Ruah has recently developed an Aboriginal Recruitment and Retention Strategy that seeks to build an Aboriginal perspective into our organisation, increase the number of Aboriginal staff and provide effective services for Aboriginal people.

Ruah has also made a commitment to celebrating the anniversary of the Commonwealth Government's apology to the stolen generation that occurred on February 13, 2008 each year. The occasion is used as an opportunity for Ruah to reflect on what it has done over the preceding 12 months to increase its responsiveness to Aboriginal people, and identify the challenges that are still before it.
