Celebrating our top performers

The PE department launched the School Sports Colours awards in September 2011 to celebrate the success of students who are regular attendees at clubs and are also frequently selected to represent the school in inter-school fixtures and tournaments.

Extra-curricular points can be collected for attending extra-curricular clubs (1 point per club night attended), school fixtures (2 points per fixture participated in), assisting in the organisation of primary school festivals (1 point per evening) and also helping to officiate at school fixtures (2 points per fixture officiated). Additional points have been awarded through being nominated for "Players' Player of the Match" and "Coach's Player of the Match" at school fixtures. Each one of these awards will lead to an additional 3 points being awarded.

The 'Bronze' award is achieved after obtaining 75 points, 'Silver' after 125 points and the 'Gold' at 250 points.

Students who are awarded one of the three awards (Bronze, Silver or Gold) are truly our top performers who are committed to clubs and school teams throughout their whole time at Oakgrove School.

The following students have recently achieved their 'Bronze' awards; Nathan Mambeko, Danielle Kinton, Daniel Summers, Joseph Dyson, Reece Akano-Turner, Dave Kyere, Rhiannon Milner-Thomas, Caprice Cahill, Rachel Harris, Andrew Fletcher, Salem Jule, Alice French, Alice Piggott, Ciara Price and Poppy Gibbs.

In the two years in which the award system has run, there have been two students, Amitesh Nagarkar and Sam Carter, who have excelled and gone on to achieve their 'Silver' awards.



Sports Points Totals

Here is an overview of the total number of points which have been accumulated by our top scoring students. At the end of each academic year, the points which have been accumulated roll over to the following year.

As you can see from the table, Amitesh and Sam's total are quite remarkable, considering the awards were launched just two years ago. Since Oakgrove opened in 2005, there have been many students who have joined and left. In our first year of opening we were lucky enough to have two very gifted footballers in the same year group. Since leaving Oakgrove, both have gone on to secure professional contracts as well as international honours.



Jefferey Schlupp

Professional Footballer

Leicester City, Germany Under 19's & Ghana (Seniors)

Upon starting Oakgrove School, Jeffrey was already signed to Leicester City's academy and his allround sporting ability was clear to see immediately. His first senior contract was earned in the 2010-2011 season when he was signed by then manager Paulo Sousa. Shortly afterwards came his first international cap when he was called up to the Germany U19 squad. Here is a brief outline of Jeffrey's club career so far:

Jeffrey was loaned out to Brentford in the latter stage of the 2010-2011 season. He made his senior debut in a 1–0 defeat to Huddersfield Town coming on as a substitute. On his first full senior appearance in his career he scored two goals winning the match against Carlisle United 2–1. Jeffrey earned a start in Brentford's next match and scored a header to earn himself a starting place in the 2011 Football League Trophy Final. His first game at Wembley ended in a 1-0 loss against Carlisle United. However, he did hit the post which could have changed the outcome of the game.

The 2011–12 season saw Jeffrey return to Leicester City to be managed by once England supremo Sven Goran-Eriksson. In his first appearance for the club that season he scored a hat-trick against Rotherham United in the League Cup first round, the first Leicester City player to do so since 1945.

More international honours came in November 2011, when he was called up to the senior Ghana squad and made his debut against Gabon.

Recently, Jeffrey spent a week training with Manchester United. This trial was extended into a second and third week into the beginning of February. During his time at Manchester United he played two Under 21 games, a game against Liverpool and then a game against West Ham United.

Since his return from trial, he has been in a rich vein of form, scoring 3 times in 8 games (against Derby County, Birmingham City & Bolton Wanderers). With his contract up for renewal this summer, we could be looking at the first Premiership player who attended Oakgrove School!





Max Crocrombe Professional Footballer

Oxford United & New Zealand Under 20

Like Jeffrey, when Max started Oakgrove and he was already on the books of the MK Dons and also proved that he was a very strong performer within any activity that he undertook. Throughout his time at Oakgrove, Max was keen to be involved in a range of different extra-curricular activities and represented the school frequently. He was also the school team football captain, where he played as an outfield player.

After spending time in the school's sixth form, Max signed for Buckingham Town in the summer of 2009. He made 33 first team appearances before being spotted by scouts of Oxford United. Despite being a goalkeeper, he scored one goal in his time at Buckingham Town after coming on as an outfield substitute in a 3-1 league defeat.

Max signed professional terms with Oxford United at the end of last season after impressing in the youth team after completing a one year YTS contract. He has recently had a spell as the U's first choice keeper after Ryan Clark had shoulder surgery. He has also played for the U20 New Zealand side recently.

"Kiwi duo add to accolades"

New Zealand's Junior All Whites kept a perfect record at the OFC U-20 Championship in Fiji on the road to securing their passage to the FIFA U20 World Cup Turkey 2013. While the team's perfect record on paper belies the tightness of some of their matches – they defeated New Caledonia and Vanuatu by just a single goal – two players have been recognised for their outstanding contribution to the campaign.

Midfielder Louis Fenton and goalkeeper Max Crocombe were announced as the Golden Ball and Golden Gloves recipients respectively, following the final match of the tournament on Friday evening.

"I'm very happy, but to be honest I'm also a little bit surprised because I wasn't the busiest of goalkeepers and I saw a lot of talent out there. It's my first time playing for New Zealand and it's been brilliant. The lads have been really good since I came in and it's been really easy to settle in too. Representing New Zealand is massive, isn't it? It doesn't really get much bigger than this especially going to the U20 World Cup, the second biggest competition in the world."

Max, along with his teammates, is now looking towards the U20 World Cup which will be held from 21 June to 13 July and says his preparations have already begun.

"I'm going to see the season out for Oxford United and then I've got to see. I've got to try and get as many games as I can and keep fit and these games we've been playing in Fiji are only going to help. It's been a really good experience here; we've been really well taken care of here in Fiji. Everyone has been so nice, it's been a really good stay."

Late on, Taylor Brown beat the Walton defence with a jinking run before selflessly crossing for Kieron Wong to set up Simon Thorpe with an easy finish past the Walton keeper. Special mention has to be made for Josh Webb (Coach's player of the match) who confidently dribbled out of defence on many occasions to give Oakgrove attacking momentum.

Following on from their successful start to the competition, Oakgrove then stepped into the unknown when taking on Hazeley, whom they had never faced, away from home. Oakgrove started the game with real intensity, taking the lead thanks to Kieron Wong's bullet header from a superb back post corner taken by Taylor Brown. Oakgrove X-Country Meetings

September - October 2012

The season began with the three traditional meetings held at Oakgrove and Shenley Brook End in late September and early October. Entries once again came from Oakgrove, Shenley Brook End, Walton High, Hazeley, Thornton College and for the first time Monkston Primary School (who entered some Year 6 students).

These fixtures have been an excellent way in the past to build upon the momentum from the Primary Schools Championships and to potentially unearth some new talent. Last year we were lucky enough to find Emma Mears and Chloe Collett (both of whom now are regular participants for Marshalls Milton Keynes Athletics Club). After completing the Mile Run in a new record time, Livina Daillo (Year 7) certainly stood out immediately. She backed up this initial display by comfortably winning the first two rounds. It was a shame in the end that she left the school in early December before getting the opportunity to compete at one of the larger competitions of the year. Strong performances in all three rounds came from Laura Fuller (7th place overall), Lucy Chambers (9th place overall), Morgan Cooper (10th place overall) and Yasmine Bourne (16th place overall) to lead the Year 7 team into second place overall.

It wasn't only the Year 7 girls who made a strong impression – the Year 7 boys team came from being in second place after the first round, to comfortably winning the team event. The following boys competed in all three rounds; Felix Wallace (2nd place overall), Thomas Stringer (4th place overall), Brynn Davies (5th place overall) and Marcus Lovell (6th place overall).

Emma Mears followed up her successes from the previous year to record two wins and a second place to lead the Year 8 and 9 girls into winning the team competition against a very strong team from Thornton College. There were six girls (Emma Mears 1st place overall, Franciska Lorincz 3rd place overall, Anna Koefoed-Gregory 6th place overall, Chloe Collett 8th place overall, Rachel Harris 10th place overall, Laureece Lambert 25th place overall) competed in all three rounds, all of whom played a key role in securing the team crown.

The Year 8 and 9 boys were up against an extremely talented team of students (two of whom are regular competitors for Marshalls Milton Keynes and Buckinghamshire) from Stantonbury. However, as the team from Stantonbury only competed in two rounds, Oakgrove ended up winning by a slim 8 points! Steffen Down (4th place overall), Daniel Summers (7th place overall), James Mottram (9th place overall), Jiten Patel (10th place overall) and Amitesh Nagarkar (11th place overall) competed in all three events.



Bucks Schools X-Country Championships March 2013

The County Schools championships took place at a very cold and snowy Stowe School in early February and Oakgrove took 20 athletes to compete for a prestigious place in the County Schools team in the upcoming English Schools Championships. Once again the Oakgrove runners raised their game in horrendous conditions and did themselves and the school proud.

The stand out performance came from the Junior Girls team who finished an incredible 2nd place overall. Much of this came down to an excellent run from Sophie Botham who finished 2nd. Sophie was backed up by Emma Mears who came home two places behind in 4th place. Emma was the first Year 8 runner home which is a very positive sign for next year. The scoring four was completed by Chloe Collett in 33rd place and Anna Koefoed-Gregory in 54th place.

MK Schools X-Country Championships March 2013

The Milton Keynes School's Championships was rearranged to take place in March, luckily this time the weather was much warmer! After such strong displays at the County Schools, we were looking forward to a very strong showing and potentially securing some team crowns, but with the English Schools Championships taking place just three days later, both Sophie Botham and Emma Mears were rested for the biggest race of their season.

As usual, our athletes were not shy in taking this opportunity with ten top ten positions across the four races.
