SECURITY & POLITICS

Azerbaijan violated the principles and norms of Geneva Conventions by not allowing the Red Cross delegates to meet the recently captured NKR Defense Army Private <u>Hakob Injighulyan</u>. Instead, Azerbaijan television broadcastan "interview" of the soldier intended to discredit the Armenian side. The Armenian government is taking efforts to repatriate Injighulyan as soon as possible, hoping to avert a repeat of past cases, in which captured ethnic Armenians have died in Azerbaijani captivity under suspicious circumstances.

NKR Ministry of Foreign Affairs <u>condemned</u> Azerbaijan for its continuing campaignaimed at misleading the international community about the Karabakh conflict, in part byseeking (but failing) to impede visits by foreign citizens to Artsakh.

Russian President Vladimir Putin visited Azerbaijan and <u>stressed</u> there is only a political solution to the Karabakh conflict. NKR Defense Minister has <u>expressed</u> concern over weapons sales to Azerbaijan from Russia.

U.S. State Secretary <u>announced</u> the appointment of Ambassador James Warlick as the next U.S. Co-Chair of the OSCE Minsk Group. Secretary Kerry also stressed the U.S. continuing firm commitment to peaceful settlement to the Karabakh conflict.

The NKR government renewed its <u>proposal</u> on possible joint management of water recourses on the Artsakh-Azerbaijani border which can be beneficial for both sides and become a good example of confidence building measure to prepare nations for peace.

ECONOMY & BUSINESS

The NKR Department of Tourism reported about continued <u>rapid growth of tourism</u> in Artsakhin the first quarter of this year. Some 16,000 visitors from 86 countries represent a 40 percent increase over last year. The number does not include citizens of Armenia, who have also been visiting Artsakh in greater numbers in recent years.

August 24 marks tragic anniversary of the death of one of the legendary commanders of the Artsakh war, Hero of Artsakh, <u>Ashot Ghulyan (Bekor)</u>. Ghulyan commanded the first company (Arrachin Vasht) of the Artsakh Self-Defense Forces and participated in Khojalu, Shushi, Lachin and Mardakert operations. On August 24, 1992, Ghulyan was killed in combat near the village of Drmbon in Martakert district. POLITICS

A delegation comprising members and staff of the California State Assembly and Los Angeles City Council <u>visited</u> Artsakh and expressed support for Artsakh's freedom. They also <u>opened</u> a park of friendship dedicated to the cities of Shushi and Los Angeles. See Artsakh TV's <u>video</u>. NKR President Bako Sahakyan <u>met</u> with Speaker John Pèrez of the California State Assembly to discuss ways to expand relations.

Maryland Governor Martin O'Malley issued a <u>proclamation</u> on Armenia's Independence Day mentioning Artsakh as a "fledgling democracy". The document also stressed that "Armenia, Nagorno Karabakh and the United States shared the same values and believe in the fundamental principles of freedom, democracy, self-determination and human rights", and expresses support to "all those who chose to develop as free and democratic nations."

POLITICS

In yet another <u>violation of the 1994 cease-fire agreement</u>, Azerbaijani forces fired on civilian and military vehicles traveling on the border road in Armenia's north-east. The attack claimed the life of Private Garik Poghosyan (born in 1994), and three other servicemen were hospitalized. The Armenian military took retaliatory measures.

A routine OSCE-led monitoring of the Line of Contact in Karabakh had to be cancelled <u>after shots</u> <u>were fired</u> from the Azerbaijani side. The mediators issued a <u>statement</u> calling for a comprehensive investigation of the incident.

Cease-fire issues were discussed in separate <u>meetings</u> of Artsakh's President <u>and</u> foreign minister with the Personal Representative of the OSCE Chairman-in-Office in Stepanakert.

Artsakh President and delegation visited Belgium and the Netherlands, where they met with members of the <u>Belgian</u> and <u>Dutch</u> legislatures, as well as representatives of the <u>Dutch Armenian</u> <u>community</u> and Brussels-based <u>"European Friends of Armenia."</u>

In Yerevan, Artsakh's foreign minister <u>met</u> with the EU Special Representative for the South Caucasus Philippe Lefort.

In his <u>address</u> at the UN General Assembly in New York, Armenia's Permanent Representative to UN, Ambassador Garen Nazarian noted that "Azerbaijan rejected confidence-building measures proposed by international mediators" that could help prevent cease-fire violations and associated loss of life on both sides.

The Foreign Policy Journal published an article <u>"Azerbaijan's Interpretation of Article 41 of the UN</u> <u>Charter: Rhetoric vs. Facts"</u> by Aram Avetisyan of the NKR Office in Washington. POLITICS

Artsakh President Bako Sahakyan visited Los Angeles to participate in the annual telethon of the "Hayastan" All-Armenian Fund and to <u>meet</u> Diaspora leaders and public figures. The funds raised through the 2013 campaign will benefit the construction of the <u>Vardenis-Mardakert highway</u>. Prior to visiting U.S., the Artsakh delegation headed by President Sahakyan <u>traveled</u> to Paris to participate in the Telethon 2013 events.

Armenian President Serge Sargsyan met his Azerbaijani counterpart Ilham Aliyev, in what the first meeting since January 2012. The meeting in Vienna, Austria, for a <u>tête-à-tête discussion</u> of the Karabakh peace preceded calls to both presidents by Secretary of State John Kerry. In a <u>statement</u> issued by the Co-Chairs after the summit, the mediators stated that the presidents agreed "to advance negotiations toward a peaceful settlement" and "to meet again in the months ahead."

<u>The United States</u>, <u>Russia and EU</u> welcomed the meeting of the presidents to advance the settlement of the Karabakh conflict. Meanwhile, <u>Switzerland</u>, <u>Brazil</u> and <u>Japan</u> separately expressed their support of the efforts and mediation framework of the OSCE Minsk Group to find a peaceful settlement of the Karabakh conflict.

In <u>comments</u> following the summit, NKR Foreign Ministry stressed the importance of "the resumption of high level meetings between the presidents of Armenia and Azerbaijan after a long break." The Ministry also reiterated that "real progress in the settlement process could only be reached by … the restoration of full-format negotiations with direct and immediate participation of the Nagorno Karabakh Republic in all its stages."

<u>The U.S. City of Highland, California</u>, established Sister City Relationships with the Artsakh City of Berdzor, Kashatagh region. Earlier, the City Council of Highland adopted another proclamation that recognized the independence of NKR and urged the U.S. President and Congress to support Artsakh's independence and democracy.

ECONOMY

"Hayastan" All-Armenian Fund concluded its 16th international telethon securing more than \$22 million in donations and pledges. Read more details <u>here</u>.

While launching the <u>discussions</u> over next year's state budget, President Sahakyan stressed the importance of maintaining the social orientation and special attention to development projects in 2014.

An Anniversary of Independent Artsakh

Congressmen, Canadian MP Extend Congratulations to the Republic

Washington, DC – On September 2, 1991, the Nagorno Karabakh legislature announced the formation of the Nagorno Karabakh Republic. The historic decision 22 years ago has effectively reversed Joseph Stalin's arbitrary resolution of 1921 to make Artsakh an Armenian autonomous region under Soviet Azerbaijan. September 2, 1991 also symbolizes the end of decades of discrimination and oppression that followed Stalin's decision.

People of Nagorno Karabakh chose sovereign development as part of a lasting commitment to establish a free and democratic society. Twenty-two years after the historic <u>Declaration</u> and defending its liberty on the battlefield, the Nagorno Karabakh Republic (Artsakh) remains adherent to developing as an independent democracy and a reliable member of the international community.

Members of the U.S. Congress and Canadian Parliament have congratulated Artsakh people and authorities on the occasion. U.S. Representatives Frank Pallone, Jr. (D-NJ) and Michael Grimm (R-NY), the co-chairs of the Congressional Caucus on Armenian issues, in particular, noted that the "Formation of the Nagorno Karabakh Republic in 1991 was a testament to fundamental principles of freedom and democracy...We are committed to continuing our support of the Nagorno Karabakh Republic and of the aspirations of your fledgling democracy and its people".

Statement by a member of the Canadian House of Commons Jim Karygiannis also congratulated the people of Artsakh on the occasion. "Today the Nagorno Karabakh Republic is ... independent, democratic and fully functioning state, with a thriving market economy and a dynamic civil society", says the Canadian MP, who also let the country's observation mission during the 2012 presidential elections in Artsakh.
