QUICK HITS:

- Head Coach Erik Spoelstra recorded his 200th career home win on 10/28 vs. CHA and has now posted a 207-82 (.716) career record at home since taking over the reins during the 2008-09 season.
- The HEAT's roster has recorded 29 total All-Star appearances (Wade-11, Bosh-10, Stoudemire-6 & Deng-2), tying for the most All-Star appearances in the NBA with the San Antonio Spurs which also has 29 (Duncan-15, Parker-6, Aldridge-4, Ginobili-2 & West-2).
- The HEAT has held opponents to just 31.3 percent (105-of-335) from three-point range so far this season and under 40 percent from the field in five of the last seven contests.
- Miami has blocked 120 shots this season, the most through 15 games in team history, surpassing the previous record of 109 (2004-05).
- Justise Winslow has recorded a team-high +100 this season.

72: Hassan Whiteside has blocked 72 shots so far this season, more than 10 NBA teams (IND-66, SAC-65, BKN-64, CLE-62, MEM-62, PHO-60, TOR-60, DAL-59, WAS-54 and DET-51). Hassan has now recorded at least one block in a career-best 20 consecutive games, the longest streak by a HEAT player since Jermaine O'Neal's 21-game streak from 2/18/09 – 3/30/09. Additionally, he has blocked multiple shots in 17-straight games, the third-longest such streak in franchise history and has now recorded at least three blocks in 12 consecutive games, tying the second-longest streak in team history. DEFENSIVE START: The HEAT has recorded at least five blocks in each of their first 15 games to start this season, the longest such streak to start a season in franchise history. Additionally, the 15-game five-block streak ties the longest such streak overall in team history. They previously achieved a 15-game five-block streak from 3/28/99 – 4/22/98. Below are the most consecutive games with at least five blocks to start a season in HEAT history.

BLOCK PARTY: Hassan Whiteside has blocked a team-leading 72 shots through 15 games this season, the most blocks through the first 15 games of a season in HEAT history. Additionally, he blocked at least four shots in five-straight games from 11/12 – 11/23, becoming the first HEAT player to do that since Alonzo Mourning blocked at least four shots in eight consecutive games from 12/22/99 – 1/8/00. Below are the most blocks through 15 and 16 games in team history.

MOVIN ON UP: Dwyane Wade has scored 19,052 career points, ranking 49th on the NBA's all-time scoring list, and 129 points short from tying Hall of Famer Gail Goodrich for 48th place. Below is where Wade ranks on the NBA's all-time scoring list.

NOVEMBER: The HEAT play 10 home games during the month of November, tying for the most home games during the month of November in franchise history with both the 2009-10 and 2010-11 seasons. Additionally Miami will play 14 total games during November, just two shy from tying the franchise record for games played in the month of November. The HEAT played 16 games in November during the 1989-90, 1996-97 and 2004-05 seasons.

SELLING OUT: Miami sold out every home game last regular season and has now sold out 207 consecutive regular season home games, and 256-straight including the playoffs. The 207-game regular season sellout streak is the longest in franchise history and the 256-straight overall sellout streak is also the longest in team history. Below are the longest home sellout streaks in franchise history.

GUARDING THE RIM: Dwyane Wade has totaled 726 career blocks, the fifth-most by a guard in league history. Only Michael Jordan (893), Tracy McGrady (807), Vince Carter (760) and Ron Harper (729) have more. Additionally, Wade recorded his 676th block vs. CHA on 12/11/13, surpassing Dennis Johnson (675) for the most blocks by a guard 6'4" or shorter in NBA history. By comparison, Johnson recorded his 675th block in 1,100 career games as Wade recorded his 676th block in 679 games, 421 fewer games than Johnson.

FROM DOWNTOWN: The HEAT has currently hit at least one three-point field goal in 288 consecutive games, the third-longest streak in franchise history. Below are the top such streaks in team history.

TRIPLE-DOUBLE: Hassan Whiteside posted a 22-point, 14-rebound, 10-block triple-double on 11/17 vs. MIN. He recorded the triple-double through just three quarters (17pts, 13rebs, 10blks), and according to Elias, he became the first player to record a triple-double with blocks through three quarters since Marcus Camby (13 pts, 11 rebs, 10 blks) on 4/19/98. It also marks his second career triple-double after posting 14 points, 13 rebounds and 12 blocks on 1/25/15 at CHI, becoming the only active player in the NBA to record at least two career triple-doubles including blocks.

NO FLY ZONE: The HEAT blocked 11 shots vs. UTA on 11/12 and then 12 shots vs. MIN on 11/17, marking just the fifth time in franchise history Miami has recorded double-figure blocks in consecutive games. They previously accomplished the feat on 2/13/98 (10 blks vs. DET) & then 2/15/98 (10 blks at TOR), 1/9/98 (12 blks at DEN) & then 1/11/98 (12 blks at VAN), 2/15/97 (10 blks vs. PHI) & then 2/18/97 (10 blks at PHI) and 11/6/90 (13 blks vs. MIL) & then 11/8/90 (12 blks at NJ). Miami has never recorded double-figure blocks in three consecutive games.

TEAM EFFORT: The HEAT starters have each recorded at least one block in two separate games this season, first on 10/28 vs. CHA and then again on 11/3 vs. ATL. The two games already tie the most for a single season in franchise history. Miami previously had each starter block a shot in two games during the 2011-12, 2004-05, 1993-94 and 1989-90 seasons, but has never accomplished the feat in three games during a single-season. The HEAT starters have now all blocked at least one shot in 15 games in team history.

DYNAMIC DUO: HEAT teammates Udonis Haslem and Dwyane Wade are the longest tenured pair of teammates to have made their NBA debut together during the same season in NBA history. Both made their NBA debut during the 2003-04 season and now enter their 13th consecutive season together as they have accumulated three NBA Championships, five Eastern Conference titles, seven division titles and 10 playoff appearances. According to Elias, only two other pair of teammates have debuted and remained together for at least 10 years in NBA history, below is each instance.

WHITESIDE: Hassan Whiteside shot 85.2 percent (23-of-27) from the field over two consecutive games from 11/1-11/3, marking the highest shooting percentage by a HEAT player in franchise history with at least 25 attempts over any two-game span. The previous high was done by Alonzo Mourning from 2/21/00-2/23/00 after he shot 84.6 percent (22-of-26). According to Elias, the last player to have shot at least 85.2 percent from the field over a two-game span with at least 25 attempts was Dwight Howard from 3/13/10-3/14/10 after he also shot 85.2 percent (23-of-27). Additionally, Whiteside's 91.7 percent (11-of-12) from the field vs. ATL on 11/3 was the fifth-highest single-game shooting percentage (with at least 10 attempts) in HEAT history. BEYOND THE ARC: Chris Bosh connected on at least one three-point field goal in nine-straight games to start this season, the longest such streak of his career. He previously had two separate streaks of hitting a three-point field goal in five consecutive games to start a season, first during the 2013-14 season and then again to start the 2014-15 season. Additionally, Bosh connected on a three-point field goal in a career-high 11-straight games from 2/9/15 – 11/12/15, surpassing his previous best streak of 10 which he accomplished from 11/16/14 – 12/5/14.

GREEN LIGHT: Gerald Green connected on five three-point field goals vs. CHA on 10/28, setting a new HEAT franchise record for the most made treys in a season opener. Additionally, his 19 points off the bench tied for the second-highest total by a reserve in a season opener in team history, tying Ray Allen's 19-point season opening game on 10/30/12 vs. BOS. Only Willie Burton has scored more off the bench in a season opener after dropping in 25 points vs. WAS on 11/2/90.



THANKSGIVING CELEBRATION: The Miami HEAT hosted the 24th annual Thanksgiving Celebration on Friday, November 20 at the Miami Rescue Mission. The entire HEAT team, along with coaches and front office personal helped usher in the Thanksgiving holiday with residents of the Greater Miami area. All residents of the area enjoyed a block-party carnival while a select group of 600 underprivileged families received a complete Thanksgiving meal with all of the trimmings, including a frozen turkey, canned goods, side items and beverages.

PLAYER TICKET PROGRAM: One of the most generous and trend-setting programs in the NBA, the Miami HEAT's Community Player Ticket Outreach Program will spend the entire 2015-16 regular season reaching out to children and youth less fortunate who typically would only dream of watching a HEAT game live. HEAT players Chris Bosh, Mario Chalmers, Luol Deng, Goran Dragić, Gerald Green, Udonis Haslem, Josh McRoberts, Dwyane Wade and Justise Winslow along with Head Coach Erik Spoelstra and Alonzo Mourning, Vice President of Player Programs, joined forces to donate tickets for every single home game to local charitable organizations that would otherwise not have the means to attend HEAT games. Each player, based upon availability, graciously provides several private "Meet & Greet" opportunities for the groups prior to each HEAT home game, where the players give inspiring talks to the children, sign autographs and take pictures with the group. The participating organizations also attend a private viewing of the team warm-ups. Over the course of the season, the children, many for the first time, will have the opportunity to enjoy a HEAT game, courtesy of their favorite HEAT players and role models.

ERIK SPOELSTRA (Portland), Head Coach

Regular Season Coaching Record: 361-212, currently in 8th Season

Erik Spoelstra, enters his eighth season as head coach of the HEAT and his 22nd as a member of the organization. He was elevated to his current position on April 28, 2008. Spoelstra has rewarded the faith that HEAT President Pat Riley showed in him by garnering six postseason appearances, four division titles, four conference championships and guiding the franchise to back-to-back NBA titles in 2012 and 2013.

In just seven seasons at the helm, Spoelstra has already made his mark on the HEAT record book. He currently holds the postseason franchise records in victories (63), winning percentage (.636), series won (14) and postseason games coached (99) on Miami's all-time list. In regular season play, he finished this past season ranked first in winning percentage (.627) on Miami's all-time list and second in victories (351) and games coached (558).

Since replacing Riley on the HEAT bench, Spoelstra has seen the expectations for the HEAT change dramatically from the time he was appointed head coach in 2008 until now. Throughout his tenure he has remained a steadying influence for his team and its paid huge dividends in return.

When he first took over the head coaching reins in 2008 he was given the task of improving a young team that had been ravaged by injuries the previous season and had won just 15 games. Two years later, after the summer of 2010 in which Miami re-signed Dwyane Wade and acquired All-Stars LeBron James and Chris Bosh, he found himself coaching a highly-talented, veteran group that was the most scrutinized team in the NBA. Spoelstra and his team have proven they are up for the challenge as he guided them to consecutive NBA Championships, four-straight Conference Championships and four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, becoming just the third franchise in NBA history to make four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, joining the Celtics and Lakers. It also made them just one of 10 franchises in the four major North American sports leagues to make four consecutive trips to the league championship. Individually, Spoelstra became just the fourth head coach in NBA history to lead his team to four-straight Finals appearances joining Red Auerbach, K.C. Jones and Pat Riley.

Spoelstra, who was tied for second place on the NBA's all-time postseason winning percentage list last season, joined a very elite fraternity when he led the HEAT to a seven-game series win over the San Antonio Spurs in the 2013 NBA Finals. Upon capturing the 2013 NBA Championship he became one of just 13 head coaches in NBA history to have won multiple championships and only the eighth to win a championship in consecutive seasons.

The 2012 championship culminated a compressed 2011-12 season in which Miami went 46-20 and captured its second consecutive Southeast Division title. The regular season was highlighted by a nine-game win streak (Feb. 10-Mar. 1) with each victory a double-digit win. During that streak the HEAT became the first team to win road games on three consecutive nights (Feb. 12-14) since December of 1979 and the first to win each of those contests by double-digits since the 1970-71 season. That streak keyed an 11-2 record in February for Miami which saw Spoelstra earn Coach of the Month honors for the third time in his career.

Before taking over the reigns as the sixth head coach in HEAT history, Spoelstra had served Miami in a number of roles in his first 13 years. He was originally hired as video coordinator and over the years was promoted to assistant coach/video coordinator, assistant coach/advance scout and assistant coach/director of scouting before ascending to head coach. He made a name for himself around the league with his game preparation and superb attention to detail. In his seven seasons as the HEAT's assistant coach/director of scouting, he had the primary role of developing game plans for upcoming opponents. To that end, he coordinated the video staff and advance scouts while overseeing the development of scouting reports and videos.

In 1992, he graduated from the University of Portland with a degree in communications. While attending Portland, Spoelstra was the starting point guard for four years and was named the West Coast Conference Freshman of the Year in 1989. Upon graduating he spent two years as a player/coach for Tus Herten, a team in the professional sports league of Germany.

He has returned to his native Philippines in four of the last five offseasons to host clinics and promote education, health and wellness to thousands of at-risk youth through grassroots programs and events. The 9-day program in Manila in the summer of 2011 was the largest NBA FIT event ever hosted in Southeast Asia under the NBA Cares umbrella. In the summer of 2012, Coach Spoelstra expanded his reach into other Southeast Asia nations by conducting coaches clinics and other FIT activities in Singapore.

Raised in Portland, OR, Spoelstra, who was inducted into the Jesuit High School Athletic Hall of Fame in September 2009, is the first Asian/Filipino-American head coach in any of the major North American sports leagues.

Spoelstra is the son of Jon Spoelstra, a long-time NBA executive who has guided the Portland Trail Blazers, Denver Nuggets, Buffalo Braves and New Jersey Nets. His grandfather, Watson, was a Detroit Tigers beat writer for many years.
