RED WOLVES IN THE PROS

A total of six former players for ASU have played in the Super Bowl, and three coaches have experience in pro football's biggest event.

Most recently, Kyle Richardson, ASU record-holding punter, was on the World Champion Baltimore Rayens in Super Bowl XXXV.

Maurice Carthon played in Super Bowls XXI and XXV for the New York Giants, brought home a pair of championship rings, and was an assistant coach on the 1996 Super Bowl runner-up New England Patriots in Super Bowl XXXI.

Ray Perkins, former ASU head football coach in 1992, played in Super Bowls III and V with the Baltimore Colts, and was the offensive coordinator for the New England Patriots in Super Bowl XXXI.

LB Bill Bergey and RB Leroy Harris played in Super Bowl XII with the Philadelphia Eagles.

DB Oren Middlebrook (who went by Orna while at ASU) played in Super Bowl XII for the Denver Broncos. Former assistant coach Dennis "Dirt" Winston played in four Super Bowls (IX, X, XIII, XIV) with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

There has been at least one Red Wolf on 31 of 32 NFL teams so far. The only team yet to have a former ASU player is the Carolina Panthers, and defensive back Darren Toney signed a rookie free agent contract with them earlier this year. The team most frequented by ASU alums is the Philadelphia Eagles, with 11, followed closely by the NewYork Jets with 10. The Dallas Cowboys and the Chicago/ St. Louis/Phoenix Cardinals are next with nine. The Miami Dolphins and Denver Broncos follow with seven former Red Wolves.

Arkansas State has had more than 100 players sign pro contracts. From Clifton Mack in 1939 to Tyrell Johnson, the Red Wolves have a very long tradition of developing players that move on to the next level. Many players have gone on to very long and successful careers at a number of different levels.

ASU's tradition of great runners goes bck to the efforts of All-American Richie Woit in the 1950's and has continued into the new millennium, with Jonathan Adams ending his career in grand style in 2001, Antonio Warren finishing his career in 2005 as the school's second all-time leading rusher and Reggie Arnold quickly climbing up the lists of records. While the decade of the 80's and the vaunted wishbone attack produced three individuals that broke into the topten, the 90's produced three players as well. Twelve different Red Wolves have reached the 1,000-yard rushing mark for a season and nine players over the history of ASU football have reached 200-yards rushing in a single game. Arch

The concrete arch in the heart of the ASU campus was presented by the 1927 graduating class of the Training School, a high school operated by the college at that time. It marked the entrance to the original administration building, which was destroyed by fire in 1931.

Balton Memorial Award

This is a special annual award for courage that is presented annually by the football staff to the one senior who has best exemplified that trait for the good of the team.

It is named in honor of the late James Crain Balton of Wilson, an ASU alum and avid football fan who was killed in a truck-train collision south of Jonesboro in 1989.

Clyde

This marble statue of a staid old Indian Chief, now stationed in the new student center on campus, was purchased by the ASU Student Government Association for \$1,200 in 1958 to be a source of pride with the school's athletic nickname.

It was carved in Italy and purchased through the Clyde Spence Monument Company of Jonesboro, which is how it acquired the name "Clyde."

When first bought, it was positioned in the lobby of Wilson Hall. Freshmen were required to tip their beanies when passing by. If caught by an upperclassman not performing that ritual, the freshman was required to sing the ASU Fight Song on the spot.

Clyde was moved to the Reng Center in 1964, and the ritual was required of freshmen until 1970.

When the new student center opened in the spring of 2004, Clyde was moved to his current home.

Former head track and field coach Jay Flanagan and wife Liz, a former academic adviser at ASU, donated funds to purchase a plaque honoring Clyde and placing it in his permanent home. The plaque explains Clyde's history.

Colors

Scarlet and black were selected as official school colors in 1911, the year of the first football team. A committee of several students and one faculty member made the decision. The first use of the official colors was on a pennant.

Convocation Center

The multi-purpose arena, located south of the football practice fields adjacent to Indian Stadium, houses some offices of the athletic department.

The 10,563-seat facility is one of the largest indoor multi-purpose centers in the state. It was built over a three-year period for \$19 million, with 80 percent of the funding (\$15.3 million) provided by the state.

Endowment Scholarship Fund

Over 50 participate in the ASU Endowment Program. Almost \$2,000,000 are working to provide financial support for the ASU scholarship fund.

Donor levels within the Red Wolf Club range from \$150 to \$25,000 per year, with each donor level bringing increased membership benefits. Of special interest to most football and men's basketball attendees are the Red Wolf Club Priority Seating and parking benefits that provide excellent seating and parking for home games.

Red Wolves Mascot Roll-Out Ceremony

A roll-out ceremony for Arkansas State University's newly adopted mascot, the Red Wolves, revealed the new face of ASU athletics on March 13, 2008.

The decision to bid farewell to ASU's Indians and Indian Family was not an easy one, but it was a collaborative decision at every level. The decision-making process was begun about a year ago from the roll-out ceremony in response to NCAA sanctions.

First, the Mascot Review Committee went to work in the spring of 2007, eventually returning a recommendation that the university needed to change its mascot. ASU Chancellor Dr. Robert L. Potts then appointed a Mascot Selection Steering Committee, which gathered ideas for a mascot change from an extremely broad-based constituency that included students, alumni, student athletes, athletic administration, and members of the community. Jim Pickens, emeritus member of the Board of Trustees, was appointed committee chair to oversee the process and keep it representative of all constituencies.

As Chancellor Potts noted at the historic Friday, March 7, 2008 ASU Board of Trustees meeting, "on Jan. 30 (2008), the Mascot Selection Steering Committee concluded its work by recommending that ASU adopt Wolves or a variation thereof, such as Red Wolves, as the new mascot and nickname for our athletic teams." After ascertaining that the nickname "Red Wolves" was unique among four-year universities, Potts announced his decision to the trustees, who ratified his selection. Potts remarked, "The Red Wolf is a noble species of wolf that once inhabited Arkansas and still exists in small numbers in other states. They are vicious and very aggressive, and they run in packs. I believe that Red Wolves is the best choice...

ASU Board of Trustees chair Mike Gibson addressed the Mascot Selection Steering Committee's work at the historic board meeting marking the ratification of the adoption of Red Wolves as the new mascot.

Indian Family Retirement

ASU officially retired its former mascot, the Inidan Family, during a halftime ceremony at a home basketball game on Feb. 28, 2007.

ASU held "A Ceremony of Celebration, Recognition and Farewell," honoring both current and former members of the Indian Family. Carrying single feathers, former members of the Indian Family lined center court to welcome the current Indian Family into the arena.

The former ASU mascot was a trio of Indian-attired students popularly known as the Indian Family. Chief Big Track (named after the legendary chief of the Osage tribe which occupied Northeast Arkansas) was the head of the Family, which also consisted of an unnamed princess and an unnamed brave.

The "Family," which had been dormant for some time, was resurrected when Barry Dowd took over as

In 1996, members of the Athletic Department, Alumni Relations and the Student Government Association along with former Indian Brave John Phillips and former Princess Genie Harrell, joined together to install tryouts for Indian Family members during the summer.

The group visited with and received a vote of approval from a group representing the Cherokee nations as well as other native Americans about authentic dances, symbols, costumes, etc.

The Indian Family, ASU's former official mascot, represented the University and its athletic programs in a stately and dignified manner befitting the Indian tribes which once lived in the area.

The expensive costumes, funded by the Alumni Association, were designed and hand stitched by Phillips along with help from Harrell and seamstress Shelly Kelly of

The Brave's costume was the same worn by Phillips as an ASU student with intricate beadwork. Chief Big Track's outfit was fashioned by Phillips from raw leather from Texas. It was an authentic chief war shirt with handstitched beadwork of an authentic Cherokee design. The headdress of 36 feathers was made by Native Americans in Texas.

The dress worn by the Princess, designed by Phillips and sewn by Kelly, was made of bleached garment leather. All garments required tedious hours of meticulously hand-stitched beadwork.

The Indian Family was selected by a campus committee through tryouts in the spring. Candidates had to qualify through interviews, horsemanship, appearance, attitude, school activities, and academics.

Since the Indian Family represented the university as a whole, special legislation was passed in 1997 by the SGA and the Student Activities Board to take the Indian Family under its wing. The Indian Family was funded by the ASU Spirit Club, a campus group which is a joint venture of SAB and SGA. The Indian Family represented ASU not only at athletic events, but at other campus functions as well as in the community.

Kays Stadium

This former home of ASU football was located on the southwestern side of the campus. It seated 8,000 and was the Tribe's home field for over 50 years-until ASU Stadium was finished in 1974.

The site was used as a 360-meter running track belonging to the Department of Physical Education, Health and Recreation. In the spring of 2004, construction began to turn the track into a parking area.

Life Skills Program

The Life Skills Program is strong on the ASU campus. The program resulted from efforts by the NCAA to create a total development program for student-athletes. Its mission is to support the following commitments: to athletic excellence, personal development, career development and to service.

The NCAA mandated that all collegiate athletic programs must have a Champs/Life Skills Program in working order by fall 2000.

ASU's program is also well known for its work in the fields of sportsmanship, study skills, drug and alcohol awareness, time management, stress management, career development, goal setting, nutrition, diversity, fundamental values, financial responsibilities and much more.

Former compliance officer Ed Postel and Dr. Lynita Cooksey of Academic Affairs installed a Life Skills curriculum for credit in 2001.

Arkansas State was privileged to hold the first-ever night game in the state when the "Gorillas" of "State Col-

lege" defeated Lambuth, 22-0, at old Kays Field in 1929. The school's yearbook explained that huge lights were installed for that specific purpose just before the first game of the season.

Red Wolves logos

The team from ASU's Publications and Creative Services were very pleased to roll out the Red Wolves imagery that they created in-house for the new visage of ASU in March of 2008.

According to Ron Looney, director, Department of Publications and Creative Services, all four of the department's staff artists collaborated in the creation of the Red Wolves imagery. Initial sketches of the wolf mascot were created by art director Mark Reeves and designer Mary Williams. Graphic designer Heath Kelly developed a unique lettering style, and staff artist Michael Johnson assisted with conceptual suggestions and digital manipulation of the art forms. The staff then combined their efforts to create the versions necessary for production of various types of university media. The Publications and Creative Services team look upon the project as entirely collaborative, and as a great experience for them all.



Block A-State Logo

Another official athletic symbol is the word "STATE" in block letters, accented by a bigger, bolder "A" in the center. This logo, which made one of its first appearances on ASU football helmets, was designed in the mid-1970s by Matt Melzer, a student manager from Monticello, Miss. A chronic doodler and decal designer, he actually did several versions but placed them in a drawer in the manager's desk. A similar design, by cheerleader Sharon Davidson, had adorned the front of the cheerleader uniforms in the late 1970's.

When Head Coach Larry Lacewell decided in the early 1980's to go with black iersevs and helmets, he needed a helmet design and asked for some ideas. Melzer's old drawing were found in the drawer and submitted. Lacewell chose one and it was ordered as a decal. At first, it contained a "U" around the big "A," but Equipment Services Manager David McDaniel cut the "U" off, and it was readily accepted by the players.

The block "State" logo made a comeback in May 2003 and may be used, with permission, for t-shirts and other items

ASU Glossary

Milk And Cookies

When Steve Roberts came to Arkansas State, he brought a tradition with him which caught on in a hurry with the players. The night before each game, team members gather for milk and cookies. At this time, each player is supposed to sit by and visit with at least three people he has not visited with throughout the week to learn more about his teammates.

National Champions

The first undisputed national championship ever won by a football team from Arkansas was the 1970 ASU squad which went 11-0. That bunch won national college division trophies from the Associated Press, United Press International and Washington Touchdown Club.

ASU will compete as the Red Wolves for the first ime ever this fall after being the Indians from 1931 through the spring of 2008.

The first nickname in 1911 was "Aggies," since ASU was the only agricultural school in Eastern Arkansas (the word "Farmers" was also used). In 1925 it was changed to "Gorillas," but that one wasn't too readily accepted. "Warriors" was adopted in 1930, and it evolved to "Indians" one year later.

"Indians" was taken from the heritage of the state of Arkansas—from the Osage tribe which made its home in Northern Arkansas before the settlers arrived. During the 18th Century the Osage were at war with practically all other tribes of the plains, as well as with the woodland tribes.

'Paint Bucket Bowl'

This was the unofficial name for the annual football rivalry between ASU and Memphis State back in the 1950's.

Officials of the two schools had decided to make the trophy for the winner of this game some buckets of paint and some paint brushes. The losing school also designed a particular area on its campus that the winner could smear with paint.

The idea was to eliminate the defacing of each campus and the "kidnapping" of opposing football players during game week. It evolved into the winning school being given a trophy from the other—a paint bucket decorated in the colors of the two schools and inscribed with the score.

Memphis State won both of the 'Paint Bucket Bowl' trophies before the series was temporarily discontinued after the 1957 game.

Perfection

"Red"

"Red," a spirit character for ASU's athletic programs, was introduced to the public during two press conferences-in Jonesboro and in Little Rock in July 2003.

The red and black-haired costumed character greeted fans, children, and members of the media at a morning conference at the ASU Football Complex, then traveled to the First Tee in Little Rock for an afternoon gathering.

The spirit character was designed to function independently of the Indian Family as an entertaining figure during men's and women's athletic events.

Throughout the various stages of the spirit character's development through artists' renderings, ASU officials presented the updates to the advisory committee and university personnel for feedback from the youth market groups. "Red" is the brainchild of ASU Director of Athletic Marketing Andrea Scott who personally designed the

Scott sent her design to Olympic Flag and Banner Inc. who made the costume utilizing ASU's school colors of

Retired Jerseys

Only four football iersey numbers have been retired in ASU's illustrious 90-year-old history. The latest was No. 56 worn by Harry Larche, retired during the halftime of the season finale in 1998. Larche was the second Red Wolf ever to sign a professional football contract in 1948. Linebacker Bill Bergey, who played with the Red Wolves from 1965-68 before an impressive career with the Philadelphia Eagles and Cincinnati Bengals, was on hand to see No. 66 retired November 22, 1997. Jersey number 49, worn by the late great Calvin Harrell when he was a twotime All-America running back at ASU, was retired in a ceremony November 9, 1996. According to records, ASU's first-ever first-team All-American Richie Woit saw his No. 83 retired in 1954. However, the number is still in use.

The Ring of Honor, an idea of former athletic director Barry Dowd, recognizes Red Wolves football greatness. Ring inductees include former Red Wolves players Tim Langofrd (2007), Ray Brown (2007), Terry Gwin (2006), Bill Phillips (2003), Maurice Carthon (2002), Harry Larche (1998), Bill Bergey (1997), and Calvin Harrell (1996), former player, coach and current Director of Major Gifts Bill Templeton (1997), former coach and athletic director J.A. "Ike" Tomlinson (1998), and former | Tickets head coaches Bill Davidson (1999), Bennie Ellender (2000), and Larry Lacewell and Frank Farella (2001).

Songs

Hail to ASU, the school's alma mater, was written by Dr. Harold Manor, former head of the University's College of Fine Arts. The arrangement, used presently, was designed by Harold Worman, a former associate band director. Another popular "school" song played at most athletic events are *The ASU Fight Song* by George L. "Pop" Hodge of Marked Tree.

Student-Athlete Advisory Committee

The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee is an integral part of not only the department of athletics, but to the campus and community as well. The committee is made up of student-athletes representing ASU's 15 sports.

The committee meets throughout the year and devotes its time to the betterment of all student-athletes and campus and community issues.

Extremely active, members frequently visit elementary schools to read to and visit with young people. The group established the Lunch Buddies programs with elementary students as well as initiated functions which bring awareness to different causes and programs.

Advisor to the committee is Melanie Richardson, Associate Athletic Director for Student Services and Senior Woman Administrator.

Sun Belt Conference Football

Since July 2, 1991, ASU has been a part of the Sun Belt Conference after the SBC merged with the old American South. The school's membership was in all sports with the exception of football until November 4, 1999, when the Sun Belt Conference extended invitations of membership to Middle Tennessee State, New Mexico State, North Texas, and Louisiana-Monroe. At the time, the league announced sponsorship of NCAA Division I-A football for the first time as a championship sport, beginning in 2001.

Middle Tennessee, New Mexico State and North Texas joined ASU, Arkansas-Little Rock, Denver, Florida International, Louisiana-Lafayette, New Orleans, South Alabama, and Western Kentucky as full members. Louisiana-Monroe competed in football only until becoming a full member in 2006. Shortly afterward, the University of Idaho announced it would compete in Sun Belt football.

The current Sun Belt Conference football members are Arkansas State, Florida International, Florida Atlantic, North Texas, Louisiana-Monroe, Louisiana-Lafayette, Middle Tennessee and Troy. Western Kentucky will become a football member of the league in

In addition, in April 2000, the NCAA certified the new New Orleans Bowl Game which will feature the Sun Belt champion as one of the participants. The first New Orleans Bowl was played Dec. 18, 2001, between Sun Belt representative North Texas and Mountain West representative Colorado State.

Tailgating

That's part of the Red Wolves fun that takes place prior to any home ASU game-in the ASU Stadium parking lot and surrounding areas.

The night before the game, alums and other fans camp out on the stadium grounds as they prepare for gameday.

Lately, the tailgating has become more organized, with sponsors getting involved, prizes for best food or most original costumes, etc.
