I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

At 10:00 am today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 305 km east southeast of Tuguegarao City (16.9°N, 124.5°E). This weather system will not affect any part of the country and is expected to dissipate in 12 hours or less.

II. EFFECTS

A. PRE-EMPTIVE EVACUATION (Tab A)

- A total of **20,979 families / 114,591 persons were evacuated** in the Provinces of Albay, Catanduanes, Sorsogon, Camarines Sur, Leyte, Biliran, Eastern Samar and Samar (Western Samar)

B. AFFECTED POPULATION (Tab B)

- A total of **25,201 families / 106,808 persons** were affected in Regions V, VII, and VIII
- A total of **105 families / 420 persons** are currently being served inside and outside **2 evacuation centers**

C. CASUALTIES

Dead – 2

- **KRISTELL MAE PADASAS, 26 y/o**, a native from Bicol Region and was a volunteer worker for the Catholic Relief Service (CRS) stationed in Salcedo, Eastern Samar. The victim sustained fatal head injury after being hit by a soundbox due to a collapsed scaffolding caused by heavy winds brought by TS "AMANG"
- **DOMINGO TABLATE, 59 y/o**, Antipolo del Norte, Virac, Catanduanes due to drowning

D. INCIDENTS MONITORED

- A total of **22 incidents** were monitored which rendered roads, bridges, and spill ways unpassable (Tab C).
- Of this number, nine (9) are landslides, ten (10) are flooding, one (1) fallen trees/debris/electric posts and one (1) maritime incident
- To date, there are only **one (1) road and one (1) bridge reported not passable. While the rest of the roads and bridges previously reported not passable are now passable**

- Around 200 families were rescued in the landslide incident in Brgy. Inang Maharang, Manito, Albay, no reported casualty
- BDRRMC of Brgy. Ubo, Daram, Samar rescued Ricardo Tagayon and Erwin Tagayon from a capsized boat. Both are fishermen from Culaba, Leyte

E. SUSPENSION OF CLASSES

- Classes in Catanduanes and Sorsogon, from primary to secondary level, are still suspended due to TS "AMANG"

F. DAMAGED HOUSES

- A total of **538 houses were damaged** (48 totally and 490 partially damaged) in Regions V and VIII

A. NATIONAL / NDRRMC

1. NDRRMC Operations Center

- **NDRRMC Operations Center is now downgraded from RED to BLUE ALERT Status effective 19 January 2015, 12:00 NN due to the weakening of the Tropical Storm "Amang" into a Low Pressure Area (LPA)**
- NDRRMC Operations Center is now downgraded from **RED to BLUE ALERT** Status effective 15 January 2015, 8:00 AM to continuously monitor and ensure dissemination of Weather Advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, Gale Warnings, and General Flood Advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDRCs through SMS, facsimile, and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- NDRRMC Operations Center was placed on **BLUE ALERT** Status effective 14 January 2015, 12:00 NN
- Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Meeting was conducted on 13, 14 and 17 January 2015 presided by USec. Alexander Pama together with the PDRA Core Group
- Memorandum No. 01, s. 2015 Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) for TD "AMANG" was disseminated to Regions IV-A, IV-B, V, VIII, NCR, and CARAGA to ensure the execution of preparedness actions and coordination with concerned agencies
