Working Press Tickets
Contact the Sports Information Department, Drawer V, University Station, or telephone 388-2187. The earlier reservation will insure the better accommodation. If your request is received by Monday preceding the game, tickets will be mailed to you. If requests are made later in the week, tickets will be left in your name at the Press Gate on the West Side of Tiger Stadium.

Photographer's Tickets
Sideline passes will be issued to accredited photographers of newspapers and press services only. All requests made later than Monday preceding the game, tickets will be left at the Press Gate on the West Side of Tiger Stadium.

Radio Broadcasting
A sound-proof radio booth is available for the reciprocal free-outlet designated by the visiting school as the official outlet for that school. Any other radio broadcast will be allowed if the fee is paid in advance and the station originating will be accommodated in the best manner possible. Requests for broadcasts should be made as far in advance as possible.

Spotters
Spotters will be furnished to visiting radio stations, provided requests are made in advance. The standard fee is \$10 per game.

Newsreel Photographers
The Press Box includes a photographer's deck. Tickets should be secured in advance. For any information, please contact the Sports Information Department.
