Head Coach 4th Season at CSU 5th Season Overall

It has not taken long for head coach Steve Weir to put his mark on the Cleveland State men's and women's golf programs. A 2006 graduate of CSU and former standout on the golf team, Weir has led the men's program to a pair of Horizon League Championships and NCAA appearances, while continuing to build the nine-year old women's program into a league contender.

A tireless recruiter, Weir has continually brought in highly-decorated players, including several allstate selections and student-athletes who have competed in and won prestigious tournaments. In his three seasons at the helm, Weir has developed six All-Horizon League players, including Jake Scott who claimed medalist honors at the league championship in 2008 and 2009.

Under Weir, the men's team has enjoyed unprecedented success, capturing the 2008 and 2009 league titles and advancing to the NCAA Central Regional Championship both years. In addition, five players have earned medalist honors under the direction of Weir, while the 2007-08 squad set the school record for lowest round, firing 277 during the first and second rounds at the IPFW Fall Classic.

Weir has also led the women's program to new heights during the last three years, guiding the squad to a second place finish at the league tournament in 2009, the best showing in program history. He has also led the team to the top seven team scores in program history, including a record 315 at the Marshall Invitational in 2008.

But Weir's successes go beyond the golf course as both teams have also been successful in the classroom. That was never more apparent than last



year when the women's team captured the "Best of the Best" Team Award at the John Konstantinos Athletic Academic Honors Luncheon in April. The award, presented to the sport having the highest team grade point average in the athletics department, went to women's golf which boasted a 3.71 team GPA with all six student-athletes having at least a 3.20.

Weir joined the CSU golf staff as an assistant coach in 2007 with a familiarity to the Viking program, having served as an assistant coach to the men's and women's squads in 2006-07. He has also been the Assistant Golf Professional at Pine Hills Golf Club in Hinkley since April, 2007.

He had an outstanding collegiate career, spending time at Kent State and Baldwin-Wallace before enrolling at CSU in September of 2005.

In his lone golf season as a Viking, Weir earned first team All-Horizon League honors in 2006 and was a two-time Horizon League Golfer of the Week.

He was second on the team in stroke average (75.3), carding a school-record, eight-under-par 63 en route to a runner-up finish at the Belmont Intercollegiate. Weir also finished second at the Dayton Spring Invitational, helping the Vikings win the team title by eight shots.

Weir was a large factor in the Vikings claiming the 2006 Horizon League Championship and advancing to the NCAA regionals, shooting rounds of 70-72-74 (216) and finishing 11th overall.

In 2005, Weir captured the Greater Cleveland Amateur Championship and also advanced to the match play portion of the U.S. Amateur Public Links Championship.

At Baldwin-Wallace, Weir holds the best season average in school-history when he posted 75.2 strokes per round in the fall of 2003, including a low round of 70.

Weir and his wife of four years, Alicia, reside in Berea.

4th Season at CSU

Nathan Miklos is in his fourth season as an assistant coach for the Cleveland State men's and women's golf teams.

A native of Hermitage, Pa., Miklos joined the staff after serving as an assistant golf coach at Shawnee High School in Lima, Ohio from 2005-07. He also served as the Assistant Golf Professional at Shawnee Country Club from 2006-07.

Miklos is no stranger to the Horizon League circut as he was the head women's coach at Loyola from 2003-05. During that time, Miklos led the squad to the 2004 Horizon League Championship and was named the co-coach of the year.

The 2005 Rambler squad was recognized by the National Golf Coaches Association for having one of the top-25 grade point averages in college golf with one student-athlete earning a spot on the Division I All-American Scholar Team in 2005.

Miklos also had a one-year stint (2002-03) as the assistant men's and women's golf coach at his alma mater, Grove City College. He helped lead the women's team to the conference championship as the team set a new conference scoring record (587), as two players placed in the top-five.

As a player at Grove City, Miklos led the Wolverines to a pair of conference championships and was named the conference MVP in 2001. A two-time team captain, Miklos earned first team all-conference accolades for three seasons and second team honors once.

Miklos graduated from Grove City in 2002 with a Bachelor's of Art and also earned his Master's of Sport Science in 2005 from the United States Sports Academy in Daphne, Ala.

## 2010-11 Women's Season Preview

There are many coaches who would break into a cold sweat after losing 60 percent of their starting lineup, including a pair of seniors who helped establish the program over the last four years.

However, Cleveland State head women's golf coach Steve Weir is looking at the 2010-11 season as a chance to get a glimpse into the future as the roster features two sophomores and four freshman.

"There is no denying that we will have one of the youngest teams in the league and maybe the entire country this year," Weir said. "We are going to be asking a lot of our freshman to step right into the lineup and contribute immediately. Our goal is to get them settled in and adjusted to the college lifestyle and make sure that goes smoothly.

"We'll take our lumps from time to time with such a young team, but that will only make us better in the long run. We have to continue to work hard, stay mentally tough and continue to improve."

For the first time in his four seasons at the helm, Weir will not have the luxury of plugging Katie Broere or Laren Beese into the lineup. Broere graduated as the all-time leader in scoring average in school history (81.9), while Beese left the program ranked fourth all-time in scoring average at 85.9.

"There is no question that losing both Katie and Laren leaves a big hole in our lineup, but I think we are at the point where the program is becoming established," Weir said. "Each year, we are bringing in players who are capable of stepping right into the lineup and replace the seniors."

Only two players, sophomores Ariel Sparrow and Lisa Barber, return from last year's squad that placed fifth at the Horizon League Championship.

Sparrow became the first player in school history to earn Horizon League Newcomer of the Year honors last spring when she finished third on the team with an 84.5 scoring average.

She played in all 11 events, carding a careerbest 54 hole total of 249 to tie for 16th place at the Horizon League Championship. In her first career collegiate event, Sparrow was CSU's top finisher at the Appalachian State Invitational, firing a careerbest 76 in the final round.

"Ariel's best days are ahead of her," Weir said.
"She has so much potential and I expect her to solidify the top of our lineup and to show continued improvement throughout the course of the season."

Barber, the other returner from last season, finished fourth on the team in scoring average last season at 87.3, playing in all 11 events. She fired a career-best 80 in the second round of the Richmond Invitational when she finished as CSU's second golfer.

"Lisa was able to get some playing experience at the college level last year and make a contribution right away," Weir said. "She is a very steady player and knows how to manage a round."

Four freshmen - Steff Camarata, Michaela Cronin, Shelly Ford and Madeline Kaminski - round out the roster and will be asked to contribute from the minute they arrive on campus.

"This is one of the deepest and most talented freshman classes we have ever had," Weir said. "The goal of this class was to improve the depth and versatility in our lineup and I think we were able to accomplish that. All four players are highly accomplished high school players and are capable of putting up low numbers."

Camarata was a standout at Perry H.S., helping the squad to four league titles and four consecutive top-12 finishes at the state tournament, including a third place showing her freshman year.

The Stark County

Player of the Year as a junior and the league player of the year her final two seasons, Camarata was a four-time state tournament participant. She posted a 39.9 scoring average as a senior.

"Steff is a very steady player and has a good all-around game," Weir said. "She hits the ball a long way and I think she has all the makings to be a very good player at this level."

Cronin and Kaminski are extremely familiar with each other, having prepped together at Chaminade-Julienne H.S. in Dayton. The duo helped lead the squad to a sixth place showing at the state tournament their senior years.

Cronin was a three-time first team all-league selection and finished as the runner-up at the league tournament her junior year. She earned medalist honors in 13 of the 31 events she played in during her final two seasons and holds the school record for lowest round in school history (34).

Kaminski was a three-time district qualifier and holds the school record for lowest round with a 76.

"It's nice to have Michaela and Madeline join the program together," Weir said. "They played together in high school and entering the program at the same time will help them make a smooth transition to college."

Ford rounds out the newcomers after leading Jefferson Area H.S. to league titles in each of her first three seasons. A first team all-league pick after her first three campaigns, she was the first girl's golfer from Ashtabula County to earn a berth at the Ohio State golf tournament when she qualified as a junior and again as a senior.

She posted a 39.0 scoring average as both a junior and senior and was tabbed as the *Star Beacon* Ashtabula County Girls Player of the Year as a senior.

"Shelly had a lot of success in high school and I expect that will translate well to the college game," Weir said. "Her swing is always under control and she has a nice short game around the green that helps save strokes."

Weir knows that this year's team will face some ups and downs with such a young squad. However, he is confident that the youthful squad will make a smooth transition to the collegiate game.

"The key to our season will be how quickly our youngsters, especially the freshman, adjust to the college game," Weir said. "They each have had success at the high school level and have experience on top level and state golf courses. The challenges will be there to perform consistently, but if we can maintain our mental toughness and continue to improve, the rest will fall into place."

## 2010-11 Men's Season Preview

What's in the past has passed and head coach Steve Weir doesn't plan to revisit the topsy-turvy 2009-10 season.

After winning back-to-back Horizon League Championships and playing in the NCAA tournament, the Vikings were expected to be in the hunt for a three-peat. However, injuries and unforeseen circumstances took their toll on the Vikings as they finished sixth at the league championship.


"Last year was a season that I hope we never have to go through again," Weir said. "It started at the very first tournament when Pat (Elber) got injured and things just kind of spiraled from there.

"Everything we endured last season will make us a much stronger team. I don't think we are far from regaining our form and making a run at recapturing the league title. This is one of the deepest and most talented teams that I have had at Cleveland State. We have a talented group of upperclassmen and a hungry group of underclassmen who want to come in and make an impact."

At the top of the lineup this season will be seniors Patrick Elber and Kent Monas, both of whom missed time last season. Elber injured his wrist during CSU's first event last fall and missed the entire season, while Monas did not play in the spring due to personal reasons.

"Not having Pat and Kent in the lineup last year really left a big void for us," Weir said. "They have been consistent golfers throughout their careers and were expected to stabalize the top of our lineup. I think we lost a lot without them and I expect them to have strong seasons."

Elber has played near the top of the lineup during his entire career, while his 76.3 career scoring average ranks seventh in school history. He has played in 103 career rounds and was the Vikings top

finisher at the 2008 NCAA Regional Championship.

Monas, who has played as CSU's No. 1 or No. 2 golfer in each of his first three years, is slated to return near the top of the lineup after missing the spring season.

He finished second on the team in scoring average (75.1) during the five fall events he played, including a season-low round of 69 at the John Piper Invitational en route to a seventh place finish.

One of the best ball strikers on the squad, Monas has been the model of consistency during his time at CSU as his 75.0 career scoring average ranks second in school history.

"Having Kent back in the lineup is going to be huge for us," Weir said. "He knows his strengths and weaknesses and if he could get a little more confidence with his putter, he has the opportunity to put up some very low scores."

Senior Kellen Erdman and junior James Boxley will add depth and experience in the middle and bottom part of the order. With the injuries last season, both were able to play consistently and show what they are capable of doing.

Erdman played in nine events, including the final eight, posting an 80.0 scoring average. The left-handed Boxley is one of the longest hitters on the team and continued to show improvement as the season went on last year. He finished a careerbest tied for fourth place at the Ball State Invitational with a career-low 54 hole total of 220, including a career-low round of 71 in the second round.

"Kellen and James will be fighting for spots in the lineup," Weir said. "They will need to work diligently on their games and continue to show improvement and push to secure one of the top five spots."

Sophomore Michael Klaric headlines that class that also includes Alex Michalowski and Jon Riemer.

Klaric finished with the team's third best scoring average last season at 76.4 and was the team's top finisher in three events, including a tie for sixth place at the Horizon League Championship where he earned a spot on the all-tournament team.

Klaric, who led the team with six rounds of par or better, fired a career-low 70 in the final round of the league championship when he played all three rounds as CSU's final golfer out.

"Michael matured as last season went on and has the potential to grow even more as a player," Weir said. "He was kind of thrown into the fire as a freshman, but responded really well and that should carry over to this season."

Michalowski was able to adjust to the collegiate game last season by playing in eight events and averaging 80.0 as a freshman.

Riemer, who joined the team as a walk-on, was slated to redshirt, but injuries forced him into the lineup as he played in the final eight events of the season. He finished with a 79.4 scoring average.

"It was good for Alex and Jon to get some expe-

rience last season," Weir said. "If they continue to work hard and push the other guys, they can no doubt challenge for a spot in the lineup."

Freshmen Andrew Bailey and Brendan Byrne round out the roster with both newcomers having the talent and ability to immediately crack the lineup.

Bailey arrives at CSU after earning three letters while playing at St. Ignatius H.S., one of the most accomplished programs in the state. A first team all-district selection his final two seasons, Bailey helped the team to third place finishes at the state tournament his final two years as the No. 2 golfer.

Over the summer, Bailey captured the prestigous Northern Ohio Junior PGA Championship, qualifying for the 35th Junior PGA Championship which was played in early August.

Byrne continues the strong tradition of golfers from Strongsville H.S. to join the Viking program, following the likes of former Horizon League Player of the Year Jake Scott and Kyle Cobb, a first team All-Horizon League selection last year.

A first team Northeast Ohio Golf Coaches Association selection as a junior and senior, Byrne led the squad to the league title as a senior. He was named the Team MVP his final three seasons while also setting the school record for lowest average in a season (36.6) as a sophomore.

Senior Drew Davidson, a transfer from Akron, rounds out the roster and will fight for a spot in the lineup. He played 33 rounds as a freshman, averaging 75.3, but played sparingly the next two years.

"Drew didn't get the opportunity to play much over the last two seasons, but I think he has the ability to come in and help us out," Weir said. "The biggest thing will be getting his confidence back because he can play this game."



Entering its 32nd season of operation in the 2010-11 academic year, the Horizon League continues to aspire toward its goal of being one of the nation's leading athletics conferences while being recognized as a leader in the development of student-athletes as leaders and role models.

The Horizon League membership features ten public and private institutions that have impressive academic reputations and a storied tradition of broad-based athletic programs. Current membership includes Butler University, Cleveland State University, the University of Detroit Mercy, the University of Illinois at Chicago, Loyola University Chicago, Valparaiso University, the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Wright State University and Youngstown State University.

The Horizon League's primary focus is on adding value to the educational experience through its four platforms: athletic performance, academic achievement, community outreach, and personal responsibility and accountability. It is the League's belief that athletics is a powerful and visible resource tool that can be used to enhance student-athletes' collegiate experience. The Horizon League's goals are to enhance the holistic university experience for the student-athlete, to create an affiliation of institutions with similar athletic goals, and to adhere to the principals of integrity, diversity, excellence and growth.

The Horizon League sponsors competition in 19 sports - nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and tennis) and ten for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis and volleyball).

The League receives automatic bids to NCAA championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, women's volleyball, and for the first time in League history, women's golf. The Horizon League is head-quartered in Indianapolis, the "Amateur Sports Capital of

the World," with offices in the Pan American Plaza (201 S. Capitol Avenue), located a block from Lucas Oil Stadium and just minutes from Conseco Fieldhouse, the State Capitol Building, Victory Field (home of the Indianapolis Indians) and the NCAA national office.

#### A PROUD HISTORY

Founded on June 16, 1979, as the Midwestern City Conference with six charter members, the League changed its name to the Midwestern Collegiate Conference in 1985 and added women's sports for the 1986-87 academic year. Charter members of the conference included current members Butler and Loyola as well as the University of Evansville, Oklahoma City University, Oral Roberts University and Xavier University.

Among other current members, Detroit joined in 1980, and Cleveland State, UIC, Green Bay, Milwaukee and Wright State came aboard in 1994 (along with Northern Illinois University) in the largest non-merger conference expansion in history. Youngstown State joining in 2001 and Valparaiso in 2007.

On June 4, 2001, the Horizon League unveiled its current name and ushered in a new dynamic direction that has brought the League closer to its stated goal of being one of the nation's top ten collegiate athletic conferences with a focus on enhancing the student-athletes' experience by upgrading the League's market and competitive positions.

#### ATHLETIC SUCCESS

In the past few years, the Horizon League has enjoyed unprecedented success on the national stage, highlighted by Butler's 2010 NCAA men's basketball championship game appearance where the Bulldogs fell to Duke, 61-59. The Horizon League has compiled a 10-7 record in the past five years in the NCAA tournament, ranking sixth among all collegiate conferences for winning percentage.

Green Bay's women's basketball team became the league's first at-large bid to the NCAA Championship in 2010 with Cleveland State receiving the automatic nod. The Phoenix knocked off No. 5 seed Virginia in the first round before falling to Elite Eight participant lowa State, 60-56.

Men's soccer has tasted victory in seven out of the last eight years (Milwaukee 2002-05, UIC 2006-08), with UIC just one win away from the College Cup in 2007. In softball, League teams won a game in the national tournament four straight years earlier in the decade (UIC 2002, 2004; Wright State 2003; Green Bay 2005) while advancing into the second round in women's soccer three of the last six seasons (Detroit 2004, Milwaukee 2005-06).

Butler's Victoria Mitchell became the League's first NCAA individual champion when she won the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

#### ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Horizon League student-athletes also excel in the classroom as more than 500 have been named to the Academic Honor Roll each of the past seven semesters for carrying a grade-point average of 3.2 or better, including more than 600 for the last four semesters. Twenty-seven student-athletes were named to ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District teams in 2009-10, while 10 earned Academic All-America honors.

#### **COMMUNITY SERVICE**

In addition to its athletics success, the Horizon League has secured a well-earned reputation for its community service initiatives. Each January, member institutions partner with local elementary schools for an art, music and

essay contest highlighting the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. with winners recognized at League games on the weekend of MLK Day.

The Horizon League Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) also has continued a tradition of working with youth in Indianapolis during its annual summer meeting. In addition, several League men's basketball coaches coached barefoot to support Samaritan's Feet, and the League's schools and fans donate to Komen for the Cure for breast cancer awareness during its annual women's basketball championship.

On campus, student-athletes have raised money and awareness for such causes as breast cancer, diabetes and hurricane relief, while hosting blood drives, neighborhood clean-ups, Big Brother/Big Sister programs and more.

#### **SPORTSMANSHIP**

One of the Horizon League's points of emphasis is fostering collegial environments for competition among student-athletes, coaches, administrators and fans in a pro-active approach. Among the vehicles is the Ethical Conduct Pledge, which is signed each season by student-athletes, coaches, officials, and campus and League administrators. Its purpose is to make all the involved groups aware of the Horizon League expectations of behavior during conference events.

#### DEMOGRAPHICS

Horizon League institutions boast a combined enrollment of more than 130,000 plus nearly a quarter-million living alumni centered in the League's Midwest footprint. League media markets include five of the nation's top 35 in Chicago, Detroit, Cleveland, Indianapolis and Milwaukee, covering more than ten million television households and encompassing more than nine percent of the nation's television audience.

#### **GOVERNANCE**

The Horizon League is governed by a Board of Directors comprised of the ten member institutions' chief executive officers. Dr. Bobby Fong, President of Butler, serves as Board Chair through June 30, 2011. Barry Collier, Director of Intercollegiate Athletics at Butler, serves as chair of the Executive Council, and Elaine Jacobs, Associate Athletic Director/Senior Woman Administrator at Youngstown State, is the Vice Chair and Joseph Kirsch of Butler serves as chair of the Faculty Athletics Representatives.

#### LEADERSHIP

Jonathan B. (Jon) LeCrone is in his 19th year as Commissioner of the Horizon League, having been named to the position on May 11, 1992, and is the fifth-longest tenured commissioner among the 31 Division I conferences. He is the fifth commissioner in League history, succeeding Daniel B. "Tucker" DiEdwardo (1989-92), James W. Shaffer (1984-89), Cecil N. Coleman (1980-84) and James J. McCafferty (1979-80).

LeCrone is in the second year of a four-year term on the NCAA Division I Leadership Council after completing a five-year term on the Division I Men's Basketball Committee.

#### VISIBILITY

The Horizon League has enhanced its media visibility with a number of initiatives. The League is in a three-year agreement with ESPN that includes selected regular-season men's basketball action (ESPN2) and the men's championship game (ESPN) and features increased exposures each year on ESPNU plus inclusion in the annual O'Reilly ESPNU BracketBusters, one of college basketball's premier in-season events

## The John Telich Sr. Golf Technology Center

"TECHNOLOGY AND TECHNIQUE FOR A BETTER GAME"



On Feb. 12, 2004 Cleveland State officially dedicated the John Telich Sr. Golf Technology Center. Housed in the Physical Education Building, the facility provides CSU's men's and women's teams a first class facility in which to train year-round, giving them an advantage over much of their competition.

First-year head coach Brian Varsey noted how fortunate he was to inherit such a first-class facility.

"We are grateful for the generosity of Mr. Telich in providing for a unique complete environment for our student athletes to learn and grow. As a team and an athletic department we are proud it has his name and embodies his continued commitment to Cleveland State University golf. We wouldn't be where we are today without him."

The Tech Center provides a year round home for the Viking golf program. It contains a three-station, full swing practice area as well as a recently-completed five hundred-square foot contoured putting surface. The tech center also includes a sophisticated video monitoring system and an equipment storage area. A sepa-

rate lounge area with couches and a television completes the tech center, offering relaxation space for the golfers to unwind after a hard days' work.



The tech center is divided into two rooms, with one providing a three-station hitting net and an equipment storage area. The other room contains a 500-square foot putting green and a player lounge.





## Canterbury G.C. · Beachwood, Ohio

Canterbury Golf Club, home to one of the most acclaimed courses in the United States, was designed by Herbert Strong and opened for play in 1921.

Located approximately 10 miles southeast of Cleveland in Beachwood, Ohio, Canterbury Golf Club is recognized by Golf Digest as one of the top 100 courses in America.

Incorporated on Feb. 2, 1921, the founders selected a 146-acre site, in what then was a relatively undeveloped portion of Shaker Heights and Beachwood. The site was chosen because of its high elevation, rolling hills, flowing brooks and lush wooded areas.

Work on the new Canterbury course quickly began, with the first nine holes opening July 1, 1922. The second nine holes were added soon after.

Since that time, Canterbury has attained a national reputation for a course that can tax the

skills of the greatest professionals, yet can be played by both men and women golfers for fun and relaxation. The club has hosted 13 major tournaments and championships, including the 2009 Senior PGA Championship and the 1973 PGA Championship.

Because of the many par fours, the front nine is a very good test of skill. Players shooting one or two under par will have a decent chance of posting a solid score for the round. The back nine concludes with three difficult finishing holes, which many consider to be as good as any three finishing holes in all of golf.

The 616-yard, par-5 16th hole at Canterbury begins what many consider to be as good as any three finishing holes in golf.
