## Head Coach Matt Digney

Philadelphia University Director of Athletics Tom Shirley announced the hiring of Matt Digney as the University's new head men's soccer coach

on May 24, 2006. A former standout player at Rowan University, Digney succeeds Greg Wilson, who resigned following the 2005 season to accept a position with the University of California, Santa Barbara men's soccer staff.

"Matt is an excellent addition to our University and we are very excited for what he brings to our program," said Shirley. "He has extensive experience as both a player and a coach and those were two things that were very important to us as we began the search."

Digney's previous coaching experience includes a pair of stints as an assistant coach at Rowan from 1997 through 2002 and once again in 2004. During his tenure at his alma mater, the Profs won five conference championships and qualified for the NCAA Division III Tournament each year. This included a Final Four berth in 1998 and a national championship game appearance in 2000 where the Profs fell to Messiah (Pa.) College, 2-0 in the title game. In

2000, Digney was recognized for his work with Rowan as he was named AFLAC National Assistant Coach of the Year.

A resident of Cinnaminson, N.J., Digney also served as the head coach at NCAA Division II Wilmington (Del.) College in 2003, where he earned Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC) Coach of the Year honors. Digney led the Wildcats to a 10-7-3 overall record including an 8-1-0 mark in the CACC, one year after the team finished with a 5-14-1 overall record and a 1-8-0 league record.

"Matt has the pedigree that we were looking for and we anticipate great things for the program in the coming years under his guidance," said Shirley. "While it was unfortunate that we lost one of the bright, young coaching minds in Greg Wilson, we feel we have done very well in securing the services of another."

### *Nick Martinelli*

Nick Martinelli joins the Philadelphia University men's soccer coaching staff this season, serving as an assistant for first-year Head Coach Matt Digney. Martinelli was a standout player at Rowan University, playing under Digney who was an assistant coach with the Profs.

As a student-athlete at Rowan, the Lancaster, Pa., native enjoyed a stellar career with the Profs, earning adidas NCAA Division III All-America honors in 2002 and 2004. In addition, he was a three-time NSCAA first-team All-Metro Region selection as well as a four-time New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) first-team All-Conference pick. In 2002, he was tabbed the NJAC Rookie of the Year while being named NJAC Defensive Player of the Year in 2003 and the NJAC Offensive Player of the Year in 2004.

Prior to Rowan, Martinelli enjoyed an outstanding prep career at Manheim Township High School, leading the Blue Streaks to the Lancaster-League Championship. Along the way, Martinelli was a two-time Section One first-team all-star for Head Coach Dave Ammon.

Nick currently resides in Glassboro, N.J.



### *John Witherington*

John Witherington enters his second season as an assistant for the Philadelphia University men's soccer team this fall. A native of Cranford, N.J., Witherington's duties with the staff focus on player development, recruiting, fundraising and alumni relations. As an Assistant Director in the Office of Admissions at the University, he also coordinates campus visits and serves as head counselor for incoming student-athletes.

Prior to his arrival at the University, Witherington has enjoyed a successful high school coaching career in New Jersey, serving on the staff at Cranford High, his alma mater, as well as at the Solomon Schechter Day School in West Orange, N.J. In addition, he has also participated in numerous camps and clinics throughout the tri-state area, serving as a scout for the New Jersey Olympic Development Program (NJODP) while obtaining his NSCAA National Coaching Diploma in January 2000 in Ft. Lauderdale.

As a player, Witherington was an accomplished performer at the NCAA Division I level at Fairfield University, playing with the Stags from 1993 to 1997. He was also a member of a regionally ranked club team in New Jersey that captured multiple state championships.

## Season Outlook

The winds of change are blowing once again for the Philadelphia University men's soccer program. First-year head coach **Matt Digney** took over the team from former coach Greg Wilson over the summer while the Rams' conference affiliation, the Atlantic Soccer Conference, underwent a makeover of its own.

Digney, a longtime assistant at NCAA Division III power Rowan University, succeeds Wilson, who took the position of top assistant at nationally-ranked University of California, Santa Barbara. The Rams, meanwhile, welcome new conference member Florida Atlantic University while founding member Oneonta State College left the league, dropping to NCAA Division III status.

"I am very excited for this opportunity and I think the program is moving in the right direction," said Digney, who takes over a team that finished with a 5-13-1 mark last fall including a win over nationally-ranked Hartwick College and a bid in the first-ever ASC Tournament. "We return two of our top three scorers from last season, including first-team All-Conference performer **Devon Klipp**, as well as a host of young, talented players."

Klipp, a two-year starter at midfielder, finished the year with nine points, tallying three goals and three assists. "Devon is an extremely skilled midfielder that we really look to offensively," said Digney, who will be assisted by **Nick Martinelli** and **John Witherington** as well as former Rams' standout Scott Nixon this season. "He really starts the offense for us with his ability to score himself as well as his ability to create for others."

Joining Klipp in the midfield will be seniors **Kyle Hicks** and **Steve Noriega** as well as junior **Rocco Avallone** and sophomores **Dean Sewitz** and **Le'Spencer Walker**. "Kyle and Steve are two very experienced players, something we will need to rely upon this season if we are to be successful," said Digney. "Kyle is a cerebral player with excellent vision and he distributes the ball very well from the midfield. Steve, meanwhile, is a skilled, hard-working player that gives 110% every time on the field."

Avallone, Sewitz and Walker, meanwhile, were forced to be patient, playing behind a veteran group of midfielders during their time with the Rams. This season, however, they will be given the opportunity to see increased time under Digney. "Rocco is one of our fastest players on the team and he can provide us with a dimension that we haven't had," said Digney, who added that junior newcomer **Tim Carroll**, freshman **Alvin Bastian** and freshman **Chris Ireland** will also be in the midfield mix. "Dean is another player with excellent speed and his attacking style will allow us to use him in both the midfield and up front. Le'Spencer is very similar, allowing us the flexibility to play him at a number of positions to take advantage of his skills."

Defensively, Digney will rely on senior **Luca Zucal**, who enters his fourth year as a starter for the Rams. Last season, Zucal saw action in and started 18 contests, picking up a goal and an assist. "Luca is one of the leaders on this team and our players look to him both on and off the field," said Digney of

the Woodbridge, Ontario native. "He is a big, strong, tough marking defender that will provide us with excellent play in the backfield. We are looking for a big year from him and how well he plays will determine how successful we can be."

Zucal will have help at defender from a trio of talented sophomores in **Robert Richardson**, **Antonio Starvaggi** and **Nick White**. As a true freshman last fall, Richardson was just one of two Rams to start all 19 contests. "Robert came in last season and made an immediate impact and we are looking for him to take his game to the next level this season," said Digney. "He is great in the air, using his height well, and his ability with the ball can reverse the field quickly."

Starvaggi and White, meanwhile, appeared in seven and eight contests, respectively, last season. "Antonio is a very good athlete that provides us with a solid central defender and we are very excited about his progress," said

Digney, who will also have junior transfers **Jeremy Butterfield** and **Shaun Kennedy**, as well as freshman **Phil Olson** to provide depth on defense. "Nick is another outstanding athlete and he is very versatile. We will play him at defender and in the midfield, but he is someone that we want on the field as much as possible."

In net, the Rams will look to a pair of goalkeepers with experience in **Mike Wallover** and **Charles "Buddy" Custer** in addition to a talented freshman in **Ezra Cassel**. Last season, Wallover picked up two wins and posted a 1.86 goals-against-average in his first year of varsity action. "Mike is a tough, aggressive keeper that will be in the mix for the starting spot," said Digney. "Buddy has excellent size and he has the ability to dominate the box. As a true freshman last year, he acquitted himself very well and his ability to excel in the air has him vying for the top spot as well."

Offensively, Digney will look to the senior trio of **Fred-**

**erick Douglas, Rick Meyers and Matt Tompkins.** Tompkins turned in a tremendous junior season after joining the Rams from San Jacinto Junior College, finishing second on the team in scoring with ten points with three goals and four assists. "Matt is a very strong, physical player with great speed. He is another versatile performer that could also move into the mid-field as well. He has the ability to make everyone around him better while applying constant pressure on opposing defenses."

Douglas, meanwhile, returns to the lineup after playing just three contests a year ago after sustaining an injury. A talented, athletic forward, Douglas will provide the team with an offensive presence with significant experience. "Freddie is a tremendous athlete that has both strength and speed," said Digney. "He is good in the air and is a proven finisher, so he will see a lot of time for us."

A fifth-year senior, Meyers brings a blue-collar mentality to the Rams, relying on hard work and strength to make his mark. "Rick is the type of player every coach wants,"

said Digney, who will also have sophomore **Kaan Kalyon**, freshman **Jon Burke** and freshman **Kristoffer Perez** on hand at forward as well. "He is a very hard-worker is also one of the leaders of the team, on and off the field, as well."

Rounding out the forwards for Digney is sophomore **John Cloud**, a tall, rangy player with enormous potential. "John uses his height very well and is very dangerous on crossed balls and in the air in general. We really like his potential and he is primed to make an impact for us this season."

Once again, the newly-revamped ASC will provide Digney and his squad many challenges, but he and his team are eager for the test. "The league, from top to bottom, speaks volumes in terms of quality. Every game will test us physically and mentally and hopefully we are prepared for the task ahead of us. We are young and inexperienced in some key areas, so how quickly we adapt will tell us how far we have to go."

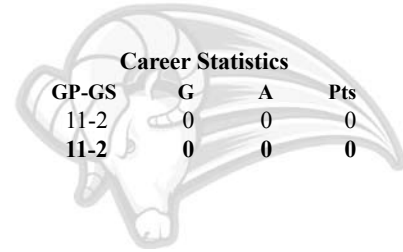

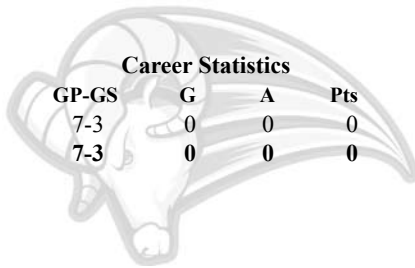

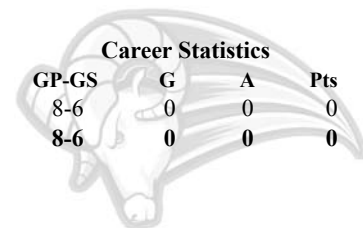
