MEMORIAL STADIUM

Kansas will initiate its 84th season of football at Memorial Stadium this fall with an overall home record of 209-199-16.

Recognized as the first stadium built on a college campus west of the Mississippi River, Memorial Stadium is the seventh oldest collegiate stadium in the nation. Located at the north base of Mt. Oread at 11th and Maine streets in Lawrence, it has a capacity of 50,071.

In recent years, the stadium complex has been the focus of major renovations with more than \$30 million in improvements completed.

Construction projects at the stadium have touched on improvements for fans, players and coaches in all areas of the complex:

- The installation of permanent lights in 1997;
- Infrastructure repairs and a new concourse throughout the lower level with new restrooms and concession areas in 1998;
- A new home lockerroom, a pressbox which is three times larger than its predecessor, an elevator and the addition of 36 scholarship suites in 1999;
- A new MegaVision video board and the resurfacing of the track in 1999;
- The addition of a new artificial surface in 2000.

Memorial Stadium is dedicated to the University of Kansas students who fought and died in World War I.

After playing its first two years of intercollegiate football (1890-91) in old Central Park on Massachusetts Street, Kansas built its first football field in 1892. It was called McCook Field and was named for Colonel John McCook who donated \$2,500 to trigger a building fund drive.

Like most stadiums of those early days, it was nothing more than a set of wooden stands bordering each side of the field. It was laid out east and west on a site adjacent to the present Memorial Stadium. In fact, the horseshoe of Memorial Stadium covers much of old McCook Field. The east end zone of the original field was 400 feet from Mississippi Street and was bounded on the south by McCook Street. At that time McCook Street extended from Mississippi to Maine Street cutting directly through the present-day stadium.

Kansas played its first game on McCook Field on Oct. 27, 1892, defeating Illinois, 26-4.

Kansas continued to compete at McCook Field until 1920 when Jayhawk fans, students and faculty began a drive for a new facility. The idea of a new stadium came on the heels of a 20-20 tie with Nebraska at McCook Field in 1920.

Coaching in what would be his first and only season, Dr. F.C. "Phog" Allen directed Kansas to the tie after trailing 20-0 at halftime. Although Allen would go on to gain greater fame as a basketball coach, the idea to build a new football stadium was just one of his many innovations at Kansas.

On the Monday following the game, fans, students and faculty gathered to celebrate the comeback. In mass, more than \$200,000 was pledged to build a "modern" concrete structure. Allen envisioned a horseshoe shaped stadium, and, under his direction, construction began immediately.

The Jayhawks moved into Memorial Stadium in 1921 and defeated Kansas State 21-7 on October 29, before 5,160 fans. When the stadium opened, the east and west stands were complete with a capacity of 22,000. The final game of the 1921 season saw Kansas down Missouri 15-9 before 15,480 fans in Memorial Stadium.

In 1925, the east and west sections were extended to the south. Today those additions house the home and visitor lockerrooms. On October 3, 1925, a record crowd of 20,640 watched Kansas defeat Oklahoma A&M, 31-3. In 1927, the north bowl was completed to increase capacity to 35,000.

Kansas inaugurated the horseshoe with a 26-6 loss to Wisconsin.

The next addition came in 1963 when the west stands were expanded 26 rows raising the capacity to 44,900. Included in this addition was a new pressbox. Two years later a similar addition was added to the east side bringing the capacity to 51,500.

In 1970, artificial turf replaced the natural grass playing surface. The stadium

underwent a major renovation in 1978 totalling approximately \$1.8 million. The first phase consisted of repairing concrete from the original construction. The original wooden seats were replaced with aluminum bleachers as well.

The interior of the stadium was also improved in that renovation. Included were new dressing and training rooms for both Kansas and its opponents.

Another phase of the renovation covered the pressbox. New booths for television and radio along with a new photo deck were installed at level eight. Expanded radio booths were built on level seven in addition to a complete refurbishing that included all three levels.

In 1987, the old south endzone bleachers were removed. Permanent bleachers were purchased in 1992 increasing the seating capacity to 50,250.

The third artificial surface in the stadium's history was added during the summer of 1990 with the installation of an AstroTurf field. That new carpet lasted through the 1999 season. A new surface – known as AstroPlay – was put down just prior to the start of the 2000 season.

Memorial Stadium has also been host to a number of community, musical and athletic activities. It is the home of the prestigious Kansas Relays. The eight lane all-weather track was built in 1969, replacing the old cinder surface. In 1984, the track was resurfaced and new jumping pits were constructed. Memorial Stadium hosted the Big Eight Conference track and field championships in the spring of 1994.

Only six other Division I schools — Cincinnati (1916), Georgia Tech (1913), Mississippi State (1915), Oklahoma State (1920), Washington (1920) and Wisconsin (1917) — currently play in older stadiums. Kansas, Stanford and Tennessee play in stadiums that were opened in 1921.

MEMORIAL STADIUM CHRONOLOGY

- 1919** The University of Kansas initiates the Million Dollar Drive, designed as a fund-raising campaign to secure funds for the construction of a memorial honoring the KU students who died during World War I.
- 1920** Phog Allen, in his only season as football head coach, rallies his team from a 20-0 halftime deficit to a 20-20 tie against Nebraska. The following Monday, students and faculty gather to celebrate the comeback and more than \$200,000 is pledged over a three-day period to build a concrete stadium.
- 1921** The university observed "Stadium Day" (May 10) and more than 4,000 students showed up to help demolish the old stadium, McCook Field.
- 1921** In the first game in Memorial Stadium, KU defeated Kansas State, 21-7 in front of 5,160 fans on Oct. 3, 1921. When the stadium was completed, the east and west stands had a capacity of 22,000.
- 1922** On Nov. 11, just prior to the KU-Nebraska game, Memorial Stadium was formally dedicated.
- 1925** The east and west sections were extended to the south. On Oct. 3, a record crowd of 20,640 watched Kansas defeat Oklahoma A&M, 31-3.
- 1927** Phog Allen's dream of a horseshoe-type stadium turns into reality as the north bowl is completed and the stadium capacity is increased to 35,000.
- 1963** The west stands are expanded 26 rows, raising the capacity to 44,900. Also added is a new pressbox.
- 1965** The east stands are expanded and capacity grows to 51,500.
- 1970** The natural grass surface is replaced with artificial turf.
- 1978** A \$1.8 million renovation of Memorial Stadium includes improvements to repair concrete, replacing the original wooden seats, adding new dressing rooms and additions to the pressbox. Also, a new artificial turf is added.
- 1987** The old south endzone bleachers are removed.
- 1990** A new AstroTurf field is installed in the summer prior to the start of the 1990 season.
- 1992** Bleachers were temporarily added in the south endzone.
- 1997** Four standards of permanent lights added.
- 1999** The completion of a two-year, \$26 million, renovation project which included extensive infrastructure repairs, new concourse with improved concession stands and restrooms, new home locker-room, a new pressbox with 36 scholarship suites and expanded facilities for radio, television and print media and a new elevator. In addition, the 1999 season marked the debut of a new video board in the south endzone.
- 2000** Internet users were able to watch on a user-controlled web cam as the old AstroTurf field was removed and a new AstroPlay surface was installed.

A TO Z OF KANSAS FOOTBALL

-- A --

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS -- The University of Kansas ranked third among public institutions with 42 academic All-Americans in the 1990s.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT -- The University of Kansas athletics department offers a broad-based academic support program for the hundreds of student-athletes which grace the Lawrence campus each year. KU athletes meet regularly with the degree and career counseling staff which assists them with class selection, time management strategies, career exploration, long-term academic plans, personal concerns and more. In addition, the academic support staff sets up special events throughout the year to recognize what the student-athletes are accomplishing off the field. Those events include Career Night, the Jayhawk Scholar Recognition Ceremony, Jayhawk Academic Achievement Luncheon, New Student-Athlete Welcome Session and the Graduation Brunch. The Kansas athletics department allocated over \$900,000 toward student-athlete support for the last academic year, and the department has increased its student support budget by 467 percent over the last 15 years.

ASSISTANT COACHES -- Some of the top college football coaches in history have served in the role of assistant coaches at Kansas. Among those coaches who helped build their careers on the KU sidelines were Terry Donahue (1968-70), Dick Tomey (1967-70), John Cooper (1967-72), Wade Phillips (1975), Dave McClain (1967-68), Jim Dickey (1973-74), Don Fambrough (1948-53, 58-70), and Dee Andros (1953).

ASTROPLAY -- Kansas played on a new surface at Memorial Stadium in 2000 as it became the first NCAA Division I-A school to install AstroPlay at its stadium. The surface, installed at a cost of \$330,000, is the fourth artificial surface in Memorial Stadium's 80-year history. KU was the first school to install artificial turf in the Big Eight Conference back in 1970.

-- B --

BAUSCH, JIM -- "Jarrin" Jim Bausch was regarded as the world's greatest athlete in the early 1930's. A 1929-30 All-Missouri Valley Conference selection at halfback, he went on to play professionally for the Chicago Cardinals from 1934-36. A standout track and field performer, he won the gold medal in the decathlon at the 1932 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles. He was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame in 1954.

BIG 12 -- The University of Kansas joined the Big 12 prior to the 1996 football season.

BORDER WAR TROPHY -- The University of Kansas captured the 2003-04 Border War Trophy presented by the Midwest Ford Dealers, by outscoring arch-rival Missouri 21.5-18.5 in the all-sports competition between the two schools. The Jayhawks took a 9-4 lead during the fall season, including KU's head-to-head victory on the football field.

-- C --

CARDIAC FINISHES -- During the 1973 season Kansas set an NCAA record by having six games decided by two points or less. KU went 3-2-1 in those close encounters, finishing the season with a 7-4-1 record including a trip to the Liberty Bowl. The close games included Tennessee (lost, 28-27), Nebraska (lost, 10-9), Iowa State (won, 22-20), Oklahoma State (tie, 10-10), Colorado (won, 17-15) and Missouri (won, 14-13).

CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS -- The University of Kansas won a combined 54 conference championships and conference tournaments during the decade of the 1980's and 1990's.

CRIMSON AND BLUE -- KU's colors have been crimson and blue since the early 1890's. Originally, the Board of Regents had decided to adopt the University of Michigan's colors, maize and sky blue. Maize and blue were shown at oratorical meets, and they may have colored the Kansas crew in rowing competitions in the mid-1880's. But in 1890 when football arrived at KU, a clamor arose for Harvard's crimson to honor Col. John J. McCook, a Harvard

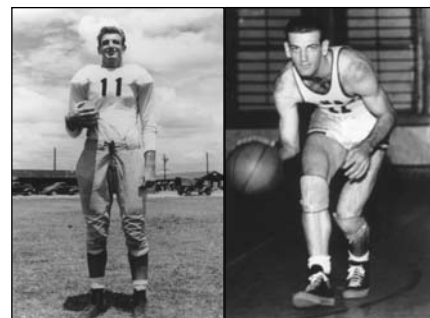


KU officially adopted the colors of Crimson and Blue during the 1800s.

graduate who had given money for KU's athletic field. Faculty members who had graduated from Yale insisted that their academic lineage and Yale blue not be overlooked. In 1896, crimson and blue were adopted officially.

-- D --

DOUBLE-DUTY -- Several KU athletes played both football and basketball well before Bo Jackson and Deion Sanders made names for themselves as versatile two-sport athletes. KU legends such as Charlie Black, Charlie Hoag, Ray Evans, Ralph Miller and Otto Schnellbacher excelled at both football and basketball for the Jayhawks. Believe it or not, 78 Kansas athletes have lettered both on the gridiron and on the hardwood, however, the majority of those players participated in the early 1900s. The last Jayhawks to successfully complete one full season at both football and basketball while on Mt. Oread were Marvin Mattox and Clint Normore in the late 1980s.

-- E --

EVANS, RAY -- The son of Czechoslovakian immigrants, Ray Evans qualifies as one of the all-time greatest athletes in Kansas history. A member of five KU conference championship teams in two sports (football and basketball), Evans is the only player in KU history to earn All-America honors in both football and basketball. He also holds the distinction of being the only player in NCAA history to lead the nation in both passing and interceptions in the same season (1942).

-- F --

FALKENSTIEN, MAX -- Max Falkenstien (class of 1948) will begin his 58th year as a broadcaster for KU football games this fall. Kansas fans have listened to Falkenstien on the radio for more than 540 games since his first game (a 0-0 tie against TCU in Kansas City) in 1946. Falkenstien is the only media representative in the KU Athletics Hall of Fame and he was enshrined in the State of Kansas Sports Hall of Fame, during the summer of 2003. Falkenstien, who was the subject of a feature story three years ago in *Sports Illustrated*, has used the same pair of Sears binoculars throughout his career.

FAMBROUGH, DON -- Former player, assistant coach and two-time head coach Don Fambrough is a familiar figure at KU practices. Over recent years, Fambrough has attended nearly every Jayhawk practice session. In addition, Fambrough has organized the lettermen gathering for the final practice of the season to salute the team prior to the last game of the year.

A TO Z OF KANSAS FOOTBALL

Of the nine bowl games which the University of Kansas has played, Fambrough has played or coached in five of them. A two-time All-conference selection as a player, Fambrough helped lead the 1947 Jayhawks to the school's first-ever bowl game. When he became head coach at KU in 1971, he had served 19 years as an assistant coach under J.V. Sikes, Jack Mitchell and Pepper Rodgers. In just his third season as head coach he led his team to the 1973 Liberty Bowl. Fambrough later went on to serve as assistant director of the Williams Fund until accepting the reigns of the football program again in 1979. Once again, he led KU to a bowl game as the Jayhawks were selected for the 1981 Hall of Fame Bowl. At the annual football banquet, the Don Fambrough Award is presented to a standout football player who leads by example.

FACILITIES -- KU has invested more than \$50 million, primarily from private donors, in athletic facility improvements during the last several years.

FIRST TELEVISED GAME -- Kansas and Texas Christian University participated in the first-ever nationally televised game as the Jayhawks took a 13-0 victory in the 1952 season opener at Memorial Stadium. The game was seen coast-to-coast on NBC.

FIRST ROUND SELECTIONS, NFL -- Kansas has had eight players selected in the first round of the National Football League draft. The first Jayhawk selected in the initial round was Ray Evans, who was taken by the Chicago Bears in 1944. Evans actually had two years of eligibility remaining and didn't play professional football until 1948. Other NFL first round selections include John Hadl, Gale Sayers, John Riggins, Don Goode, Mike Buter, David Verser and Dana Stubblefield (below). Throughout the years, KU has had 33 players selected in the first three rounds of the draft.

FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICA -- Flanker Charles Gordon and strong safety Jonathan Lamb were both honored by *The Sporting News* after stellar freshman campaigns in 2003. Gordon was a first-team freshman all-american selection as both a wide receiver and kick returner while Lamb was a second-team selection as a safety.

FUMBLE -- Kansas appeared to be on its way to victory in its first-ever bowl game in the 1948 Orange Bowl. Trailing favored Georgia Tech, 20-14, late in

the game, officials made a controversial ruling which gave Georgia Tech a fumble recovery at the two-foot line. Kansas ended up with a 20-14 loss as Tech ran out the clock.

-- G --

GOVERNORS CUP -- The traveling trophy, which is presented annually to the winner of the Kansas-Kansas State football game, was established in 1969 by then-governor Robert Docking. The governor of the state attends this rivalry each year and presents the trophy to the head coach in the winning team's lockerroom. A new version of the trophy was unveiled starting with the 1997 season. The original trophy was retired following the 1996 season and is now on display at the Kansas Sports Hall of Fame. The two teams will meet for the 102nd time this season.

GREATEST GAMES -- A panel of former and current coaches, athletes, administrators and media representatives were asked at the end of the 1999 season to select their top five all-time greatest games in KU history. Listed below are the results of the poll:

1. 1975 vs. Oklahoma -- Kansas defeated second-ranked Oklahoma in Norman, 23-3, to end the Sooners' 28-game winning streak.
2. 1995 vs. UCLA -- The Jayhawks upset No. 25 UCLA, 51-30, in the 1995 Aloha Bowl in Bruins head coach (and former KU assistant) Terry Donohue's final game.
3. 1968 vs. Penn State -- In one of the great Orange Bowl contests of all-time, Penn State took a narrow 15-14 win over the Jayhawks in the "12th Man Game."
4. 1968 vs. Missouri -- Needing a win in the final game of the season for an Orange Bowl bid, the Jayhawks took a 21-19 final advantage over 13th-ranked Missouri in Columbia.
5. 1947 vs. Missouri -- The Ray Evans, Otto Schnellbacher and Don Fambrough-led Jayhawks earned a share of the conference championship and the school's first bowl bid with a 20-14 Homecoming win over rival Missouri.

-- H --

HADL, JOHN -- The first two-time All-America selection at the University of Kansas, John Hadl excelled in the Jayhawk offense as a quarterback and part-time halfback. He was also a highly effective defensive back, return specialist and one of the nation's top punters during his three-year career. Hadl still holds the school record for longest interception return (98 yards vs. TCU in 1959) and longest punt (94 yards vs. Oklahoma in 1959). Hadl led the nation in punting in 1959 with a 45.6 average. He enjoyed a 16-year career in the NFL, passing for 33,513 yards. He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1994. Hadl currently serves as associate athletics director on the KU staff.

HALL OF FAME -- A trio of former Kansas football players have been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. The three players are Gale Sayers (1977), Mike McCormack (1985) and

John Riggins (1992). In addition, five former Jayhawks are in the College Football Hall of Fame, including Fielding Yost, Jim Bausch, Ray Evans, Sayers and John Hadl.

HELMETS -- The blue helmet -- in various shades and occasionally with a red or blue stripe -- has been a staple of Kansas football teams throughout the years, with the exception of teams coached by Chuck Mather in the early 1950's and Bud Moore in the late 1970's. Mather selected yellow as a helmet color for a Jayhawk team during his tenure to represent the Jayhawk's beak color in the school logo. Head coach Bud Moore, pulling from his lineage as a former assistant coach at Alabama, had the Jayhawks in white helmets during his two seasons (1977-78). Over the years, the helmet designs have varied from plain, to jersey numbers to the Jayhawk logo. With the exception of a few years, the Jayhawk became a fixture on the helmet in the early 1960's through the mid-1980's. Head coach Bob Valesente brought a New York Giants look to the helmet in 1987 when he had a script "Kansas" in red against a dark navy blue helmet. KU had a plain blue helmet in 1988, before switching back to the Jayhawk in 1989. The interlocking "KU" was a consistent mark on the helmets after 1990 when head coach Glen Mason switched from the traditional Jayhawk logo. The latest version, unveiled by head coach Mark Mangino in 2002, features a dark blue helmet with a crimson stripe down the middle. A white KU with a thin red border gives the helmet a classic look.

HOMECOMING -- KU first celebrated a Homecoming in 1912 when approximately 9,000 fans gathered at McCook Field to watch the Jayhawks down rival Missouri, 12-3. Jayhawk alumni have been returning to campus every year since 1912, with the exception of 1918, to celebrate Homecoming events. An outbreak of influenza all but cancelled the 1918 season. The Jayhawks have won 12 of their last 14 contests in front of the alumni. Overall, Kansas is 39-47-5 in Homecoming games.

-- I --

INAUGURAL GAMES -- Kansas initiated play in the Big 12 Conference on Oct. 5, 1996 with a 52-24 victory over Oklahoma in Norman. KU also won its first Big Eight Conference game when it took a 35-34 final advantage over Colorado at Boulder in 1957. The Jayhawks' first game in the Big Seven Conference was also a success as the Jayhawks downed Colorado, 40-7, in 1948.

-- J --

JAYNES, DAVID -- David Jaynes was a 1973 All-American quarterback for Kansas, finishing fourth in the Heisman Trophy balloting that year. Jaynes led KU to the 1973 Liberty Bowl.

-- K --

K-CLUB -- The letterman's organization representing former Jayhawk student-athletes plays a significant role each year in helping the athletics department in its many service-oriented events. The K-

Club sponsors a variety of programs for current student-athletes, including Career Night, K-Day Weekend, Spring Graduation Brunch and the Jayhawk Scholars Program. In addition, the K-Club provides the funds for the purchase of senior rings for graduating student-athletes.

-- L --

LEAPER (TODD WILLIAMS) -- Since 1970, Todd "Leaper" Williams has been a fixture on the Kansas sidelines, serving as an assistant to the KU equipment manager. Todd, who works in the athletics department, earned his nickname from his prowess as a rebounder in noon pickup basketball games in Allen Fieldhouse. Among his many assignments, Todd is charged with retrieving the kicking tee following Jayhawk kickoffs.

-- M --

MARCHING BAND DRUM -- For many years a symbolic trophy has been presented to the winner of the Kansas-Missouri football game. Originally the trophy was known as the Indian War Drum and was bought in a Kansas City pawn shop in the 1930's. In disrepair, a new drum was acquired in 1986. Starting with the 1998 season the trophy was changed to the Marching Band Drum. The alumni associations of the respective schools supervise the trophy's exchange following each year's encounter. The two teams will meet in 2004 with the series standing at 52-51-9 in KU's favor.

MEMORIAL STADIUM -- Kansas will play its 84th season of football at Memorial Stadium this fall with an overall home record of 209-199-16 record. Recognized as the first stadium built on a college campus west of the Mississippi River, Memorial Stadium is the seventh-oldest collegiate stadium in the nation and has a capacity of 50,071. The only NCAA Division IA schools with older stadiums are Cincinnati (1916), Georgia Tech (1913), Mississippi State (1915), Oklahoma State (1920), Washington (1920) and Wisconsin (1917). KU, Stanford and Tennessee all play in stadiums that were opened in 1921.

MOST-PLAYED RIVALRIES -- The Kansas-Missouri series, which has been played 112 times, ranks as the second most-played rivalry in college football and the Kansas-Nebraska series ranks third in NCAA history at 108 games. In addition, the Kansas-Kansas State annual encounter qualifies as the 14th most-played rivalry at 101 games. Kansas

and Nebraska have played for 98 consecutive years which qualifies as the longest uninterrupted series in college football history.

-- N --

NAISMITH, JAMES -- Although he is most often remembered as serving as the Jayhawks' first basketball coach, Dr. James Naismith also had a considerable impact on the development of the sport of football. Naismith took a football and cut it lengthwise and placed it over his head to protect his ears as a football player at Springfield College -- thus the first-ever football helmet was invented. Naismith was hired at the University of Kansas in 1898 as director of physical education on the recommendation of legendary football coach Amos Alonzo Stagg. He retired from active teaching in 1937 after 39 years as a member of the KU faculty.

NFL ROSTERS -- 11 former Jayhawks were listed on National Football League rosters during the 2003 season. As of June 1, the list of KU alumni earning NFL paychecks include; Curtis Ansel, P, Detroit Lions, Andrew Davison, DB, Dallas Cowboys, Justin Hartwig, C, Tennessee Titans, Adrian Jones, OT, New York Jets, Kwamie Lassister, DB, San Diego Chargers, Sean McDermott, LS, New England Patriots, Moran Norris, FB, Houston Texans, Dana Stubblefield, DT, Oakland Raiders, Ron Warner, DE, Washington Redskins and Bill Whittemore, QB, Atlanta Falcons.

-- O --

OUTLAND, JOHN -- John H. Outland made a significant contribution to the University of Kansas and college football. Outland attended KU for two years (1893-94) before transferring to the University of Pennsylvania to continue his medical studies and football career. An All-American at two different positions during his playing days at Pennsylvania, Outland returned to Lawrence in 1901 as head coach of the Jayhawks. He went on to have a successful career as a surgeon in the Kansas City area. When his football days were over, Outland wanted to do something about the interior lineman's lack of recognition. In 1946, the Football Writer's Association of America presented the first Outland Trophy, named in honor of the former KU student. Outland also is recognized as the founder and "The Father Of The Kansas Relays."

OVERTIME -- Kansas has played three overtime

contests since the elimination of games ending in a tie. In 2003, KU lost a hard-fought shootout 50-47 to Colorado in Boulder. In 2001, KU defeated Texas Tech 34-31 in double-overtime. However, KU's most exciting overtime game occurred in 1998 when the Jayhawks took a 39-37 four-overtime final advantage over UAB in Birmingham in the fourth game of the year. The game tied an NCAA record for most overtimes and took three hours and 50 minutes to complete. The final KU score was a 25-yard pass from Zac Wegner to Harrison Hill with Wegner connecting with Michael Chandler for the two-point conversion.

-- P --

PHOG ALLEN -- Forrest F.C. "Phog" Allen, the winningest basketball coach in KU history with 590 career victories, also played a significant role in Jayhawk football lore. Allen coached the Kansas football team for one year -- 1920 -- and led the squad to a 5-2-1 record. Among the eight games in which Allen guided the Jayhawks was a memorable 20-20 tie versus the Nebraska Cornhuskers on KU's home turf -- McCook Field. KU actually trailed 20-0 in that game on Nov. 13, 1920, but Allen's troops rallied all the way back to tie the game as time ran out. Spurred by that emotional comeback against a football powerhouse, Jayhawk students, faculty and alumni raised a million dollars to construct a new home for Kansas football -- Memorial Stadium.

POTTER LAKE -- Located just to the southeast of Memorial Stadium, Potter Lake adds to the beauty of the Kansas campus, and is often the final resting place of goal posts after monumental Jayhawk victories.

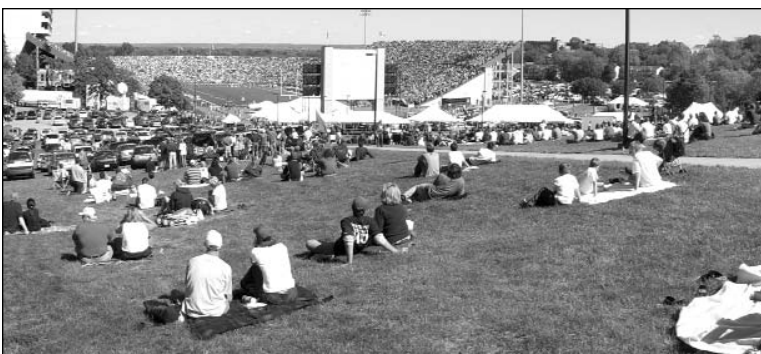
-- Q --

QUARTERBACKS -- Throughout its football history, Kansas has produced five All-American quarterbacks. The elite list includes Ray Evans (1947), Gil Reich (1952), John Hadl (1960-61), Bobby Douglass (1968) and David Jaynes (1973). For the record, just one of those quarterbacks (David Jaynes) ranks among the top five passers in school history. That list includes (1) Frank Seurer, (2) Kelly Donohoe, (3) Jaynes, (4) Mike Norseth and (5) Chip Hilleary.

-- R --

RETIRED NUMBERS -- Just three football numbers have been officially retired from use at the University of Kansas. John Hadl (21), Gale Sayers (48) and Ray Evans (42) are the only players who have been honored by having their numbers retired. Those three players, and jersey numbers, along with the names of KU's All-Americans, are displayed at the top of the north bowl of Memorial Stadium.

RIGGINS, JOHN -- A member of the 1968 Orange Bowl team, John Riggins was a 1968 and 1970 All-Big Eight Conference selection at fullback. He ran for a career-total 2,659 yards during his years at KU. A 15-year NFL veteran, he was the

1985 Super Bowl MVP for the Washington Redskins.

ROCK CHALK CHANT — The University Science Club officially adopted the famous “Rock Chalk” chant in 1886. A chemistry professor, E.H.S. Bailey, and some of his associates were returning from a conference by train to Lawrence. As they traveled, they talked of the need for a good, rousing yell. The click-clack of the train wheels passing over the rail joints suggested a rhythm and a cadence to them. At first, their version was “Rah, Rah, Jayhawk, KU” repeated three times. Later, in place of the rahs, an English professor suggested “Rock Chalk,” a transposition of the chalk rock, the name of the limestone outcropping found on Mount Oread, site of the Lawrence campus. The cheer became known worldwide. Teddy Roosevelt pronounced it the greatest college chant he’d ever heard. At the Olympic Games in 1920, the King of Belgium asked for a typical American college yell. The assembled athletes agreed on KU’s Rock Chalk and rendered it for His Majesty.

-- S --

SAYERS, GALE -- A two-time (1963-64) All-American at the University of Kansas, Sayers is generally regarded as one of the all-time greatest running backs in football history. Sayers concluded his KU career with 2,675 yards and led the Jayhawks in rushing, touchdowns and kickoff returns all three years he was in the lineup. He became the first player in NCAA Division IA history to record a 99-yard run when he broke lose against Nebraska during the 1963 season. He had an abbreviated seven-year NFL career that was cut short due to knee injury. Sayers retired from the NFL in 1972 with a career total of 4,956 rushing yards. He was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1977 at age 34 -- the youngest person ever selected.

SENIOR RECOGNITION -- Prior to the final

home game of the season, all Jayhawk senior football players and their families are recognized prior to kickoff.

SENIOR SCHOLAR-ATHLETE -- Each year the

Kansas athletics department pays tribute to its graduating seniors with a recognition ceremony which honors those student-athletes who have achieved success in the classroom. The Bob Frederick Scholar-Athlete Award is presented to the outstanding male and female senior student-athlete who have had success in competition and in the classroom.

-- T --

TANGERINE BOWL -- KU's appearance in the 2003 Mazda Tangerine Bowl marked the school's ninth all-time bowl game. The Jayhawks lost the contest to North Carolina State as Wolfpack QB Philip Rivers completed 37-of-45 pass attempts for 475 yards and five touchdowns.

TELEVISION -- Kansas dropped a 31-9 decision to Temple in Philadelphia on Sept. 29, 1941 in what is believed to be the nation's first collegiate televised night game.

TIES -- Through 114 years of competition, Kansas football games have ended in a tie 58 times. That number represents the most ties by an NCAA Division IA team. Most of those tie games occurred in the first half century of competition as the Jayhawks had 41 tie games between 1890 and 1949. KU's last tie game came in 1990, a 34-34 final score at Iowa State.

TUXEDO TONY SANDS -- Tony Sands set a new NCAA single-game rushing record during the final game of the 1991 season against Missouri when he rushed for 396 yards on 58 carries against the Tigers at Memorial Stadium. Sands earned the nickname “Tuxedo Tony” because he wore a tuxedo to every game he played as a Jayhawk. Sands game-day tuxedo was later retired and displayed at the College Football Hall of Fame.

-- V --

VIDEO BOARD -- KU's video board at Memorial Stadium represents the latest in technology. Mike Lickert serves as coordinator for Rock Chalk Video Productions, which was ranked No. 1 in the nation by IDEA -- the Information, Display and Entertainment Association, and supervises the game-day production for each home game. The \$1 million MegaVision video screen is 24-feet by 32-feet and is located at the south end of the stadium.

-- W --

WAVING THE WHEAT -- KU fans have enjoyed the tradition of “Waving the Wheat” for many years at Memorial Stadium. For every Kansas touchdown, Jayhawk fans will extend their arms upward and move them back and forth to symbolize a Kansas wheat field.

WAGNON STUDENT-ATHLETE CENTER -- Construction was initiated in the fall of 1991 on the Wagon-Student Athlete Center. The office and locker room complex, built in four phases, includes locker room facilities for football and baseball, the 4,000-square foot Dean Nesmith training room for

all sports, team conference rooms and offices for football, men's basketball, the athletics director and the Williams Educational Fund. At the heart of the facility is the Hale Achievement Center which houses the student-athlete academic services office.

X-TRA POINTS -- Dan Eichloff, who handled both place-kicking and punting duties from 1990-93, holds the KU record for consecutive extra points made with 60. Eichloff also kicked the two longest field goals in school history when he connected on a 61-yarder versus Ball State in 1992 and a 58-yarder against Kansas State in 1990. Eichloff is the all-time top point producer in school history with 302 points on 62 field goals and 116 extra points.

YOST, FIELDING -- Although he earned his reputation as one of college football's all-time great coaches at Michigan, Yost planted the seeds for his successful coaching career during his short stint as head coach at Kansas. Yost, a 1951 inductee into the College Football Hall of Fame, coached the Jayhawks to a 10-0 record in 1899. That mark stands as one of only two perfect seasons in Kansas football history. During that season, Kansas outscored opponents 280-37. At Michigan, Yost guided the Wolverines to 56 consecutive games without a loss, including 29 consecutive victories.

ZOOK, JOHN -- A native of Larned, Kan., John Zook was a 1968 All-American defensive end and completed his career with 202 tackles. He went on to play 11 seasons with St. Louis and Atlanta in the

Each member of the Hall of Fame is recognized within Allen Fieldhouse with a 16 x 20 inch framed portrait in the east lobby. The Hall of Fame is monitored by the Kansas University Athletic Corporation Board, with director of athletics Lew Perkins serving as the executive officer.

Individuals are eligible for the Hall of Fame by achieving any of the following:

- Olympic Medalist
- U.S. Olympic Team Member
- World or American Record Holder
- NCAA Individual Champion
- Consensus 1st Team All-America

Head coaches are eligible by coaching an NCAA Championship team.

Teams are eligible based on accomplishments for a particular season (i.e. Final Four, World Series or bowl teams).

Special admittance is the other criteria considered. Some individuals and teams may be considered for bringing national distinction and honor to KU.

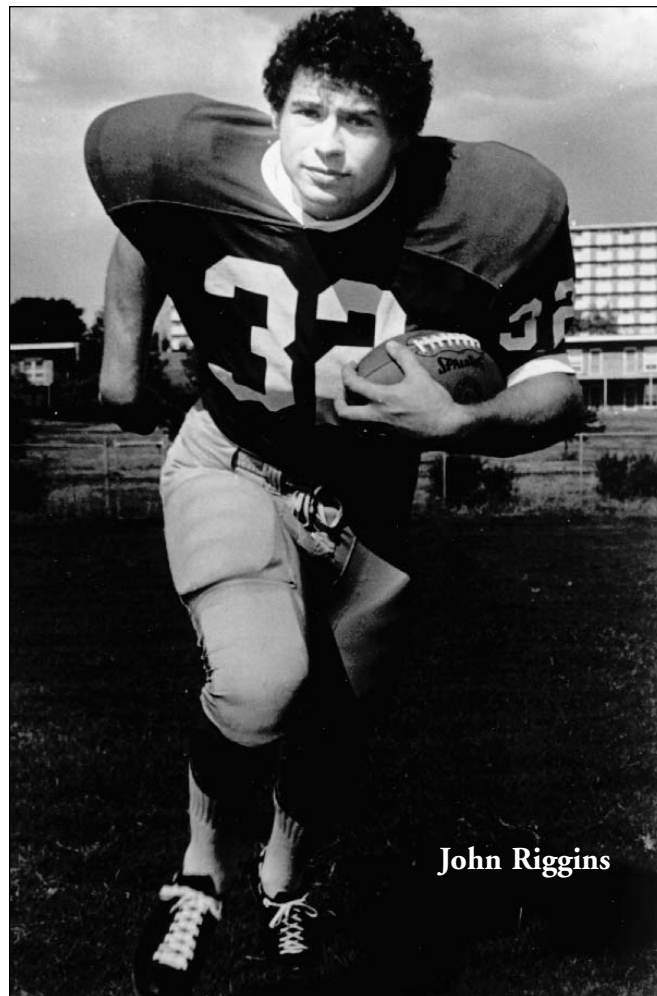

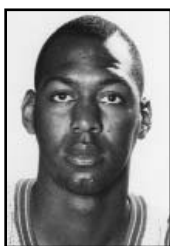

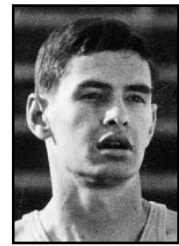

Dr. Robert Hemenway



Robert Hemenway's life has been marked by accomplishment as an administrator, teacher, and scholar.

As the 16th chancellor of the University of Kansas, he is the chief executive for the university, which spans the main campus in Lawrence, the Edwards Campus in Overland Park, the Medical Center campus in Kansas City, Kan., and its clinical branch in Wichita.

Leaders of other universities recognize Hemenway's administrative talents. In 2002, Hemenway was elected to chair the 18-member NCAA Division I board of directors, a position he will hold through January 2005. This appointment follows two terms as chairman of the board for the Big 12 Conference. He also serves on the Board of Directors of the American Council on Education, and the National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges.

Since coming to KU in 1995, Hemenway has streamlined KU administration, made the university more student-centered, and overseen KU's growing national reputation. Under Hemenway's leadership, KU has set a goal to be recognized as a Top 25 public university within the next 10 years. A grow-

ing list of nationally ranked academic programs and achievements of faculty and students support this goal. U.S. News & World ranks KU's academic reputation as 30th among public universities and 24 of KU's graduate programs 30th or higher among similar programs at public universities.

KU faculty were first in the nation for the number of faculty Fulbright fellowships in 2002-03. Research funding, a major source for Kansas economic development, has climbed steadily, reaching a record \$253 million in fiscal year 2003. KU students win several of the nation's most prestigious scholarships: the Rhodes, Goldwater, Marshall, and Udall scholarships. A KU selection among Academic All-Americans during 2002-03 brought to 42 the number of KU student-athletes chosen for this honor since 1990 – the third-best record among public universities.

In Kansas, Hemenway has performed a complex balancing act, positioning KU as a major player in the movement to make the Greater Kansas City area a national center for life sciences and information technology, while at the same time forging stronger connections with the rural counties of western Kansas.

"To me, both Kansas and Kansas City are filled with opportunity," Hemenway says. "KU wants to be a better partner to the entire state."

Hemenway remains a committed scholar and teacher. He is known for his biography of African-American novelist Zora Neale Hurston, a "Best Books" pick by the New York Times in 1978 and a Quality Paperback Book Club selection in 1991. Hemenway still teaches a 7:30 a.m. undergraduate English course most semesters.

The chancellor and his wife, Leah, live with their son Arna, 16, in the Outlook, the KU chancellor's official residence. Three of the Hemenway's eight children are graduates of KU and one son, Langston, is currently studying for a master's degree at the University. The Hemenway's have five grandchildren.

"I am very proud of Coach Mangino and the Jayhawk football team. Our program becomes more competitive every year, and when you can compete in the Big 12, you can compete anywhere."
