I would like to extend a welcome to all participants, presenters, and visitors to Victoria County. This is an excellent festival which continues to grow in stature.



### Featured Artist

Loretta Gould is a Mi'kmaq quilter and painter who loves bright, beautiful colours. She was born in 1976 and raised in Waycobah First Nation by her parents Annie Catherine and Joseph Googoo. In 1994, at 17, Loretta married Elliot Gould and raised five children– Dakota, Shianne, Sipu, Phoenix, and Ivy Blue.

Loretta was a quilter for about ten years after seeing a quilt in a mall. She loved it very much but couldn't afford to buy it, so she decided to take a shot at making one herself. In 2010 she began to make art quilts and has made a living with her quilting since then. She still makes

quilts today, but mostly

she paints.

Loretta'squilts hang in Rolf Bouman's art gallery "Friends United" in Cleveland, Cape Breton. Rolf asked her to try painting but she refused until her sewing machine broke in 2013. She's been painting ever since. Her first paintings sold in Germany and Finland.

Loretta's dream is to share her art around the world. It is a way to get her spiritual feelings on canvas. Her husband Elliot draws for her at times, and he also paints from time to time, Loretta adding her finishing touches.

This is a good example of a family working together.

Loretta is self taught in quilting and painting.
She uses cotton fabric for her quilts and acrylic paint for her canvases.
