alford has helped the Bruins add top-ranked opponents such as Duke, Gonzaga, Oklahoma, North Carolina, Ohio State and Kentucky to the non-conference schedule. In 2013-14, UCLA faced Duke in a neutral site game at Madison Square Garden before scheduling a pair of home-and-home series with Gonzaga (Dec. 2014 and Dec. 2015) and Kentucky (Dec. 2015 and Dec. 2016).

BACK TO MAUI: Later this month, the Bruins will play in the 2015 Maui Jim Maui Invitational. UCLA opens the tournament against UNLV on Monday, Nov. 23, and could play either Kansas or Chaminade on Nov. 24. The Bruins' third game of the tournament (Nov. 25) will be against either Indiana, St. John's, Wake Forest or Vanderbilt. UCLA last played in the Maui Invitational in 2011 after winning that tournament in 2007.

CBS SPORTS CLASSIC: UCLA will play North Carolina in the CBS Sports Classic on Dec. 19 at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. UCLA faced Kentucky last season, and North Carolina played Ohio State in a doubleheader at the United Center in Chicago (Dec. 20, 2014) as part of the first-ever CBS Sports Classic. Next season, the one-day doubleheader moves to Las Vegas (Dec. 17, 2016), where UCLA will take on Ohio State.

MARK THE CALENDAR: The Bruins will finish their home-and-home series versus Gonzaga in Spokane, Wash., next month with a game at the McCarthey Athletic Center (Dec. 12). In addition, UCLA's home-and-home series versus Kentucky will feature the Wildcats' first-ever trip to Pauley Pavilion on Thursday, Dec. 3. UCLA will play Kentucky at Rupp Arena for the first time ever on Dec. 3, 2016.

CONFERENCE PROJECTIONS

The Bruins' 13-game non-conference schedule features at least three teams which have been picked to win their conferences in preseason league polls. Those four programs include Kentucky of the Southeastern Conference (SEC), Gonzaga of the West Coast Conference (WCC), Louisiana-Lafayette from the Sun Belt Conference and North Carolina of the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC). Below is a complete breakdown of these conference projections. Two of UCLA's non-conference games in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational have opponents that are to be determined.

UCLA BASKETBALL ON THE AIR

For the eighth straight season, UCLA's basketball games are being produced by the UCLA Sports Network from IMG, with AM 570 Fox Sports LA in Los Angeles serving as the flagship station.

This is the 19th year of UCLA's partnership with AM 570 Fox Sports LA owner Clear Channel. Other stations on the UCLA Sports Network from IMG include KXEX (1550 AM) in Fresno and KSLK (96.1 FM) in Visalia.

Bill Roth serves as UCLA's play-by-play voice, and former Bruins' guard Darrick Martin is the radio analyst. UCLA hired Roth as the new play-by-play voice for Bruins' basketball and football games in April 2015. Roth, an 11-time Virginia Sportscaster of the Year honoree, spent the previous 27 seasons as the lead play-by-play broadcaster for Virginia Tech's football and men's basketball teams. He replaced Chris Roberts, who retired after the 2014-15 season.

A veteran of the industry for more than 25 years, Roth arrived in Westwood as a member of both the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame and Syracuse University's WAER Hall of Fame. He was involved in all facets of the athletic department at Virginia Tech. A frequent speaker at the university's fund raising and charitable functions throughout the region, he also hosted a Sunday morning television show, penned both online and magazine columns and even worked with campus police to develop unique emergency training modules for Virginia Tech faculty, staff and visitors.

Martin starred in UCLA's backcourt from 1989-92 and replaces Tracy Murray in the radio analyst role. Murray, a teammate of Martin's at UCLA from 1990-92, spent the previous seven seasons in that capacity before being named a shooting coach with the Los Angeles Lakers in Oct. 2015.

A 13-year NBA veteran, Martin entered the league with the Minnesota Timberwolves in 1994-95. As a point gurad for seven NBA teams throughout his career, the former Saint Anthony (Long Beach) standout recorded 3,525 points and 1,475 assists in 514 career games. In 1996-97, he appeared in all 82 games (64 starts) with the Los Angeles Clippers, posting career highs in both points (10.9) and assists (4.1) per game.

After his playing career, Martin spent two seasons as an assistant coach and player development specialist with the Minnesota Timberwolves. In Sept. 2012, he was hired as an assistant coach on Steve Lavin's coaching staff at St. John's University in New York. While working with St. John's, he spent one year as an assistant coach and three seasons as the program's Director of Basketball Operations.

Prior to this season, UCLA had posted a 34-32 record against teams ranked in that week's AP top 25 poll since the start of the Bruins' 2005-06 campaign. This list also includes all postseason games versus ranked opponents. UCLA's six regular-season games against top 25 ranked teams in 2014-15 marked the Bruins' highest such total since 2007-08 (which was also six).

TEAM SUPERLATIVES

UCLA entered the 2015-16 campaign with eight players who had played in at least one collegiate game for the Bruins. Senior forward/center Tony Parker has competed in 105 career games (44 starts), the highest total among any returning player. Following Parker on that list is junior guard Bryce Alford, who has played in all 74 games the past two-plus seasons (38 starts). Below are some of the best individual efforts of UCLA's current players.

MOST POINTS IN A GAME: Isaac Hamilton, 36 points, vs. USC (March 12, 2015)

As a sophomore last season, Hamilton erupted for a career-high 36 points in UCLA's 96-70 win over USC in a quarterfinal contest at the Pac-12 Tournament in Las Vegas. Hamilton helped UCLA shoot 60.3 percent from the field in that game. He made 13 of 17 shots (76.5 pct), including 7 of 9 from 3-point range. Hamilton scored 18 points in each half, but really heated up in the second half. He made each of his first six field goal attempts after halftime, connecting on all four shots (three from 3-point range) in the first 5:11 of the second half.

MOST REBOUNDS IN A GAME: Tony Parker, 19 rebounds, vs. Monmouth (Nov. 13, 2015)

The lone senior on UCLA's team, Tony Parker registered a career-high 19 points in UCLA's season opening loss to Monmouth. The big man out of Atlanta, Ga., tallied 12 of his 19 rebounds in the first half. He finished the game having recorded 19 points and career-highs in both rebounds (19) and assists (4). Parker easily shattered his previous career high of offensive rebounds, netting nine offensive boards and 10 defensive rebounds in an overtime loss to the Hawks. He registered his ninth career double-double (Parker had seven in 2014-15).

MOST ASSISTS IN A GAME: Bryce Alford, 13 assists, vs. Nicholls State (Nov. 20, 2014)

Just six days after he dished 12 assists in a season-opening win over Montana State, Bryce Alford registered a career-high 13 assists adn just one turnover in UCLA's non-conference win over Nicholls State during his sophomore season. Alford finished his sophomore season having averaged 4.9 assists per game, including four games with at least eight assists. His 13 assists that evening against Nicholls State were the most in a game by a UCLA player since Larry Drew II finished with 13 assists versus Arizona State on Feb. 27, 2013.

PAULEY CELEBRATES 50 YEARS

The 2015-16 basketball campaign marks the 50th season in which UCLA basketball has called Pauley Pavilion its home arena. UCLA opened the new \$5-million Edwin W. Pauley Pavilion on June 11, 1965 with its graduation commencement ceremony. Exactly 50 years later, UCLA hosted its student-athlete graduation ceremony in the same arena that, over the years, has played host to some of sports and pop culture's most indelible moments. From that first commencement ceremony in 1965 to a 33-month, \$136-million renovation from 2010-12, Pauley Pavilion enters its next half-century the same way it began its first — as one of the finest all-around collegiate facilities in the entire nation.

The building's history dates back to the early 1960s when UCLA Chancellor Franklin D. Murphy approached University of California Regent Edwin W. Pauley for a lead gift on the Bruins' planned sports arena. Pauley's \$1-million donation was made as a challenge to UCLA alumni to raise a 2:1 match, which was met. With the State of California adding \$2 million and Bruin students raising another \$1 million through fees, the path was paved for a new state-of-the-art aren on campus. Five months after its opening, on Nov. 27, 1965, the first UCLA men's basketball game took place in Pauley. Playing before 12,051 fans in the annual intra-squad contest, UCLA's freshman team (known as the Brubabes) defeated John Wooden's two-time defending NCAA champion UCLA varsity squad, 75-60, behind 31 points and 21 rebounds by a young upstart from New York by the name of Lew Alcindor (Kareem Abdul-Jabbar).

BRUINS LOSE IN OVERTIME, 84-81 Monmouth edges UCLA in season-opening game

UCLA dropped an 84-81 decision to Monmouth in the team's season opener in Pauley Pavilion on Friday evening.

Bryce Alford led the Bruins (O-1) with 22 points, while Tony Parker added 19 points and grabbed a career-high 19 rebounds.

Collin Stewart led a group of three Monmouth players who scored in double figures, totaling 19 points on 5-of-13 shooting. Justin Robinson registered 16 points and Micah Seaborn added 14.

UCLA led by as many as 12 points in the final 10 minutes of regulation, but Monmouth took advantage of a 16-3 scoring run to secure a 61-60 lead (6:03). From there, the game featured three more ties and advanced to overtime at 73-73. Stewart made a pair of free throws for the visiting Hawks with 54 seconds to play and Monmouth trailing, 73-71.

In overtime, UCLA opened an 80-75 cushion after Aaron Holiday nailed a jump shot with 2:15 remaining. Monmouth chipped away, connecting on five of six free throw shots in the game's next 1:33 to tie the game, 80-80, at the 42-second mark.

The Bruins led 81-80 in the final minute, but Monmouth continued to get to the free throw line and sink foul shots, making four consecutive shots from the stripe in the final 18 seconds

UCLA led at halftime, 34-30, and pushed its lead to 13 points – 53-40 – with 12:29 remaining in the second half.

The Bruins' frontcourt combination of Tony Parker and Thomas Welsh combined to score 31 points and collect 29 rebounds – Parker had 19 and 19, while Welsh finished with 12 points and 10 rebounds. In all, UCLA outrebounded Monmouth by a 60-37 margin.



- · While in Albuquerque, helped New Mexico secure four MWC regular-season championships and two tournament titles ... coached the Lobos to its two highest single-season victory totals (30 wins in 2009-10, 29 wins in 2012-13).

- Currently in his third year on UCLA's coaching staff after an extensive career working with NBA, NCAA Division I and high school programs ... in two seasons, has helped UCLA send seven players to the NBA (including four first-round NBA Draft selections).
- Through two seasons at UCLA, has helped the Bruins compile a 50-23 overall record, including backto-back trips to the Sweet 16 in 2014 and 2015.

- Served as head coach at Wright State from 1997-2003 ... was an assistant coach under John Calipari at Memphis in 2003-04 and 2004-05 ... also worked with Coach Calipari with the New Jersey Nets in 1996-97 and at the University of Massachusetts (Amherst) on the Minutemen's NCAA Final Four team in 1995-96.
- When John Calipari was named the New Jersey Nets' VP of Basketball Operations and basketball coach in 1996-97, Schilling joined him as an assistant coach ... Schilling's rise in the coaching profession was chronicled in Sports Illustrated, as he became the only coach to advance from the high school coaching ranks to the Final Four and then to the bench of an NBA team in a period of 310 days.

- Among the all-time great point guards at UCLA, Edney enters his sixth season as the program's director of operations ... he serves as a liasion to the athletic administration and other school officials in his current role and handles day-to-day operational duties with the basketball program.
- As a four-year letterwinner, Edney led UCLA to the 1995 NCAA title as a senior ... one of the nation's top point guards, he enjoyed a tremendous career in Westwood from 1992-95.
- After his collegiate career concluded, he played four seasons in the NBA (1996-98, 2001) and spent nearly 10 years playing internationally in Europe ... at UCLA, Edney was a three-time first-team All-Pac-10 selection ... in UCLA's career record book, he still ranks second all-time on the assists list (652).
