



## **Tauba Biterman**

**Date of Birth: December 6, 1918**

**Place of Birth: Zamoszcz, Poland**

Tauba was the oldest daughter born to a Jewish family in Poland.

When Tauba was 18, her parents and six siblings fled east across the Bug River to Russia. Tauba stayed behind because she had a job, but they hoped life would be better for them under Russian rule. When the war began in 1939, Tauba was on her own. She hid in the Black Forest and tried to survive by moving from place to place, doing labor for the Germans and passing as a non-Jew.

Tauba survived due to her wits and the fact that she “looked German.” When the war ended she met Edward, her husband-to-be. They eventually married, came to America with nothing, and started a new life.
