SEASON & SERIES NOTES; CONNECTIONS

2014-15 Season Series: The Lakers swept the two-game series.

All-Time Series Notes: The Lakers won the 2014-15 series 2-0 after splitting the previous two season series one win apiece ... Los Angeles fell in the lone meeting with Philadelphia in 2011-12, a loss that snapped a four-game win streak against the Sixers and marked the Lakers first loss at Wells Fargo Center since 3/9/07 ... This will be the 274th meeting between the two franchises dating back to 1950 (192nd in the Los Angeles era) and the 166th since the Sixers moved to Philadelphia prior to the 1963-64 season ... The Lakers are 8-3 against the Sixers in their last 11 overall meetings and 11-4 all-time against Philadelphia at STAPLES Center ... In Philadelphia, the Lakers are 7-3 in their last 10 visits to the City of Brotherly Love ... On 12/17/10 in Philadelphia, the Lakers held the 76ers to 81 points, bettering the old series record of 82 points that was set on Christmas Day of 2002 ... Kobe Bryant has played 31 games (27 starts) against his hometown Sixers, averaging 23.6 points per game ... In January of 2006 vs. Philadelphia, Bryant established a new franchise record for three-point field goals without a miss, connecting on all seven of his attempts (10th time in NBA history with a minimum of seven attempts) ... He finished the game with 48 points, one shy of Jerry West's Lakers' series record of 49 points established in February of 1968 ... Additionally, Bryant earned the first of his four NBA All-Star MVP awards at the 2002 All-Star Game held in Philadelphia.

Connections: Lakers F/G Nick Young was a member of the Philadelphia 76ers in 2012-13 ... Lakers G Lou Williams spent the first seven season of his career with the 76ers from 2005-2012 ... Lakers G Jordan Clarkson and 76ers F/C Nerlens Noel and were both named to the 2014-15 NBA All-Rookie First Team ... 76ers G Phil Pressey is the son of Lakers assistant coach Paul Pressey ... Phil Pressey and Lakers F Brandon Bass both played together for the Boston Celtics from 2013-2015... Lakers F Metta World Peace and 76ers F Carl Landry played together for the Houston Rockets from 2008-2009... Lakers assistant coach Jim Eyen coached Landry on the Sacramento Kings in 2009-10 and 2010-2011 ... Lakers Head Coach Byron Scott, G Kobe Bryant and 76ers assistant coach Sean Rooks were teammates on the Lakers in 1996-97 ... Bryant played with Rooks through the 1998-99 season ... 76ers G Kendall Marshall played for the Lakers in 2013-2014... 76ers C Joel Embiid and Lakers C Tarik Black were teammates at Kansas in 2013-2014 ... 76ers F/G Hollis Thompson was born in Los Angeles and attended Loyola HS ... 76ers F Christian Wood was born in Long Beach and went to Knight High School in Palmdale, California for his first three prep seasons ... Lakers G Kobe Bryant was born in Philadelphia and attended Lower Merion High School ... Bryant's dad, Joe Bryant played for the 76ers from 1975-79, appearing in 287 games.

The Lakers swept the season series 2-0 in fighting fashion, climbing back from a 13-point deficit to knock off the 76ers on a go-ahead Jordan Clarkson layup with 0.9 seconds remaining in their NBA-high ninth overtime game of the season. The 13-point deficit matched the largest this season in which the team overcame to win (last done 2/25 at UTA). Left without Jeremy Lin and Carlos Boozer, both due to upper respiratory infection, the Lakers were led by Clarkson's career-night of 26 points, 11 assists and three steals, Jabari Brown's career-high 22 points (7-10 FG) in the final day of his second 10-day contract, and Wayne Ellington's 20 points. It was the first time since 4/14/14 that three Lakers scored 20+ in the same game. Additionally, per Elias Sports Bureau, Clarkson became the fifth rookie in Lakers history to record at least 25 points and 10 assists in a game, joining Jerry West, Elgin Baylor, Norm Nixon and Archie Clark. Furthermore, Clarkson is now just the fourth player this season to have 26/11/6/3 in a game and the fourth Laker since 1985-86 (Kobe Bryant, Magic Johnson, Eddie Jones) to have those marks. The 76ers were paced by rookie forward Nerlens Noel (19 points, 14 rebounds), Isaiah Canaan (18 points, three steals) and Ish Smith (17 points). As a team defensively, the Lakers tied a season-high in blocks with 10, equaling the mark set 12/23 vs. GSW. The Sixers are only the second team the Lakers have swept this season, with Detroit being the other.

Hours before the game, Kobe Bryant announced in a self-penned letter that after 20 seasons with the Lakers, he plans to retire at the conclusion of the season. What followed that news would be an entertaining contest until the very end, but with the Lakers falling just short to the Pacers in their final game of November and second game in as many nights. In the early going, the Lakers saw the effects of playing on the second night of a back-to-back, slipping behind 12-28 after the first quarter and trailing 35-48 at halftime. Despite trailing by as many as 22 points in the third quarter, Los Angeles would rally in the fourth, going on a 16-5 run between 9:45 and 4:01 to turn a 15-point deficit (69-84) into just four (85-89). While Bryant would hit a clutch three-pointer to get the Lakers within a single point with 12 seconds remaining, the charge toward a comeback was unsuccessful. Bryant would go for 13 points, four rebounds and three assists on the evening. Jordan Clarkson led all Lakers with 22 points, 10 rebounds and six assists, marking his third career double-double, while Julius Randle contributed 11 points and 12 rebounds, marking his fifth double-double of the season and young career. Nick Young added 22 points off the bench (all in the second half), including making six three-pointers in a game for the 10th time in his career, just one shy of his career-high. For the Pacers, Paul George (39 points, 10-21 FG), Monta Ellis (15 points), George Hill (11 points, six rebounds) and Rodney Stuckey (11 points, seven rebounds) each finished in double-figures. Of note, the Lakers tied a season-high in three-pointers made with 11, a season-best for offensive rebounds with 15, and a season-high for opponent turnovers forced with 16. Additionally, the Lakers set season marks for points in the fourth quarter (38) and the second half (68).

LAKERS LATEST

SCHEDULE QUIRKS

The Lakers are in the midst of their one four-game in five-nights stretch on the schedule, having played in Portland on Saturday and versus Indiana at home Sunday, and at Philadelphia and Washington on Tuesday and Wednesday, respectively.

ROAD TEST

The next eight games for the Lakers are road contests, the longest road trip in terms of games and number of days away from Los Angeles since a nine-game trip in 2007-08 that spanned from January 31 to February 13.

- By the end of this stretch on December 12, L.A. will already have played 41.5% of its road games for the year.

LEFTY LIVE

Julius Randle notched his team-leading fifth double-double of the season with 11 points and 12 rebounds 11/29 vs. IND.

- Randle is currently tied for first among second-year players for total double-doubles.
- The second-year pro has a Laker-best 138 rebounds and is 1st among sophomore players in total rebounds.
- Overall, Randle has led the team in rebounding 13 times and in scoring three times.
 - He has seven 10+ rebound games this season.

CLARKSON DOUBLES UP

Jordan Clarkson had a career-high 10 rebounds en route to his third career double-double (22 points) 11/29 vs. IND.

- Clarkson also chipped in a team-high six assists.
- It was Clarkson's second 20/10 game, also having a 26-point and 11-assist performance 3/30/15 at PHI.

SEASON-BESTS VS. INDY

The Lakers registered multiple season-bests 11/29 vs. IND:

- Tied a season-high with 11 three-pointers made.
- Tied a season-high with 15 offensive rebounds.
- Forced Indiana into 16 turnovers – an opponent season-high.
- Season-high for assists in a quarter (nine, 4th).
- Season-low for opponent field goal in a quarter (.235, 4th).
- Season-low opponent assists in a quarter (one, 4th).

NO SECOND CHANCES

Over the past five games, L.A. has allowed just 11.6 second chance points per game (58 total) on 20-50 shooting.

- The Lakers held opponents to consecutive season-lows in second chance points 11/22 vs. POR (nine) and 11/20 vs. TOR (11).
- Most recently, the Lakers limited Indiana to just 11 second chance points on 11/29.

SWAGGY TRIPLES

Nick Young helped lead the charge for the Lakers in the second half 11/29 vs. IND, scoring all 22 of his points on six made three-pointers.

- The 22 points were a season-high for Young.
- Swaggy P has made six or more three-pointers in a game in his career on 10 occasions.
 - The six three-pointers fell one shot of his career mark (done twice).
 - The last time Young sank at least six triples in a game was 12/12/14 at SAS.
- It was the eighth time this season Young led the bench in scoring.

RUSSELL RISING

Over the past **six** games, D'Angelo Russell is averaging **12.5** points per game (**third** on the team in that time), **5.7** rebounds, and **3.3** assists while making **1.33** three-pointers in **31:06** minutes per game.

- Russell has hit multiple three-pointers in **eight** games this season.
- Had a **career-best** nine rebounds and **tied a career mark** with six assists 11/22 vs. POR.

EAST MEETS WEST

The Lakers are **2-5** against the Eastern Conference this season, with six straight games between 11/29 and 12/7 against Eastern Conference teams.

- Last season, the Lakers went 12-18 against the East, including wins over five playoff teams (Atlanta, Boston, Chicago, Milwaukee, and Toronto).

JC FROM THREE

Jordan Clarkson is shooting **43.1%** on **25-58** from the field from three-point range this season.

- Clarkson has hit 20+ points **five** times this season, including **one** 30+ point outing.
- In his career, Clarkson has **16** outings of 20+ points and **two** 30+ point games in the **53** games he has started.
- He tied a career-high and became Los Angeles' first 30-point scorer this season with 30 points 11/3 vs. DEN and also tied a career-high with 12 made field goals (fourth time).

HIBBERT'S HOUSE

Roy Hibbert is **8th** in the NBA with **2.13** blocks per game, including tallying a season-high five rejections 10/30 at SAC.

- The big man has recorded two or more blocks in **12** of **16** contests this season.
- Hibbert has led the Lakers in blocks in **13** games (**five** ties) this season.
- He currently stands **12th** among active players with **1,022** career blocks.
- The 8th-year pro recorded his 1,000th career block 11/3 vs. DEN.

FINE FROM THE LINE

Los Angeles is shooting **78.4%** from the free throw line this season, **9th-best in the NBA**, compared to 74.1% last season.

- Nick Young (**16-18**) is leading the team in free throw percentage this season.
 - Last season, Young finished 7th in the NBA in free-throw percentage, shooting a career-best 89.2% (132-148) from the charity stripe.
- The Lakers shot 91.4% (32-35) from the free throw line 10/28 vs. MIN, with impressive individual performances by Roy Hibbert (10-10), Lou Williams (7-7), and Kobe Bryant (5-5).

WORLD LEADER

Metta World Peace ranks **4th** among active players (trailing only K. Bryant, K. Garnett, and P. Pierce) in career steals with **1,700** and 21st in NBA history:

TRAIL TURNS

The Lakers had a **season-high** 12 steals against the Trail Blazers 11/28 at POR, led by Jordan Clarkson (four) and Julius Randle (three).

- L.A. committed just nine turnovers, tying the team **season-low** set 11/8 at NYK.

FREE WILL

Lou Williams set a career-high with 16 free throws made 11/3 vs. DEN on 19 attempts.

- His **81** attempts are a team-high.

CAN'T HANDLE RANDLE

Julius Randle had the best performance of his young career 11/1 vs. DAL, scoring 22 points with 15 rebounds, four assists, and four steals, all of which were team-highs.

- The 20/15 performance came in Randle's fourth career game, joining a small list of players in the last 20+ years to do so [chart at right]:
- Randle became the first player in the NBA to record at least 22p/15r/4a/4s since Kevin Love did so 12/15/14.
 - Only six players in the NBA have achieved such numbers in the past five seasons in a single game.
 - Randle is the **youngest** player in the NBA to do so since Anthony Randolph on 4/13/09, who is the **ONLY** player younger than Randle to do so since at least the 1985-86 season.
 - The only *Lakers* to achieve such plateaus since 1985-86 are Lamar Odom on 3/25/07 and Vlade Divac on 2/24/95.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

Of the 15 players on the roster, seven are either rookies (four players) or have just one year of NBA experience (three), including Julius Randle who played just one game last season.

NBA ROOKIE SURVEY

Results from the annual NBA Rookie Survey conducted this summer, where 36 rookies voted on honors for their fellow first-year players:

- D'Angelo Russell was the top vote-getter at 40.0% in the 'best playmaker' category. Russell also finished tied for 4th in 'Rookie of the Year' voting and was one of 12 players to receive a vote for rookie that will have the 'best career.' Fellow rookies also thought Russell was the third-funniest member of the rookie class.
- Anthony Brown finished 4th in the 'best shooter' category, and received a vote for both rookie who was the 'biggest steal' at where he was selected and 'best defender.'
- Kobe Bryant was the second-favorite player amongst rookies for a second consecutive year, finishing 3.0% behind Kevin Durant for top honors.

GM SURVEY

The Lakers were tabbed in a number of categories in the annual survey of the league's 30 general managers:

TEAM

- The Lakers were one of five teams to receive a vote for 'best offseason moves.'
- L.A. also received a vote for team that will be 'most improved' in 2015-16.

INDIVIDUAL

- Roy Hibbert received a vote for both 'most underrated acquisition' and 'best interior defender.'
- D'Angelo Russell was one of five players to receive a '2015-16 Rookie of the Year' vote and tied for second in 'rookie that will be the best player in five years.'
- Lou Williams received a vote for 'bench player who makes the biggest impact when he enters the game' and 'best role player.'
- Kobe Bryant tied for third in the 'toughest player in the NBA' category.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

Opening night NBA rosters featured 100 international players from 37 countries and territories, including Marcelo Huertas (Brazil) and Robert Sacre (Canada) of the Lakers.

2014-15 SEASON NOTES

ROOKIE OF THE MONTH

Last season, Jordan Clarkson was named Kia NBA Western Conference Rookie of the Month for games played in March, becoming the first-ever Laker to be honored with the award (first presented in 1981-82).

LOW TURNOVER

Los Angeles ranked 5th in the NBA in turnovers per game in 2014-15, averaging just 13.2 miscues per contest.

- 16 of 21 wins last season came when turning the ball over fewer or equal times compared to the opposition.
- The Lakers turned the ball over a season-low four times 12/25 at Chicago, besting the previous low of five (12/9 vs. SAC).
 - The four turnovers were also the second fewest in a game in the NBA last year.

INJURY BUG

The injury bug bit the Lakers yet again in 2014-15, with 14 players missing time due to injury/illness, and seven players missing extended time (15+ games):

- **Kobe Bryant** tore his right rotator cuff 1/21 at NOP and had season-ending surgery to repair it 1/28.
- Rookie **Julius Randle** suffered a fractured tibia in his right leg in the season opener 10/28 vs. HOU, sidelining the 19-year-old for the season.
- Los Angeles lost an **NBA-high 319 games due to injury in 2013-14**. In all, 12 players missed time due to injury.
 - As a result, the Lakers used an **NBA-high 35 different starting lineups**.

- 4/7 at LAC, the rookie recorded team-highs with 20 points and six assists to go with four rebounds.
- He recorded 10 20+ point games.
- Over his last 12 games, Clarkson hit for 20+ points seven times, including one 30+ point outing.
