Oregon Country Thomas Hardy, 1962

Hardy's biggest piece, this bronze sculpture on the exterior of Neuberger Hall took a year to complete. It depicts the landscape of Oregon from west to east with sea life, the coast range, the Willamette Valley, Cascades, and John Day Fossil Beds. 724 SW Harrison, Park Blocks side of Neuberger Hall



Scimon Cycle Ken MacKintosh and Lillian Pitt, 2005 A tall pole made from three trees killed in the eruption of Mt. St Helens depicts salmon migration. 710 SW Jackson St., in front of the Native American Student and Community Center



Yankee Champion Thomas Morandi, 1985 Stainless steel sculpture unites abstract shapes supported by three irregularly shaped legs. 631 SW Harrison St., in front of the School of Education
