

Property Description

Only a few sparse remains of part of the outer seaward facing wall of the battery blockhouse survive. Imprint of rockhewn footprint and foundations of battery can be traced along the face of the surrounding rocky foreshore, including a partly rock-hewn ditch in the early stage of construction, making this a unique feature of a Hospitalller fortress building exercise. A WWII emplacement for some sort of unidentifed equipment ( possible a small field gun) appears to have been placed on the remains of the blockhouse mound. This consists of a semi-circular stone arc and a metal pivot.
