### Warning of roadworks on the A4

Drivers and residents are being warned to brace themselves for disruption next month when there will be lane closures and temporary traffic lights on the A4 through Saltford due to resurfacing works.

Motorists have already had to put up with long delays this month with temporary traffic lights on the A4175 Keynsham Road between Willsbridge and Keynsham because of water main works.

B&NES Council, working in partnership with construction company Skanska, has announced that resurfacing works at Saltford will begin on 22nd February. The lane closures and temporary lights will be in operation between 7am and 7pm and the work is expected to last up to a week.

In a letter to local homes, highway chiefs say that where possible they will try to maintain access for residents to private



frontages but only when it is safe to do so and as site operations allow: "Unfortunately there will be periods when vehicular access will not be possible so please be prepared to make other access arrangements."

Bus operators have also been informed and will be adjusting services where required during the works.

Notices will be positioned along the route to warn drivers of the roadworks and possible disruption to journey times.

# Teenager arrested on suspicion of flashing

Police have now arrested a 16-year-old boy in connection with a series of indecent exposures in the Downend area in December.

The arrest relates to five incidents in total, all happening between 6pm and 10pm.

One was on Tuesday 15th December, two were on Sunday 27th December and two were on Monday 28th December. All were in the Westerleigh Road neighbourhood. The boy has been released on bail, pending further inquiries. A 29-year-old man and a 26-year-old man, both from the local area, had previously been questioned by police about the incidents.



Green bin row resurfaces as council tax is set to rise by almost 4%

Council tax in South Gloucestershire looks set to rise by 3.99% from April and there are more cuts to services on the way as austerity continues.

Budget papers setting out future spending plans were published last Friday but the Conservatives, who won control last May, have come under fire for not including their election promise to reintroduce free green bin collections.

The Tories were against the £36 per annum charge introduced in April 2014 which Liberal Democrats and Labour councillors voted for.

This week Claire Young, the Lib Dems' lead member on the Communities Committee, said the Tories "flagship policy" was nowhere to be seen: "We knew the council wouldn't be able to afford to keep free green bins so made sure the service was financially viable. The Tories had the same information and either didn't understand it or decided to mislead the public.

"Their new budget is without a single mention of garden waste collections. They promised to phase out the charge."

In response, the Conservatives said the charge was put in place at a cost of £650,000 to plug an identified budget gap of only £350,000. Having been left with "no choice", large numbers of residents signed up for it and it raises nearly £1.5m a year.

Council leader Matthew Riddle said: "The Conservatives committed to finding ways to responsibly remove the green bin charge and further committed that if elected, we would begin phasing it out. In our initial plans for this year we were confident we would be able to fund a £6 reduction in the charge at a cost of around £250,000.

"Following the local government finance settlement, we have had to take a tough decision and prioritise other frontline services. We will be protecting youth services, introducing an all-hours bus pass for the blind and saving our welfare grant for our most vulnerable.

"We've written to ministers to raise our concerns about the settlement and still plan to fulfil our manifesto commitment during our time in office."

The budget will be considered by the Policy & Resources Committee on 1st February, with the final vote taken by



councillors on 17th February. The 3.99% rise follows a five-year council tax freeze. From 2011 to 2015 the council has saved nearly £45m each year in annual spending. By the end of 2015/16, these are targeted to have delivered £56m per annum of savings. From 2016/17 to 2019/20, the

council has a provisional savings programme of an additional £23m per annum and expects to have to identify another £8m of savings by the end of the decade.

PCSOs At last Wednesday's Communities Committee meeting, councillors had to cut £277,000 from the community safety budget and voted to axe nine Police Community Support Officers. Other options they rejected included cutting support to tackle anti-social behaviour, domestic abuse and hate crime.

The committee also approved plans to consult the public about changes to the library service to save £640,000 a year.

Plans for community hubs were discussed and councillors adopted a policy of co-located services, including libraries and One Stop Shops, in single, easy-to-access facilities. They also agreed to keep public loos under review and facilities could close where suitable alternative facilities are identified within half a mile.



# Well-known Rotarian dies

Elder Rotarian Edward Cannock has died at the age of 92. He passed away peacefully on 15th January after a short illness.

He joined the Rotary Club of Keynsham in 1960 and was secretary from 1965 to 1969. He became president in 1973/74. Edward's interests were many but he was particularly involved in overseas activities and enjoyed the social exchanges with the Argentan Rotary Club in France with which the Keynsham club is twinned.

He had a particular interest in the charity Tools for Self Reliance, which recycles much-needed hand tools to African countries

And he was meticulous in keeping articles and information about the club and was its archivist for many years.

In recognition of his outstanding service to Rotary, he was

Preparation works begin at station for

new electric trains

A drop-in session was held Tuesday for people to find out about the closure of Keynsham Station in April for works connected to the electrification of the Great Western Main Line.

And there was welcome news for transport campaigners about the new shelters due to be installed at the station as part of the modernisation works.

There had been criticism that the replacement canopies would be little more than bus shelters, but there has been an assurance that although still at the design stage, they will be more substantial than outline drawings suggested.

However, Network Rail executives who were at last Tuesday's drop-in session at St John's Parish Hall were keen to point out there were constraints because of the overhead electrical lines. The Keynsham project involves creating extra overhead clearance through Station Road Bridge to make room for the power lines and the track will have to be lowered to achieve this.

The project's manager Stephen Boyne said the current canopies had to go as they were too big, as well as being old and shoddy. There will be a replacement shelter on the platform for Bristol while on the Bath side, the old canopy won't be replaced but the more modern brick shelter closer to the car



park will be made bigger.

#### Station closure

Preparation work began at the station last Saturday and it will be closed from 2nd April to 11th April. Buses will replace trains between Bristol Temple Meads and Bath Spa during the nineday closure. People living nearby have been warned to expect a lot of noise during the nine days of work.

Currently 368,000 passengers use Keynsham Station a year and with new development in Keynsham, Whitchurch and Bitton, that is set to rise to 400,000. New, high-speed electric trains were due to enter service next year, bringing extra capacity, faster journey times and greater passenger comfort on trains between Bristol and London. However, electrification work is now understood to be over budget and running behind schedule.



### Bid to list the Lamb as a community asset ...

A campaign has been started to get the Lamb pub listed as an Asset of Community Value (ACV) to protect it from any future move to demolish it or change its use.

The campaign is being led by youth worker Dennis Stinchcombe MBE (pictured), who grew up in Cadbury Heath and still lives there. He decided to apply for ACV status after reading a story in The Week In about the legislation.

Without ACV status, a pub can be demolished or converted into



several other uses including small supermarkets, betting shops and estate agents without planning permission or community consultation. To date 1,200 pubs across England have been listed as Assets of Community Value, with CAMRA (the Campaign for Real Ale) hoping to boost that number to 3,000 by the end of this year.

Mr Stinchcombe's bid has the backing of Kingswood MP Chris Skidmore and Oldland Parish Council.

The Lamb was recently chosen by Mr Skidmore as his Community Pub of the Year.

This week he called it "a wonderful success story of a community pub" that had gone from strength to strength after coming close to demolition in 2009.

The MP said: "If the pub is listed as an Asset of Community



Value, this will allow local residents the chance to organise a group and purchase the pub, potentially keeping it in the hands of the local community.

"I know that the Lamb is highly valued by the Cadbury Heath community, so making it an Asset of Community Value will recognise exactly what it is to the local community."

Mr Stinchcombe, who drinks at the Lamb at least once a week, said he'd had an affinity with the pub since he was a boy as his father used to drink there.

He said the pub had a committee which fundraises for the community, such as paying for the funeral of a young man whose family could not afford it, and collecting enough money to pay for a defibrillator to go outside the Lamb.

"This pub is an integral part of community life in Cadbury Heath," he said.

... But move to safeguard Tennis Court pub fails

Campaigners who hoped to protect the Tennis Court Inn by getting it listed as an Asset of Community Value have been left disappointed after their bid was rejected.

Last June a planning application was lodged to demolish the 19th century landmark pub on Deanery Road and replace it with a block of 14 flats

There was opposition from the local community, supported by MP Chris Skidmore, and a petition was signed by more than 300 people to protect the pub, which at the time was trading. It has since closed.

South Gloucestershire Council's conservation officer objected to the planning proposal which was lodged by Tollgate (Hanham) Ltd, saying it failed to assess the significance of the building correctly and that a scheme of "conversion and extension" should be explored if it ceased being a pub.

There was some relief when the plans were withdrawn last July but Mr Skidmore said he intended to press on with the campaign to protect the pub and called a meeting of those interested in protecting it from change of use by having it listed as an Asset of Community Value (ACV).

Last week he told us: "I had hoped that we could have listed the pub as an ACV to show that we have community support for the



pub; however the council wanted evidence that we would be putting in a financial bid for the pub.

"But we had around 50 people join the community group, run by local resident Ray Bazeley, which I hope that when we know what will be happening to the pub, or if it comes under threat of demolition or change of use, that we can use this strong base of support to oppose any change."

A spokesperson for South Gloucestershire Council said: "The nomination to register the Tennis Court Inn as an Asset of Community Value was rejected due to a lack of evidence being submitted of community use that would justify listing the property in this way."




However, once again, nothing. Does this mean that he has changed his stance because it is in his own patch of Bitton? Are we now to believe that he no longer supports the Green Belt?

Perhaps he can really stand up and be counted and let us all know where he stands?



### Elected mayor would have serious consequences

Dear Stephen,

I feel I must write to challenge much of the letter written by Philip Raby championing his rationale for a directly elected mayor for Bath & North East Somerset.

First of all, it appears clear to me that he does not live in Keynsham. Contrary to Mr Raby's perception of our town, we are very good at standing up for Keynsham and making our voice heard on B&NES. Keynsham's six Conservative councillors meet regularly with BANES officers to talk directly and specifically about Keynsham issues. Our residents don't hesitate to contact us if they have a problem or a view on an issue and we act to address their concerns or take their views forward so that they are heard at the highest level - for example, views on the new leisure centre! Mr Raby also uses emotive language - a directly elected mayor would "represent and champion the entire community... their first loyalty would be to the people who elected them". I was elected, through the ballot box, by the people of South Keynsham. I owe my position to them, my primary responsibility is to serve them and then the wider community of Keynsham. If I don't do my job, then they will not vote me in at the next local government election.

He claims "an elected mayor saves money by being efficient, cutting waste and reducing costs" - excuse me! A mayor's salary, which will include pension and National Insurance contributions, would probably be more than double that paid to the current leader of council - himself ballot box elected - so that over a four-year term it would cost the taxpayer an extra £200,000! The leader of the council is answerable to his cabinet, political group and the rest of

council - all elected by residents of Bath & North East Somerset. He/she could be removed during the four-year term if they don't perform. A directly elected mayor could cling on for the whole term, even if their performance was abysmal!

Keynsham, in the past, has long suffered 'second-class citizen status' against the big, beautiful city of Bath. This has changed with our administration. We locally 'fight our corner', but there is also strong Conservative representation throughout Bath and North East Somerset so we are committed to helping the whole of our district. Where would this 'directly elected mayor' live? Are they likely to be apolitical and totally impartial, treating both the city of Bath and the towns and rural areas of North East Somerset with equity?

I firmly believe that our current system of residents electing their ward councillors, the majority party forming the administration and the current checks and procedures for the process of council (particularly the passing of the annual budget) is the best, sound, democratic system. I strongly urge all residents of Keynsham and beyond to reject this proposal and instead vote to keep our current 'leader and cabinet' model for B&NES. The outcome of this referendum will be decided on a simple majority of those who have voted. If you don't vote, a small minority could change the way our local area is managed - with serious consequences for the way our town is represented on the council.

### Why keep the status quo? Dear Sir.

I had to smile at last week's coverage and accompanying letters concerning the elected mayor for B&NES.

In particular the letter from Philip Raby accusing the Tories running B&NES of coming out with "inaccurate and implausible

stories of what an elected mayor will cost" and right above it - a letter from Conservative councillor Alan Hale containing... well.

So the cabinet-run council in B&NES is better than George Ferguson's Bristol because the ratepayers didn't have to suffer a 2% rise in council tax last year. If Mr Hale used facts, rather than repeating party dogma, he would probably have added that Bristol council tax payers actually voted for a 1.98% increase, rather than see cuts to council services - something which emerged from a record-breaking consultation exercise with the mayor.

An elected mayor would be paid more than the council leader. Let's conveniently forget Mr Hale's Keynsham colleague Charles Gerrish and the seven other councillors who each receive £19,000 a year for sitting alongside the council leader in his cabinet. Then there's the permanent staff led by the chief executive on £150,000 a year (plus £30,000 pension & NI contributions), six directors on over £100,000 and a further 80 staff earning over £50,000.

Of course we can all come out with figures and statistics to justify an argument and nobody can expect to run a £400m budget without experienced staff. The one question that remains to be answered, as Philip Raby points out, is why is everyone so keen to maintain the status quo? They say 'if it ain't broke, don't fix it'. But since B&NES was created, council administrations of different persuasions have presided over the likes of the Bath spa, Keynsham town centre, the Bath bus gates, K2, 20mph zones and Bathampton Park & Ride. They have also removed swathes of land from Green Belt control and given it over to housing while doing absolutely nothing about roads or transport infrastructure.

Government money flowing into Bristol since 2012 dwarfs any funding heading in B&NES direction and the (Conservative) Chancellor George Osborne has made clear that more will follow into regions that elect

their own mayors. Makes you wonder why people like Alan Hale are so keen to keep things just the way they are.

### Too few police on the streets due to cuts

Dear Editor.

I have to ask myself the question, is the robbery of a lady in her 80s in Tenby Road in Keynsham last week a portent of things to come, when we no longer see a visible presence of warranted police officers on our streets?

It is reported that violent crime has increased by 27% nationally. I wonder why? It is reported that Avon & Somerset Police were disappointed in the number of positive breath tests during one of their operations. I wonder why?

Sadly the criminal classes will take the chance if they believe they will get away with it. Also I read that it is now suggested that perhaps volunteers may be given uniforms to patrol the streets with a power to detain someone for 30 minutes. Forgive me, but my experience tells me that someone who needs to be detained is not going to stand quietly by whilst a police officer is summoned and attends - assuming there is an available officer - to arrest him or her.

The police officers we have, such as they are, are not to blame, Chief Constables and Police & Crime Commissioners should have been shouting it from the roof tops that you cannot continue to cut funding and expect everything to stay the same.

As members of the community, you need to be writing to your MPs to tell them of your concerns if you have them - I certainly do! I have written and have received back a letter from the Home Office via Mr Rees-Mogg

that puts everything back on the local forces because "they know how best to spend their money", we are told, even if that money is woefully inadequate.

What we need is a police service that does not end up running its staff ragged but one where there are sufficient police constables out there to deal with everyday crime and hopefully the prevention of it, and to reassure the community and keep it safe.

Pick up your pen or fire up your computer and let the Government know how you feel and what you want.

Headteacher Fran Harding said the school was very grateful for the trees. Jon Clark, executive


director of the Forest of Avon Trust, said: "Schools' orchards are a great way of involving children in improving their environment,





# Witness appeal following robbery of 82-year-old woman

Police are appealing for witnesses after an elderly woman was robbed in Keynsham last Friday morning.

The 82-year-old victim was walking along Tenby Road at about 8.10am when a Marks & Spencer carrier bag she was holding was snatched from her grasp.

She fell to the floor and suffered bruising to her arm and ribs as well as a swollen knee.

The suspect, thought to be a man in his teens or early 20s and wearing dark clothing, made off with the bag in the direction of Kelston Park. Inside the bag was the woman's purse containing her bus pass, medication and a small quantity of cash.

The victim gave chase but lost sight of the suspect.

Officers later recovered the carrier bag but the woman's purse had been taken.

Detective Sergeant Simon Chubb said: "This was a shocking incident in which a vulnerable woman was pulled to the floor as her bag was ripped from her hands.

"The victim, who thankfully didn't sustain any serious injuries, demonstrated great bravery during and after the robbery and should be praised for this.

"We're now appealing for anyone who saw the incident, or a young man fleeing the area, to get in touch on 101, quoting 5216014998."

### Appeal to Asda over trolleys

Oldland Parish Council is writing to Asda's head office to complain about the number of abandoned trolleys found in the Longwell Green area after one was hurled off a bridge on to the ring road earlier this month, striking a lorry and injuring the driver

The council's clerk Victoria Hicks had written to the store in Craven Way before the recent incident to flag up the problem of abandoned trolleys but said she had not received a response.

In the wake of the incident in the early hours of 14th January when a trolley was thrown from the footbridge leading from Palmers Close on to the A4174, the council has decided to go straight to senior management at the store's Leeds headquarters to try to get something done.

### Threat to Lyde Green Common withdrawn - for now

Norft, the company which last year applied to deregister ancient Lyde Green Common, sparking fears it wanted to develop the land for housing, has withdrawn its proposal.

A planning inquiry had been due to take place in the coming months but Norft has now told the Planning Inspectorate it will not be proceeding with the application. The decision has been cautiously welcomed by campaigners amid speculation that this might only be a temporary reprieve for the Common.

Norft is based in Devon and headed by Julian Darling, who claimed ownership of the Common some years ago after buying the lordship of the manor of Westerleigh. His company applied to deregister the Common for "health and safety" reasons, saying the area would become more heavily trafficked with the new Lyde Green development being built nearby, with a risk to people using the Common. A site off Coxgrove Hill was proposed by Norft as an alternative Common.

But campaigners believe Norft's intention is to ultimately sell the Common for housing. The land was included in a development plan in 2004 but removed in 2011.

Kingswood MP Chris Skidmore said: "This is a historic common land dating back centuries that should be preserved for future generations to enjoy, in particular the new growing community at Lyde Green that needs green space among the new houses. "The next stage must be to protect our common land and

recognise its historic and valued status; in particular, I am concerned that this patch of common land is not registered as



Green Belt land, and I will be making the case that common land such as this should be protected under Green Belt regulations, or else future challenges like this may occur."

Commoner Gerald Taylor, of Howsmoor Lane, said: "I am very happy it has been withdrawn but going forward there needs to be enhanced protection for the Common as it is an obvious target."

Emersons Green Town Council, which had been against deregistration and started a petition, said it was important that people moving into the new houses at Lyde Green used the green space.

Around 2,500 homes are being built at Emersons Green East over the next 10 years by several developers, including Taylor Wimpey, Linden, Barratt and Persimmon, and the new development will border the Common where hedgerows are said to date back at least 1,000 years.



# Twitching to go to Spain

A holiday location where you can see dolphins, chamois and golden eagles is a proposition which appeals increasingly to those who have already done traditional package holidays to death and are looking for more authentic experiences.



## Row over growing football club's

floodlighting plans

AEK-BOCO Football Club's plans to put up six 15-metre high floodlights at its Greenbank Road ground have sparked letters of objection from neighbours.

The plans, which can be viewed on South Gloucestershire Council's website, include a supporting statement from the club highlighting its success.

It says it is the largest FA Community Club in the region with nearly 650 players representing the club every weekend. There are 41 teams accommodating boys and girls aged five to 18, as well as four men's sides and two women's sides, with a membership of nearly 1,500 members.

Without floodlights the club says it cannot continue the progression of amateur sport to the next level for its members.

It says the floodlights will be predominantly used during the football season - every Saturday and Sunday from September to May - as well as at games on some Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights. But objectors are concerned about light pollution and say the club has outgrown its site and that extending play until after 9pm will increase noise, traffic and nuisance.

One resident claimed the cabling for the proposed lights had already been installed ready for the lights to be fitted which was a breach as the planning application states that no work towards installation has started.

Comments include: "I believe that the success of the club means



they have now outgrown the field and am concerned about implications of any further progression through the football league."


Another said the proposal was "an indication that the club has through its own success and intent outgrown this public amenity which sits in extremely close proximity to neighbouring houses".

Another said the bright floodlights would be a hazard for motorists and they could act as a "magnet" for groups not associated with the club to congregate. People have until 10th February to comment. The reference number is PK15/5492/F.

This week a spokesman for the club said they were aware of concerns raised. He said: "We will be holding a meeting at the club before the 10th February deadline where local residents can raise their concerns directly with the club.

"Details of the meeting will be circulated to local residents shortly. I can also confirm that no work towards the installation has started, including any cabling."







## Appeal over armed robberies

Police have appealed for information following armed robberies in Whitehall and Fishponds.

Investigators believe the same two men are responsible for both robberies. The appeal was launched last week by investigators who say that even though the raids were last October and



November, they are confident someone in the Bristol community will have information about the pair.

### £100,000 for play projects in St George

Two volunteer groups in St George are celebrating news of £100,000 to improve play in Dundridge Park and Troopers Hill Field.

Both groups worked together to apply for grants from SITA Trust, an independent funding body which provides funding through the Landfill Communities Fund.

Troopers Hill Field just has a 1980s slide and a few logs, with many people driving their children to surrounding parks to access play facilities while Dundridge Park's small, ageing play area is only suitable for very young children.

The funding will allow the Friends of Troopers Hill and Friends of Dundridge Park, working with landowner Bristol City Council, to create a small, fenced play area for under-fives with an access path on Troopers Hill Field, and an improved play area on Dundridge Park.

The chair of Friends of Troopers Hill, Susan Acton-Campbell said: "We are so grateful to SITA Trust for this grant. It took a lot of work, particularly from local parents, Chris & Lisa Deane, Richard & Bethany Evans and Millie Colwey, to do the necessary consultations and preparation. Without the guarantee of matchfunding from the St George Neighbourhood Partnership we could not have applied, and Bristol Parks have been very supportive.

"Thanks also to everyone who completed the consultation questionnaires, Air Balloon Hill Primary School and Summerhill Infant School who helped with questionnaire distribution, and Avon & Somerset police, Bristol City Council and our MP Kerry McCarthy who wrote letters of support."




The chair of the Friends of Dundridge Park, Geoff Reeson, also thanked everyone for their support.

### You're never too old to exercise

When Sirona's physiotherapist Dan Taylor asked 90-year-old great-grandfather John Micklem what his goal was after he was discharged from hospital, he wasn't expecting the reply he received - John told him he was determined to return to the gym.

And for the last few weeks Dan has been taking John from his home to the YMCA Health and Wellbeing Centre gym in Bath for a work-out.

John is sharing his story at the start of the New Year in the hope of inspiring others to take up exercise.

Dan said: "John had been in hospital for a while and when he was discharged home his goal was to get back to his normal routine. When I had the first meeting with John and his family it was felt that the gym was so much part of his life it was important to get him back there and the staff at the gym are a fantastic support to him.

"One of the things Sirona tells all its staff is to ensure that we focus on the individual and what their goal is, not what we think it should be. So I set about supporting John to get back to the gym.

"We have been gradually building up his exercises and helping him to keep as healthy and as well as he can. He really is remarkable; we've had people in their 30s and 40s keen to return to a sport after injury but this is my first nonagenarian."

Dan will continue to work with John until both feel he is safe to



return to independently visiting the gym.

John said: "I have been coming here for a very long time. I like feeling active and I have always enjoyed walking. It's very important that people do exercise; not a lot of people my age do it. My late wife Pauline and I used to go on distance hikes; we both enjoyed the gym and shared some lovely times together."


