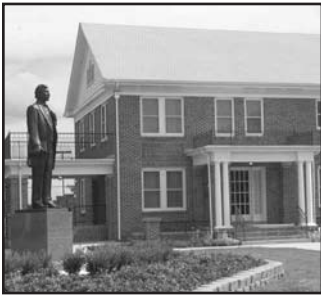

Our History

Texas A&M University-Commerce began as East Texas Normal College in 1889 when founder William Leonidas Mayo opened the doors to a one-building campus in Cooper. His creed, which continues today, was "ceaseless industry, fearless investigation, unfettered thought,

and unselfish service to others." The institution's history of dynamic change began in 1894 when "Mayo's College" moved to Commerce. The State of Texas took over the campus in 1917 and the name was changed to East Texas State Normal College. In 1923, the school was renamed East Texas State Teachers College. The graduate program was added in 1935, and in 1957 the Legislature, recognizing that the purpose of the institution had broadened from teacher education, changed the name to East Texas State College. Following inauguration of the first doctoral program in 1962, the name was changed to East Texas State University. In 1996, the institution entered The Texas A&M University System and became Texas A&M University-Commerce. Today, on the Commerce campus, the Metroplex Center, the Universities Center at Dallas, Navarro College Partnership, and through state-

of-the-art distance learning, the University meets the undergraduate, graduate and professional needs of the citizens of Northeast Texas and beyond. Its mission is achieved through teaching, scholarship, and service activities on its campuses, and in the community and region.

Administration



DR. KEITH MCFARLAND
President

The 10th president of Texas A&M University-Commerce, Dr. Keith McFarland is in his eighth year as the chief executive officer of the second largest campus in the Texas A&M University system.

McFarland is a veteran of the A&M-Commerce campus, as he has served the university in a variety of ways over the last 37 years. He came to the university in 1969 as an assistant professor of history and served in that capacity until 1973, when he was named assistant dean of the college of liberal and fine arts. At that time, his academic status was raised to that of associate professor of history.

In 1976, McFarland was named a full professor and promoted to head of the department of history. In 1983, he was named dean for graduate studies and research. He served in that capacity until being named president by Dr. Barry Thompson, then Chancellor of the Texas A&M University System.

McFarland, a native of Dover, Ohio, received his bachelor's degree in education from Kent State University in 1962 and his master's degree in history from The Ohio State University in 1963. He went on to earn his Ph.D. in history from Ohio State in 1969. From 1963 to 1965, he served his country as first lieutenant in the Army and was stationed in Okinawa.

A 20th century military historian, McFarland has published books and authored numerous articles on the subject. Among his books are "Harry H. Woodring: A Political Biography of FDR's Controversial Secretary of War" (1975) and "The Korean War: An Annotated Bibliography" (1986).

McFarland and his wife, Nancy, have three grown children. The Commerce resident is an active member of the Presbyterian Church of Commerce where he is an elder and adult teacher.

He's also active in the Lone Star Conference, having served as a past chairman of the Lone Star Conference Council of Presidents. Active in the community as well, McFarland is a member of the board of directors for the Commerce Chamber of Commerce and the Commerce Economic Development Corporation, and was named the chamber's Citizen of the Year in 2001. He's also an active member of the Rotary Club of Commerce and has received both the Service Above Self Award and the Governor's Outstanding Rotarian Award.



JIM JOHNSON
Director of Athletics

Entering his second year as the director of athletics at Texas A&M University-Commerce is Jim Johnson, who came to the Lions in July of 2005. He has already made strides of improvement in the TAMU-C athletic department with the extensive renovations to Memorial Stadium and a new radio network for Lion athletics.

The members of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) voted Johnson to its Executive Committee as a College Division Representative during their annual convention, this past summer. He is joined on this committee by many of the nation's top directors of athletics. Johnson also is currently a member of the NCAA Division II Membership Committee. In July of 2006, he was elected as national chair of the Membership Committee succeeding Herb Reinhard, athletics director at Valdosta State University. Jim also serves on the Division II Community Advisory Group. This task force is charged with designing Division II's community engagement plan to aid in the division's strategic positioning initiative.

Before coming to the Lions, he spent the previous two years as an associate athletic director for development and the director of government relations at Central Missouri State. He also spent five years working at the NCAA headquarters in multiple roles, starting as a membership services representative before advancing into a role as a membership coordinator and Division II governance liaison.

Prior to his stint at Central Missouri State and the NCAA, Johnson was a consultant with the law firm of Hall, Rend, Killian, Heath and Lyman, P.S.C. As a consultant, he worked with the NCAA Division II Conference Commissioner's Association, the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletics Conference and the Great Lakes Valley Conference. In addition, Johnson served an integral role on the NCAA Division II Championships Eligibility Project Team in 2003 and 2004.

Johnson's ties to the Lone Star Conference begin with the seven years he spent at Tarleton State University. At TSU, he served in multiple roles over seven years including compliance coordinator, men's athletic coordinator and assistant to the athletic director. He also was a member of the coaching staff as the head men's golf coach and head women's volleyball coach and taught coursework as a member of the health and physical education faculty. Johnson was actively involved in the Texans move from NAIA status to the NCAA and the LSC.

The Jacksboro, Texas native is the son of Dottie and the late Clifford Johnson, earned his bachelor's in business administration from Tarleton and went on to earn his master's in education from TSU. He and his wife Cindy, who was recently named the assistant commissioner for compliance at the Southland Conference, are the proud parents of two sons, Ely (6) and Riley (4).





JAMES GIBSON
Assistant Director of Athletics

James Gibson begins his third year with the Texas A&M University-Commerce athletic department staff, serving as the Assistant Director of Athletics/Chief Financial Officer (CFO).

Gibson provides administrative leadership and guidance in the areas of business and finance, athletic medical services, human resources, facilities and event management of the Lions athletic department. As the department's CFO, he manages the athletic department's annual operating budget and long-range financial forecasting. Most recently, the Stinnett, Texas native was actively involved in the renovation of Memorial Stadium

Prior to arriving at TAMU-C, he served as the Emergency Medical Services Coordinator at Texas A&M University in College Station where he supervised all the emergency services for the campus, community and home athletic events. While at Texas A&M he was elected to serve as Secretary for the Regional Trauma Advisory Council and was a member of the Brazos County Child Fatality Review Team.

Before Texas A&M, he was the business manager in the athletic department and a member of the faculty at his alma mater and Lone Star Conference member – West Texas A&M University. He earned his bachelor's degree in Sports and Exercise Science in 1999 and went on to earn his master's in 2001. Gibson is licensed by the state of Texas and certified by the National Athletic Trainers' Association as an athletic trainer. He is an active member of the College Athletic Business Management Association. He serves on the Membership Committee and was most recently chosen to serve on the Program Committee for the upcoming year. Gibson also serves as a member of the leadership staff at several Fellowship of Christian Athletes leadership and sport camps through out the year.

His ties to athletics originate with his father, who was a successful football coach and athletic director of 36 years in the public school system.



SUMMER SPURLOCK
Student-Athlete Services Coordinator and Senior Woman Administrator

Formerly an assistant women's basketball coach for the Lions, Summer Spurlock was hired as the new Student-Athlete Services Coordinator and Senior Woman Administrator in July.

Among her duties are the administration and completion of NCAA certification of academic eligibility for TAMU-C student-athletes. Spurnon will maintain eligibility and financial aid records on all student-athletes and serve a vital role in the liaison relationship between academic advisors, registrar, financial aid, scholarship and admissions offices. In addition to

eligibility and financial aid responsibilities, she will assist coaches in maintaining recruiting and playing and practice season records.

The Roswell, N.M. native will also handle the oversight and administration of athletic injury/health insurance for Lion student-athletes in collaboration with multiple parties to ensure prompt and accurate payment of all medical bills.

Coordinator of Athletic Medical Services

In his third year at Texas A&M-Commerce, Barri Mulkey begins his first as the Coordinator of Athletic Medical Services.

He presently works as the head athletic trainer for the Lions football team. Mulkey has spent the last two years as an assistant athletic trainer for the Lions, working primarily with the women's basketball, track and field and cross country teams and assisting with football. In addition to his athletic training duties, he also teaches in the Health and Human Performance department. He has taught multiple courses for the athletic training major and been involved in the oversight of practicum work by student athletic trainers.

Before joining the Texas A&M-Commerce athletic department, he was the head athletic trainer and coordinator of athletic training services at East Texas Baptist University in Marshall, Texas. SAM WALKER

Head Coach

As one of the most underrated coaches in Division II, Sam Walker is entering his seventh season as the head coach of the Texas A&M University-Commerce men's basketball program. Walker has been an integral part of the rise of a program that went 3-26 in his first season as an assistant in 1992-93 to its fourth Lone Star Conference Tournament appearance and a 16-12 mark in 2005-06.

The architect of the success reached the 100-win plateau in 2005-06 when the Lions posted an 82-80 win over Cameron in last year's home finale. With 100 career wins, he becomes only the fifth coach in school history to record 100 wins; in addition, his .581 winning percentage through his first six years is one of the highest in school history.

Walker has become a familiar face on the recruiting trails, where he has been recognized as one of the top recruiters in the state of Texas and in the southwest. He has developed an extensive network of locating talent, both on the high school and on the junior college levels.

In 2004-05, he led the Lions to a return in the national spotlight. Texas A&M-Commerce finished the season with a 28-5 overall mark and became the first team to win both the Lone Star Conference regular season and tournament titles in school history. Plus, the five losses were the fewest by an A&M-Commerce team matching the school record set by the 1954-55 National Championship team. Texas A&M-Commerce advanced to the finals of the NCAA Division II South Central Regional Tournament, which earned Walker coaching honors. He was named the Lone Star Conference, NCAA South Central Region and Texas Small College Coach of the Year honors; plus, he was chosen as the NCAA Division II Coach of the Month for January 2005. In 2002-03, Walker guided the Lions to their second tournament appearance and a third place finish in the Lone Star Conference North Division. Texas A&M-Commerce started that season with an 8-1 mark. In his first season as the head coach in 2000-01, the rookie head coach won the third most games by a first-year coach at Texas A&M-Commerce and his .630 winning percentage ranks fourth all-time among first-year coaches in school history.

After working eight seasons under head coach Paul Peak, he was elevated to head coach on May 5, 2000. He was named the associate head coach in August 1999 before being promoted the next season. Walker came to A&M-Commerce in August 1992, the second season of Peak's tenure, and worked hard to attain his current position. He has continued those characteristics on and off the court that have led him and his teams to success. While working with Peak, Walker and the Lions won the 1996 Lone Star Conference Championship, the 1998 Lone Star Conference South Division Championship and three-straight NCAA Division II Tournament appearances in 1995-96, 1996-97 and 1997-98. Roger Brown enters his fifth season on the Texas A&M-Commerce men's basketball coaching staff and his first as the Lions Associate Head Coach after being promoted in the spring of 2006.

Last season, in 2005-06, he helped lead the Lions to a fourth-place finish in the Lone Star Conference North Division with a second-straight trip to the LSC Tournament. In 2004-05, the Lions won the LSC South Division and won the post-season conference tournament that was hosted by Texas A&M-Commerce. In addition to the regular season and tournament title, the Lions reached the NCAA South Central Regional finals and posted a 28-5 record. It marked the first time that an A&M-Commerce team had won the conference regular season and tournament title in the same year and the five losses matched the school record

for fewest losses in a single-season that was set by the 1954-55 NAIA National Championship team. Texas A&M-Commerce moved up in the rankings to as high as No. 5 in the national poll. In addition, the squad posted an 18-1 record at the friendly confines of the A&M-Commerce Field House. Since being hired prior to the 2001-02 season, the Lions have posted a 73-44 overall record and made three trips to the post-season conference tournament.

At Texas A&M-Commerce, Brown handles a multitude of responsibilities. He is active in the recruiting, player development and retention, academic advising, strength and conditioning, on-floor instruction, game plan implementation, scouting and is also the current director for the Lions Basketball Summer Camps.

Before coming to Texas A&M-Commerce, Brown spent nine years coaching at the high school level - including six years as a head coach. He spent one season, at age 26, as the head coach at Como-Pickton, where he posted a 15-17 record. After that, he spent the next five years as the head coach at Campbell, where posted a .500 record and a 69-69 mark. He was an assistant coach at Lake Dallas for one season and at Campbell for two seasons before taking over at Como-Pickton. His ties to Texas A&M-Commerce date back to his involvement for the last 14 years with the East Texas State University and Texas A&M-Commerce Boys Basketball Camp, which has grown into one of the largest camps in the area.

A 1993 graduate of Stephen F. Austin State University with a degree in Humanities, Brown earned his master of science from Texas A&M-Commerce in 2001. He also holds a Texas teaching certificate in History, Health, Geography and Physical Education. A native of McKinney, he graduated in 1988 where he was a first team all-district selection as a guard for head coach Chester Story.

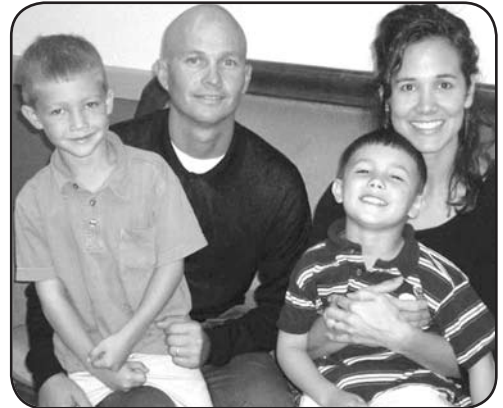

*Inducted in 1978
1936-40*

After leading the LSC in scoring his senior season, he became an all-star center in professional basketball.

John Douglas Carter

*Inducted in 1981
1942-43 and 1945-49*

An All-LSC center, "Jake" led the Lions in scoring for three years. After college, he played in the NBA.

Jeffery Paul Fitch

*Inducted in 1980
1963-67*

He won NAIA All-America honors and was the LSC's Most Valuable Player in 1966-67. At one time, he owned or shared eight school records.

Nate Granger

*Inducted in 1997
1973-77*

He averaged 20.3 points and 8.6 rebounds while leading the Lions to an 80-38 record and two LSC titles over four years.

Jim Gudger

*Inducted in 1992
Head Coach, 1969-83*

The winningest coach in A&M-Commerce basketball history, he compiled a 203-193 record in 14 seasons with the Lions and a 35-year college career mark of 537-394.

Madison Eugene Hodge

*Inducted in 1980
Multi-Sport Athlete, 1936-39*

He starred in football, basketball, baseball and track and field. He is the only Lion to make All-LSC at three different football positions—guard, tackle and end.

Robert Lewis Killingsworth

*Inducted in 1981
1931-35*

Lettering three times each in football, basketball and track and field, he was twice an All-LSC football guard and was named to the Lions' All-Time (1922-34) Football Team.

Clarence Lynch

*Inducted in 1995
1952-55*

He led the team in scoring as the Lions posted a 77-19 record over three seasons that included the NAIA championship in 1954-55.

Dee E. Mackey

*Inducted in 1984
1956-58*

Dee was the first Lion to win All-America recognition in two sports. After college, he played six years of professional football with the 49ers, Colts and Jets.

Dr. Shelby R. Metcalf

*Inducted in 1982
1952-55*

An All-American, he scored 340 points when the Lions won the NAIA national championship in 1954-55 with a 29-5 record.

James Milton Miller

*Inducted in 1978
1952-55*

The MVP in the 1955 NAIA National Basketball Championship Tournament, he led the Lions to their first national team championship.

Whitney Miller

*Inducted in 1998
1960-64*

He averaged 13.2 points per game and led the LSC in rebounding with 11.3 per game as the Lions won the 1963-64 conference title.

Lemial DeLoss Parsons

*Inducted in 1979
1916 and 1918-19*

A&M-Commerce's first grid hero, he played on the first Lion football team in 1916. He lettered in basketball and batted over .300 as a catcher on the Lion baseball teams.

Cecil Holmes Pirkey

*Inducted in 1979
Multi-Sport Athlete, 1935-38,
and Assistant Coach, 1950-54*
He was All-LSC twice in football and received an All-LSC honorable mention in basketball. He also won the LSC shot put.

W. J. "Sleepy" Redwine

*Inducted in 1996
1938-41*

His "scoring proficiency" led the Lions to two LSC basketball titles and a 49-25 record over three seasons.

Milburn Albert "Catfish" Smith

1929-33*

He was twice all-conference in basketball and returned as football coach to post a 30-2-1 record.

O'Neal Tarrant

*Inducted in 1997
1972-76*

Lone Star Conference



Long known as a premier leader in intercollegiate athletics, the Lone Star Conference (LSC) celebrates its 75th year of existence as one of NCAA Division II's most established and successful conferences.

The LSC – founded on April 25, 1931 – has grown from a five-team conference of Texas-based schools to a 15-member league that spans three states (Texas, Oklahoma and New Mexico). The league continues to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of intercollegiate athletic programs that are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports.

Throughout the league's 75-year history, various institutions have competed under the LSC banner. Today, only Texas A&M University-Commerce (then East Texas State) remains from the original group that was formed in 1931 when North Texas State, Southwest Texas State, Sam Houston State and Stephen F. Austin withdrew from the old Texas Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

The membership alignment has changed over the years, with current members having been added in each of the past five decades. Texas A&M-Kingsville (formerly Texas A&I) joined in 1954, followed by Angelo State in 1968 and Abilene Christian in 1973.

Conference membership remained within the Texas borders until 1984 when Eastern New Mexico was admitted. Since then, the LSC has expanded to include members from Arkansas and Oklahoma.

Central Oklahoma (1987) and Cameron (1988, 1996) were the next additions in the LSC's recent expansion phase, while Texas Woman's (1989) and previous members West Texas A&M (1986, 1993) and Tarleton State (1968, 1994) joined the league soon after.

Midwestern State was admitted early in 1995, and the league grew again later that year with the acceptance of four more Oklahoma schools -- East Central, Northeastern State, Southeastern Oklahoma and Southwestern Oklahoma -- along with Harding and Ouachita Baptist from Arkansas.

That brought the league membership to 17, but Harding and OBU departed the conference after the 1999-2000 academic year to bring about the LSC's current look.

Other past members of the LSC include Trinity, Houston, Lamar, Howard Payne, Sul Ross State and McMurry.

Beginning with the 1997-98 academic year, the league has been formed into two divisions – North and South – in football, volleyball, basketball, baseball and softball. Divisional champions are crowned according to results among division teams, with an overall league champion also being decided either by crossover games or a postseason championship tournament.

While the LSC has maintained a long-standing tradition of competitive athletic programs for its members, many teams and individuals have gone on to distinguish themselves on the national stage. Prior to the 2006-07 athletic seasons, LSC member institutions had collected more than 100 team national championships, including 64 in NCAA Division II.

This past year, the Abilene Christian men's outdoor track and field team claimed a Division II national title.

The LSC conducts conference championships in 15 sports (seven men and eight women). Men's championships include football, cross country, basketball, baseball, track and field, tennis and golf. Women's titles are determined in volleyball, soccer, cross country, basketball, softball, track and field, tennis and golf.

The conference office is located in Richardson, Texas, a northern suburb of Dallas. Stan Wagon serves as Interim Commissioner, with assistance from Jay Poerner (Compliance) and Melanie Robotham (Media Relations).

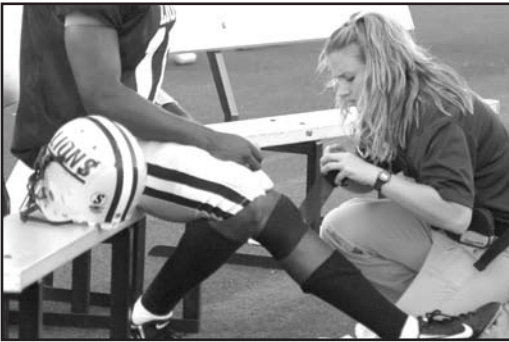


T.J. LUNGSTRUM

The athletic training staff at Texas A&M-Commerce is dedicated to preventing injury, assessing and treating injury, to maximize athletic performance.

The Athletic Training Rehabilitation Center (ATRC) is utilized as the primary training room. With 1,800 square feet, it provides room for treatment, taping, rehabilitation, and hydrotherapy area, as well as administrative offices, a supply room, a restroom, and a private exam room. It is located in the northeast corner of the Field House. The main sports that utilize the ATRC are men's and women's basketball, volleyball and soccer

During basketball games, the athletic training staff provides the following supplies including: 1 - 10 gallon cooler of water, cups, injury ice, 4 bench towels, locker room water, cups, infectious waste disposal, and a host trainer. A team physician, orthopedic surgeon and emergency medical services are available on an "on-call" basis during the game.



A&M-Commerce Field House

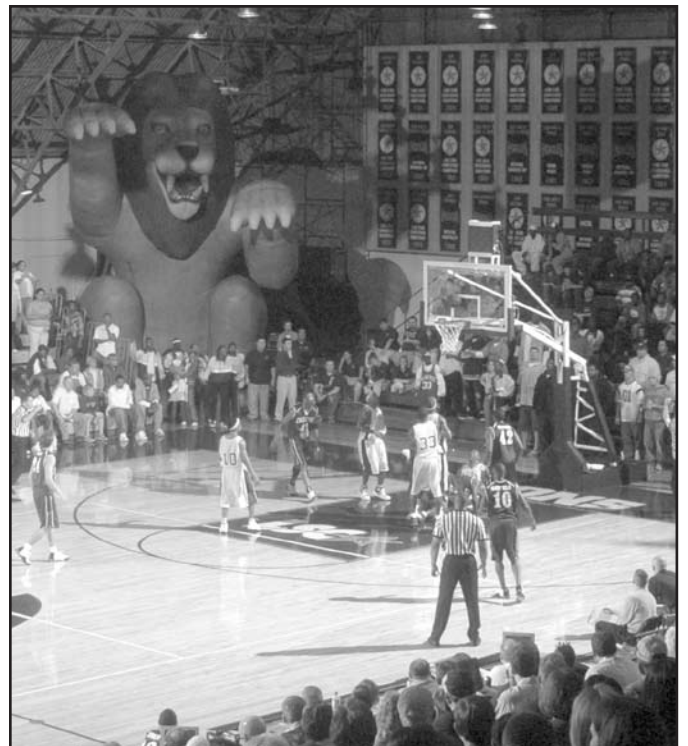
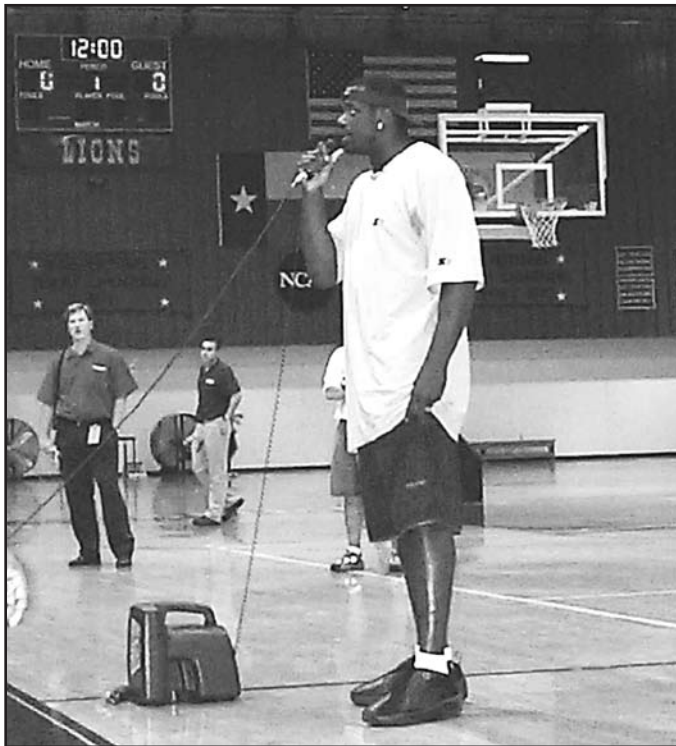
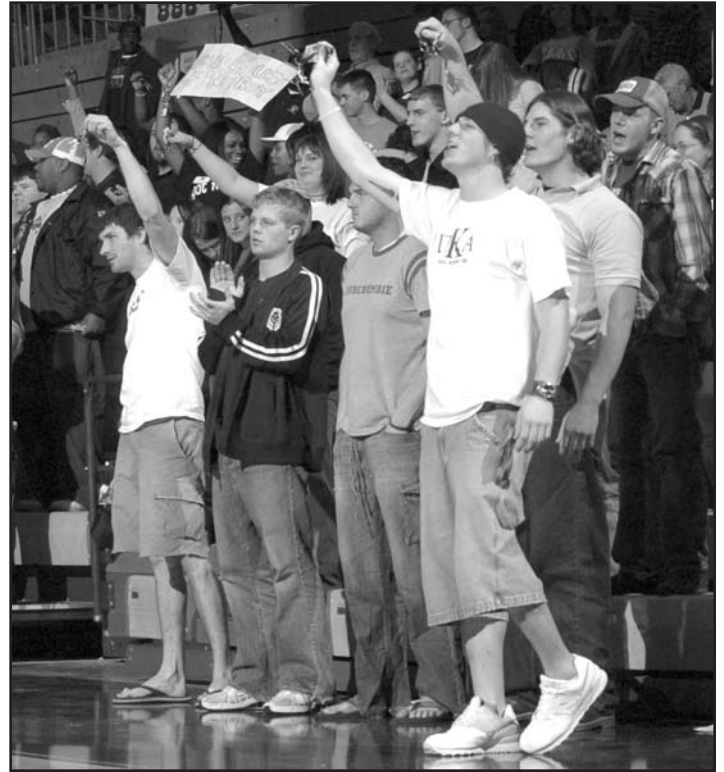
Built in 1950 and formally dedicated on Jan. 4, 1951, the Texas A&M-Commerce field House is in its 56th season as the home of Lion basketball.

The field house covers 69,000 square feet and will seat 5,000 people for a basketball game. The facility is also the host to the University's Athletic Department, Athletic Training department and the Health and Human Performance Department; in addition to the offices for the basketball, cross country and track and field, golf, soccer and volleyball teams.

The field house is shaped like an airplane hangar and has space for three basketball courts crossways. The floor allows three games to be played at the same time under one roof. The one lengthwise court is reserved for A&M-Commerce basketball and volleyball matches. With an arched roof, 58 feet from the ground at the highest point, is supported on steel beams that are stationary at one end.

In the fall of 1949, University President James Gee first announced plans for construction of the Field House and Memorial Stadium. At a cost of \$325,000, the crews of George L. Dahl were able to complete the project in just over a year. Since the original structure was built, there was a renovation in 1969 that included a two-story addition for classrooms and offices, a dressing room, and a storage area. A third renovation came in 1991 to include the installation of new bleachers, scoreboards, heating and ventilation and a refurbishment of the one-acre maple hardwood floor.

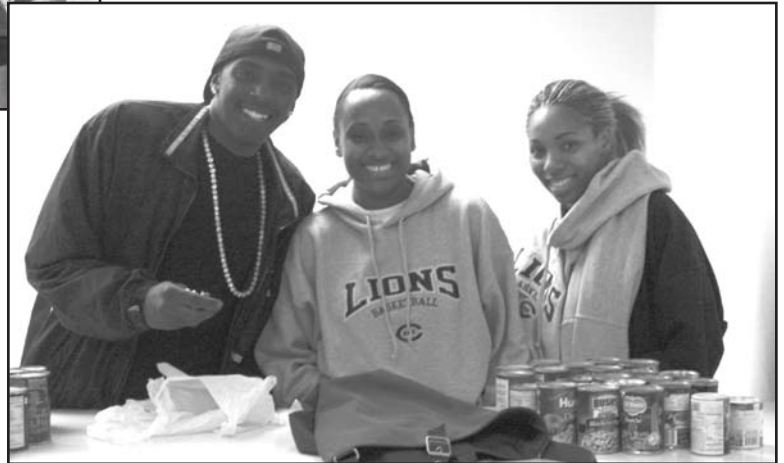
