The Stick Martin Show


The Stick Martin Show formed on the 28th day of the eleventh month,

At a benefit for The USF Suncoast Gerontology Center, on the back patio, we worked our way through the crowd, and on stage...

Dave "The Ripper" Berry - Lead Guitar, Vocals, originally from Philadelphia, PA and came to Florida in 1982. He started playing Guitar at the age of 14 and has played in many rock bands over the past 40 years. $\,$

David "T-Bird" Lucas - Bass Guitar, vocals- Originally from Cleveland, OH, came to Florida in 1985. He started playing bass at the age of 10. He sings lead and background vocals and plays 6 and 12 string guitar, mandolin and banjo.

Scott "Stix' Ray – Drums – Originally from Danville, IL. He studied percussion for six years under legendary Big Band drummer, George "Bones" Bacon.

Patrick "Professor" Conway - Keyboards, Vocals — Originally from Easton, PA and came to Florida in 1981. He played the baritone horn and trombone in a circus band for 4 summers; he also toured for 3 years and played in a top 40/showband "Centerfold".

Jumpin" Jack Rashkin – Rhythm Guitar, Harmonica – Originally from Bloomsburg, PA and came to Florida in 1964. He is a self-taught musician and also does vocals.

As we heard them play we could not believe how much like the original artist they sounded, their instrumental talents



are overwhelming. The band plays a mix of blues/rock and some of the artists they cover are Muddy Waters, The Kinks, Eric Clapton, The Rolling Stones, Bob Dylan, Chuck Berry and The Doors.

In November 2003 Dr. Dave Berry joined Dr. Scott Ray and Dr. Jack Rashkin in the studio. Shortly thereafter, Dr. Dave Lucas was approached to join the three in rehearsals and he brought along his long-standing partner from The Quivering Rhythm Hounds, Dr. Pat Conway, and Strange Brew was born.
