- GPA is based on the following scale: $A=4 B=3 C=2 D=1 F=0$
- Advanced and Honors courses are not given additional point values, but are noted by the course title.
- College Preparatory courses: refer to Course Selection Guide on school website.
- Fremont Union High School District policy prohibits the reporting of class rank.
